Bay horse by ISINGLASS (3), dam MALL, by LADAS (1), by HAMPTON, by LORD CLIFDEN, Serpentine, the dam of Mall by St. Serf, by St. Simon. MARBLE ARCH is a rich bay, 5yrs old, stands 16 hands, is very bloodlike, and in colour and character like his sire, Isinglass, who ran 12 times and won 11 races, valued at £57,185, the LARGEST SUM WON BY A SINGLE HORSE IN THE ANNALS OF THE TURF.

Mall, dam of Marble Arch, was got by Ladas (winner of 2000 Guineas, Derby, Middle Park Plate, Newmarket Stakes, etc.), from Serpentine, by the St. Simon horse; St. Serf, from Footlight (grand-dam of Flair, 1000 Guineas, and half-sister to Illuminata dam of Ladas, Gas, Chelandy), by Cremorne (Derby, Ascot, and Goodwood Cup), from Paraffin (three-quarter sister to Lord Lyon, 2000 Guineas, St. Leger, and to Chevaillance, dam of Janette (Oaks and St. Leger), by Blair Athol (Derby and St. Leger) from Paradigm (half-sister to Rouge Rose, dam of Bend Or (Derby, and sire of Ormonde, 2000 Guineas, Derby, and St. Leger).

In MARBLE ARCH'S pedigree there are no less than six Derby, five 2000 Guineas, and eight St. Leger winners, besides winners of the Jockey Club Stakes, 10,000sovs; Princess of Wales's Stakes 10,000sovs; and the principal big races in England.

MARBLE ARCH having the strain of St. Simon blood, should further enhance his value as a sire, especially to nick with Soult mares.

GENERAL LATOUR.

Bay Horse, by SOULT (son of ST. SIMON) from MERRY NIP (imp.), by Merry Hampton (son of Hampton) from Aroma, by Craig Millar (son of Blair Athol).

GENERAL LATOUR proved himself one of the fastest and gamest colts that has graced the New Zealand Turf. At the A.R.C. Spring Meeting he won the Christmas Handicap in record time (1min 40sec), conceding weight to aged horses. In the Great Northern Derby he made most of the running, and was only beaten a length by Counterfeit (who is regarded as the best filly in New Zealand) in the record time of 2min 36sec. In the decision of the A.R.C. Easter Handicap he carried 8.6 into second place behind Kakama (7.6), the mile being cut out in 1min 40sec, and General Latour was only a head from the winner.

Breeders will notice by General Latour's pedigree that he has a tip-top strain of racing blood, and will be a worthy successor to his illustrious sire SOULT, the greatest sire ever imported to the colonies.

ACHILLES (IMP.) 13. (1899).

ACHILLES, by Medallion—Nereid, by Goldsborough, is a beautifully proportioned chestnut horse, standing slightly over sixteen hands. He won over £9000 in stake money, and that without being "engaged" as a two or three-year-old, when he was practically invincible.

He proved himself a champion in each of the six seasons he raced, retains all his courage, and he has probably the cleanest set of legs in New Zealand to-day.

He won three Jubilee Cups, two Electric Plates, two C.J.C. Challenges, two North Island Challenges, three Jackson Stakes, the Juvenile Plate, Middle Park Plate (an exceptionally brilliant performance—Machine Gun, 2yrs, had the maiden allowance, and carried 7.2, Achilles, 3yrs, with full Penalties, carried 9.0). Manawatu Stake., Hawke's Bay Stakes, A.R.C. Century Stakes, Wanganui Guineas, Wellington Stakes, Wellington Cup, etc. In fact, no horse in New Zealand performed like him. He has never been unduly taxed, and his constitution is unimpaired. He comes of Bruce Lowe's No. 13 family, whence spring Highflyer, Albert Victor, George Frederick, Orlando, Beadsman, Mendicant, Shotover, etc., while the same family is represented in these colonies by those successful sires Nordenfeldt, Goldsborough, Robinson Crusoe, Martini-Henry, etc.

BEZONIAN (IMP.) 1.

BAY HORSE (half brother to Cicero—Derby, Newmarket Stakes, July Stakes, etc.); bred in England in 1904 by Lord Rosebery, by Velasquez (winner of Prince of Wales' Stakes of 10,000sovs, Champion Stakes, etc., and second in 2000 Guineas and Derby to Gaiter More, and half brother to Sir Visto—Derby and St. Leger—and to Bona Vista—2000 Guineas, and sire of Cyllene), from Gas (three-quarter sister to Ladas—2000 Guineas and Derby—and to Chelandy—1000 Guineas, and second in Leger, and dam of Neil Gow—2000 Guineas), by Ayrshire (2000 Guineas, Derby and Eclipse Stakes), from Illuminata (half sister to Footlight, grand-dam of Flair, 1000 Guineas), by Rosicrucian (unbeaten), from Paraffin (three-quarter sister to Lord Lyon—2000 Guineas, Derby and Leger—Achievement—1000 Guineas and Leger—and to Chevaillance, dam of Jeanette—Oaks and Leger), by Blair Athol (Derby and Leger), from Paradigm (half sister to Rouge Rose, dam of Bend Or—Derby, and sire of Ormonde—2000 Guineas, Derby and Leger).

BEZONIAN was a high-class performer in England. He won the Kempton Breeders' Foal Plate, 1000sovs (beating Galvani), etc. Ran second in the 2000 Guineas to Slieve Galleon in 1.41 4-5th, third in the Champagne Stakes, Prince of Wales' Stakes and Eclipse, and fourth in the Derby to Orby, Woolwinder, and Slieve Galleon (again beating Galvani).
