C. McCullough, the Masterton sportsman, is bringing Sylvia Maid to Trentham. The chestnut is a proficient timber topper, and she should run well in Steeplechasing events at the meeting.

Waipunui is pleasing J. Sullivan by his galloping displays on the Ashurst tracks. There is a probability of the Conqueror horse being brought down to compete at Trentham.

Boanerges and Royal Scotch came in for some support for the New Zealand Cup and Stewards' Handicap last week. With two such capable horse-men as A. Olliver and C. Jenkins engaged to ride the pair, there will be nothing lost on the score of horse-manship.

Rauparaha is being schooled over the obstacles at Feilding, and so far the son of Seaton Delaval's display has been very promising.

Since severing his connections with the Porirua stable, C. Jenkins has been inundated with offers of riding. "Charlie" still rides with consummate judgment, and his riding of Royal Scotch in the Hawke's Bay Guineas proves that he is still a pastmaster in a tight finish. But for interference on the part of W. Young, who rode St. Petersburg, Royal Scotch would have probably won. Jenkins is now a resident of Levin.
