SUMMER MEETING.

A RECORD SUCCESS.

ORATRESS WINS MARTON CUP.

(From Our Wanganui Correspondent.)

The Marton Jockey Club's summer meeting, held on New Year's Day and the 2nd inst., proved a record success. The weather was fine both days, though a slight shower fell just after the last race had been run on the opening day, but it was not enough to mar the enjoyment. The fields The fields were on the whole of good size, and the racing excellent. The Marton Cup was won by Oratress, the Demosthenes filly scoring very comfortably, and her victory was well received, as her owner (mine host of the White Hart Hotel) is very popular in racing circles, and he was very pleased over winning this event. A hot favourite in Bo-Peep went down in the Rail-way, which went to the Solferino gelding Bindle, on which P. Rayner rode a nice race. The management of the sport throughout was excellent. thanks to the splendid work done by Mr. Arthur Way (secretary) and the officials generally, all of whom rendered valuable assistance. The starting on the first day was not up to Mr. Angus Keith's best standard, but showed improvement on the second day. Mr. J. Cameron, who acted as judge, gave every satisfaction in that position. The attendance on the first day was a record, while on Friday there was another big crowd present. Speculation on both days was very brisk, the amount handled on New Year's Day being £41,118, as against 133,061, while on the second day the sum of 436,343 was put through, mak-ing 477,461 for the meeting, as against 433,061 for the one day last year.

Racing opened with the Hack Hurdles, for which six went to the post, Goldstream finishing up a slight-ly better favourite than Hushabye. The winner turned up in Endure, that gelding being early in front, and outjumping everything won comfortably. There was a big field in the Dash Handicap, for which Paoanui found most support, Idle Talk and Finkop being also well backed. It was a fine race, Idle Talk just beating Farce, which filly had a bad run in the early part. Idleness, Mida and Paoanui were all close up.

Saima was the popular pick for the Juvenile Handicap, and he won all the way. Olliver got the Finland gelding off the mark smartly, and he was well out when half the distance had been covered. Bestir challenged, but Saima went on to win easily. Demand was badly placed early, but made up a lot of ground in the straight and got up third. Maungaronga was fourth.

The Marton Cup came next, the field being reduced to four. Oratress was made a warm order, Punka being the most fancied of the others. The favourite was in front all the way, and won without the whip from Lado-geur and Rose Queen, Punka being The winner has done good ser-for "Mr. Preston" during the last. vice holidays, as she won a couple of good races at Awapuni. F. Tilley has her in great form.

Eleven saddled up for the Ladies' Bracelet, War Star being made a better favourite than Hautawa. The winner turned up in Diamond Nap, an aged gelding by Glenapp, on which Mr. H. C. Judd rode a good race. There were several in it half-way down the straight, but Diamond Nap got the verdict from Hautawa, with Pomeroy and War Star close up. Be-fore the start Warning (a six-year-old gelding by Advance-Seagull) bolted about two miles.

Bo-Peep carried most money in the Railway Handicap, but Ruddy and Coolpan also had many supporters. Bindle began well, and was never headed, the Solferino gelding getting home easily from the favourite in the very fast time of 1min. 12 2-5sec.

There were thirteen starters in the New Year Hack, for which Fulica, the four-year-old daughter of Braxted-Bald Coot was made a better favourite than Moutoa Camp. Fulica was soon in the lead, and had no difficulty in winning from Salvaless, Moutoa Camp being third and Namur fourth.

Arrowfield was entrusted with most money for the Stewards' Welter, but Goldshine and Hyttus were also well supported. Hyttus was first into the straight, and, stalling off challenges by Goldshine and Arrowfield, won nicely. Fabriquette was fourth.

DEMOS WINS SUMMER HANDI-CAP.

There was another big attendance on the second day, when the weather was hot and the track hard. The fields were fairly large, and the racing of a very enjoyable description.

There were only six starters in the opening event, the Second Hack Hurdles, for which Endure was made a slightly better favourite than Hautawa, both carrying over £1000. Turpenite led over the first obstacle, and then Vigilo took command and led down the back and round the bend into the straight, where he toppled over, leaving Goldstream in command, and the son of Gold Crest went on to win nicely. Endure was fourth. The winner paid a good price. Endure was going along well until he struck a hurdle, which appeared to take the running out of him. There were seven starters in the

Nursery, Birkie being withdrawn. Demand was made favourite, Saima and Guip (coupled) being next in demand. Saima got going very quickly and had a big break at the bend on all but his stablemate (Guip). Demand showed a lot of pace in the run home, but was beaten half a length, though had he not run about a lot in the straight he would perhaps have won. He is a fine-looking gelding, and if he learns to leave the mark quicker will win some good races. Guip is a nice-looking two-year-old filly by Absurd, and is evidently very speedy. It would come as no surprise to find her turning out a really good one. Saima gets going very fast, and his dual win was due to this. It was thought by many that the extra furlong would in Demand's favour, but the tell Highden gelding won in much the same style as he did on the first day, and is undoubtedly better than he was given credit for being.

Waimatao, Omahu, Ruddy and Fabriquette declined their engagements in the Summer Handicap, and Demos was backed down to a very short price, Ladogeur being next in demand. Goldshine and Gaycium demand. Goldshine and Gaycium made the early running, but at the bend the field closed up. Demos and Ladogeur fought out a good finish, the favourite winning handily. Gaycium was close up, third, and Punka last. The latter will do better later on.

There was a good field in the Electric Hack, for which eleven faced the starter. Ruddy was made a bet-ter favourite than Farce, Idle Talk, Idleness and Mida also being solidly supported. Hupana and Idleness got out in front early, followed by Finkop, but as they headed for home Ruddy was up with the leaders and looked all over a winner until Farce came with a rattle on the outside and won comfortably from the favourite. Idleness was fourth and Hupana fifth.

All the acceptors saddled up for the Hack Welter, but Warning bolted three times round the course when doing his preliminary, and took no part in the race. Fulica was made a warm favourite, and justified the confidence reposed ni her by winning as she liked. She paid a very small price, but Whetoki, which finished second, paid the best price of the meeting.

Ruddy and Bindle were scratched for the Telegraph Handicap, leaving only four starters, Waimatao being sent out a very hot favourite, carrying more than half the money on the machine. Birkenvale was the next best backed, and he carried Waimatao along to the turn for home, where the favourite drew out and went on to finish on his own in the fast time of 1min. 13 3-5sec.

Fulica was withdrawn from the Farewell Handicap, ten going to the post, War Baby carrying over £1000 more than Salvaless, the next in demand. Railand was quickest to begin, but War Baby took charge going down the back and was never afterwards headed, though Railand made a big effort down the straight and got up to within half a length. Kapiti was fourth.

Eight faced the starter in the concluding event, the Turakina Welter. There was very solid backing for Hyttus, Ermine and Gold Problem in that order. Hyttus repeated his first day's performance by coming with a fast run at the business end and win-ning from Ermine and Birkenvale. Gold Problem was fourth.

The most successful riders were A. Olliver and L. G. Morris with three wins each. H. Griffiths, M. McArten, and P. Rayner rode a couple of winners apiece, while others who had winning mounts were F. Tutchen, A. McDonald, L. Lambess, and Mr. J. E. Judd.
