SUMMER MEETING.

SECOND DAY.

The Auckland Trotting Club's meeting was continued on December 30. The day was fine, but the overnight rain made the going very holding and against fast time, so that in the early part of the day nothing got near what they were handicapped to do. The track improved as the day advanced, and the last two races were decided on good going, just a little slow. The fields were of average size, and speculation ran out to £52,659 for the day.

In a field of no less than seventeen Rita Gaiindo (72yds.) was made a better favourite than Maggie Girl (who was on the limit) in the Oak Handicap, but the first-named had the misfortune to get into collision with Wild Lad and got away, galloping several times round without her driver. The best Maggie Girl could do was to get fourth, the places being filled by Luna Dillon (the winner, off the limit), Speculator (from the 108yds. mark), and Mintonette.

The next event, the Tramway Handicap, was won by Jewel Fashion, fourth fancy, from the 24yds, mark. Temple making a good run over the concluding stages and getting a close second, while Albert Patch was a good third. Ngahere (the favourite). Ena Bell and Mint Boy (the next best supported) were beaten off, Ena Bell shaping the best of them.

The Summer Cup resulted in a fine race between Cole Nut (second favourite). Hal Junior (favourite), and Dean Dillon (fourth selection), the handicap bringing them well together.

Winestra, Prince Childe and Taneatua were the most strongly supported for the Dominion Handicap, but Glen Mavis, who was coupled with Bigamist, won from Hedgewood and Taneatua after a good race. Epsom Trot provided another good race. After Mutu was done with, Wonderland and Overrate were racing in the lead, and it was only in the run home that Billy Parole, for whom a win was due, got up and won, Bluewood (the favourite) failing, and Rio Grande being set too hard a task broke several times, but clearly could not go the pace. Hint secured fourth place.

Manuka Park (sixth fancy) won the Ranfurly Handicap after a real good finish with Comedy Chief (an outsider) and Oruarangi (the favourite), Comedy Chief showing great improve-There were eleven ment in form. runners. Bronze Patch and Whisht, the favourites for the Christmas Handicap, as things turned out had no chance with Gold Boy, Auckland Girl and Blackthorn, Gold Boy leading practically all the way. In the Dash Handicap Bigamists' turn came, and starting fourth favourite he beat Pearl d'Or (second fancy) and Milda Pointer, who, after making the running, died down over the last little bit of the mile.

CONCLUDING DAY.

The track was in splendid condition and the money bags were talking freely, the sum of £52,271 10s. being put through the machine, bringing the total for the three days to the large sum of £173,393 10s., as against £106,351 for the summer meeting last year, the dates being probably a little more favourable this time.

In the Tamaki Handicap the limit

mare Maggie Girl this time made good. Mahutu, one of Mr. Shadbolt's team, was favourite, Rita Galindo and e Girl coming Magg Lad fourth fancy. Maggie Girl won easing down by five lengths from Wild Lad, who was more than that ahead of Rita Galindo, with Sandy Patch next. There were fourteen

Robert Dillon, the favourite for the Park Handicap, after making a good bid for the stake had to strike his colours to Temple, who was sixth in request, Mint Boy being a very close third in a field of eleven, Ena Bell and Beausant (second and third favourbeing amongst the ites) starteds."

Eleven went out for the President's Handicap, Dean Dillon, Hal Junior, Lord Rose, Oruarangi and Cappriccio being the best supported ones. This was the race of the meeting. A great finish was taking place all down the straight between Hal Junior, Oruarangi and Dean Dillon, Whispering Willie coming with a solid run at the same time. Dean Dillon was the

first to falter, and Fleming giving Whispering Willie an opening this game trotter got through and won by a narrow margin from the consistent Hal Junior, who only just beat Oruarangi. Dean Dillon and Cole Nut were close up, fourth and lifth Dean Dillon and Cole respectively. There was great enthusiasm over this finish, and the performance of Whispering Willie takes rank with the best done over two miles by a trotter in a race, equalling the performance of Hardy Wilkes, the distance being covered in 4min. 42 3-5sec.

There were eight starters for the Association Trot. Hint was made favourite and quite justified his support, but he was doing his best to beat Wonderland (the third favourite). Overrate, the second favourite, finishing outside a place, Billy Parole, who was third, failing to improve on his

handicap with Wonderland.

Hedgewood, Prince Childe and Ramitiaori were the best supported for the Telegraph Handicap, and the ast-named won by something over a length, Hedgewood only beating Agnes Chief, who was also well backed, by a neck. There were ten starters, and as in the other races horses beat the time they were handicapped to do.

In the New Year Handicap Whisht, from the back mark, put up a meritorious performance and overhauled Gold Boy, to whom she was giving 36yds., before the last round was entered upon. The last-named, however, was finishing well and nearly caught her again, Bronze Patch getting third.

The Onslow Handicap brought out a field of eleven. Gold Girl and Cappriccio were the favourites, but though the first-named put up the most brilliant mile of the meeting, covering the distance in 2min. 13 2-5sec., Comedy Chief managed to beat her, and to the surprise of most people did 2min. 14 1-5sec., while Peter Mac, who got third from the limit, was credited with 2min. 17 2-5sec., the three placed horses each doing well under their handicap time, and at least two other of the starters improved on theirs.

There was a mix-up in the Premier Handicap through an accident, in which Treanac, Albert Patch, Tanea-tua and Harold Devon were all sufferers, Prince Childe, a big outsider, winning and meeting with a hostile reception, Kempsey (under the judge's box) and Milda Pointer being second and third respectively. There were seventeen starters, and it is hard to say what the result would have been but for the accident. Taneatua was the favourite, with Jewel Fashion and Kewpie the next best backed. For the lucky backers of Prince Childe the meeting had a good wind up.

Mr. C. F. Mark and staff and the stewards are to be congratulated upon the success which attended them all through, and Mr. Edwards must have been gratified at the working out of his handicapping.
