**22nd OCTOBER, 1910.**

- MAIDEN HANDICAP (SADDLE)** of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. Limit, 2min 50sec to the mile. For all horses that have never won an advertised race exceeding 20sovs in value at time of entry. Nomination 10s, acceptance 10s. Distance, one mile and a-half.
- TROTting HANDICAP (SADDLE)** of 55sovs; second horse to receive 10 sovs from the stake. Limit, 2.45 to the mile. For trotting horses only. Nomination 1sov, acceptance 1sov. Distance, one mile and a-half.
- SPRING HANDICAP (HARNESSES)** of 100sovs; second horse to receive 10 sovs, and third horse 5sovs each from the stake. Limit 5.10. Nomination 1½sovs, acceptance, 2sovs. Distance, two miles.
- ONEHUNGA HANDICAP** of 50sovs; second horse to receive 10sovs from the stake. For ponies 14 hands 3 inches and under. Nomination 15s, acceptance 1sov. Distance six and a-half furlongs.
- STEWARDS' HANDICAP (SADDLE)** of 35sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. Limit, 2.42 to the mile. Nomination 10s, acceptance 15s. Distance, one mile and a-half.
- MIDDLE-CLASS HANDICAP (HARNESSES)** of 40sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. For all horses that have never won a race at better than 2.36 to the mile. All entrants will be handicapped to trot 2.45 or better. Nomination 15s, acceptance 15s. Distance, one mile.
- OCTOBER HANDICAP (SADDLE)** of 40sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. Limit, 2.30. Nomination 15s, acceptance 15s. Distance, one mile.
- ELECTRIC HANDICAP (HARNESSES)** of 40sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. Limit, 2.40. Nomination 15s, acceptance 15s. Distance, one mile.

**SECOND DAY.**

**26th OCTOBER, 1910.**

- TRIAL HANDICAP (HARNESSES)** of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. For all horses that have never won an advertised trotting race exceeding 15sovs in value at time of entry. Limit, 2.50. Nomination 10s, acceptance 10s. Distance, one mile.
- ELLEBSLIE TROTting HANDICAP (HARNESSES)** of 50sovs; second horse to receive 10sovs from the stake. For trotting horses only. Limit, 2.45 to the mile. Nomination 1sov, acceptance 1sov. Distance two miles.
- ALEXANDRA HANDICAP (SADDLE)** of 100sovs; second horse to receive 10sovs, and third horse 5sovs each from the stake. Limit, 5.10. Nomination 1½sovs, acceptance 2sovs. Distance, two miles.
- REMUEIRA HANDICAP** of 50 sovs; second horse to receive 10sovs from the stake. For ponies 14 hands 3 inches and under. Nomination 15s, acceptance 1sov. Distance, six and a-half furlongs.
- JUNCTION HANDICAP (HARNESSES)** of 35sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. Limit, 2.45 to the mile. Nomination 10s, acceptance 15s. Distance, one mile and a-half.
- INNOVATION HANDICAP (SADDLE)** of 40sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. For all horses that have never won a race at better than 2.36 to the mile. All entrants will be handicapped to trot 2.45 or better to the mile. Nomination 15s, acceptance 15s. Distance, one mile and a-half.
- HIGH-CLASS HANDICAP (HARNESSES)** of 50sovs; second horse to receive 10 sovs from the stake. Limit, 2.30. Placed horses at the meeting may be entered for this race. Such additional nomination must be made on the night previous to the handicaps being declared. Nomination 1sov, acceptance 1sov. Distance, one mile.
- INSULATION HANDICAP (SADDLE)** of 40sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. Limit, 2.42. Nomination 15s, acceptance 15s. Distance, one mile.

No horse will be allowed to compete in hopples in races for trotters only. By the entry of or endeavouring to enter a horse, every person having, or subsequently acquiring, any interest in such horse, shall be deemed to accept all the conditions and restrictions imposed or implied by these Rules, and to be barred from questioning the action of the Club or other body holding a sports meeting or of any official of the Club or such other body in respect of such horses, or of any person connected therewith otherwise than as provided for in Part XXX. of the Rules.

**CONDITIONS.**

No Pony shall be allowed to race as a Pony under the Club unless a certificate of height has been previously obtained from a measurer appointed by the Club. Ponies may be measured with or without shoes, and may be re-measured at the pleasure of the Stewards. No protest or dispute will be allowed in regard to the height of any pony after being passed by the Club's Measurer or Measurers.

**PENALTIES.**

No penalty will be required in an open race for having won a hack race or races.

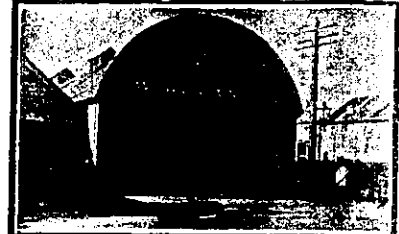
