## CONCLUDING DAY.

GLOAMING WINS ROYAL STAKES.

SNUB EFFECTS A SURPRISE IN AUCKLAND PLATE.

There was again a good attendance at Ellerslie to see the summer meet-The day was fine, ing concluded. and speculation was carried on keenly to the close, when the figures were found to have reached £98,719 10s. for the day, an increase of no less than £38,311, bringing the total for the four days to £435,781 10s., an increase of £172,611 10s. over the four days last year, which included the postponed spring meeting. There was a slight falling off in the number of starters during the afternoon.

Business started with the good field of thirteen in the Goodwood Handicap, Bonnetter, the topweight, having most friends, Te Oro, who after previous showings got in well, being made second fancy, All Talk, Mullingar and Rockfield being the next best backed. Mullingar had not gone far after starting before he broke a bloodvessel again and had to be pulled up. Te Oro again proved his galloping ability by winning in good style from

Rockfield, who ran his best race at the meeting, the mile being run in 1min. 39sec. Bonnetter carried her top weight into third place, finishing within a length of Rockfield, to whom she was conceding 11lb. All Talk she was conceding 11lb. again ran consistently, finishing fourth.

Weldone beat Landslide (who looked to be lightening up fast) with a little to spare in the Sylvia Handicap. Potona looked fresh enough but could not see the distance out, and Wanigan did not improve on her previous race.

A change of riders was tried in the case of Lord Kenilworth, and a change tactics in that he was ridden a waiting race, in the Grandstand Handicap, but that and the 5lb. overweight did not improve matters. He was made favourite but failed badly, and after Melee had made a bold bid Gazique got up and won in good style, beating him and also King Lupin, who was second favourite. It was a pleasing performance on the part of Gazique, who was getting better for his racing. In this race Heathercote fell and Red Ribbon came over him, Deeley, rider of the last-named, being for a time rendered almost unconsci-ous, while T. Reid was rather more severely injured and was taken to the hospital, Heathercote being destroyed. H: Gray was substituted for Deeley

on Gloaming in the Twenty-fifth Royal Stakes, which he won in good style with great ease in 1min. 13sec .- a record for the race and course—with 9.7, which included a 10lb. penalty. Silver Link, who had 9.0, which included a 3lb. rise, was second, Humbug; with a 10lb. penalty, beating Right and Left (with a 71b. allowance) and Moorfowl, who in addition to having a 10lb. penalty had 2lb. overweight, Bagby obtaining the ride in place of T. Reid. Gloaming finished with three-parts of a length to the good, and Humbug was half a length off, but it was clear that Right and Left would not gallop for his lightweight rider, T. Glover.

Soon after the start Pendoon went to the front in the Auckland Hurdle Race Handicap and stayed there, winning by fifteen lengths from Battletide, who beat Entente Cordiale by a dozen lengths, Rekanui (who was made favourite despite her weight, 12.2) easing up. It was the fastest two-mile hurdle race run at Ellerslie.

The way was paved for the County Handicap, and again Mr. R. Hannon's stable provided the favourite, King Abbey carrying more money than Simonides, who became awkward at the post and for once in a way did not get away well; in fact, it was his worst race this season and the only time he has been out of a place in about fifteen consecutive starts this and last season. Some Boy II. was third fancy, but Taiamai won in 1min. 13 2-5sec., with Hymestra second and Murihiku, who cracked on the pace, third.

Snub was leading in the Auckland Plate from Bonnie Maid and Rossini, the only other starters, and the pace was very leisurely over the first five furlongs, when Snub, who was still leading, suddenly cracked on the pressure, and from thence out made it so solid that Rossini had to be ridden to catch him over the last halfmile, and when he did and looked like winning old Snub responded again and cleverly beat him by a neck, Bonnie Maid, who stripped very light, being four lengths off. The race was run 4sec. slower than the Derby, and Rossini carried 41b. overweight. It was a great surprise, but O'Shea and

Snub met with a good reception. Clonmel led all the way in the Grey Handicap, in which he was favourite with Gray up, Loved One (a big outsider) getting second and Gatherer third. Stammer's number (6) was put up in mistake for that of Loved One. and some people threv away their tickets, but recovered in most if not all instances them when the mistake was rectified. There were twenty starters, and Clonmel won by two and a half lengths in the good time of 1min. 1 3-5sec.

## MANAWATU RACING CLUB. CONCLUDING DAY.

MAIOHA WINS PRINCIPAL EVENT.

Perfect weather conditions vailed for the concluding day of the Manawatu Racing Club's gathering, the attendance being a record one. The racing was full of surprises, some very fine finishes being witnessed, while speculation was again brisk, the sum of £54,338 being handled on the totalisator. The total investments for the three days amounted to £172,525, as compared with £76,379 for the previous summer meeting, which, however, was a two-day one.

A start was made with the Whit-more Hack Handicap, for which Arch Salute was made a very hot favourite in a field of nine, carrying more than double the amount on his num-ber than either Festival or Imarib-bon, the next best backed. Imaribbon was first away, but was headed by Railand, who carried on the running until well up the straight, where W. Bell made a forward move on Imaribbon. The Blenheim-owned mare drew level with her rival and Imaribbon. in an exciting finish gained the ver-dict by a nose, Woody Glen being a length away third, and the favourite

Sir Donald and Sartosta were withdrawn from the Tiritea Hurdles Handicap, leaving half a dozen to face the starter. Zeus was installed an odds-on favourite, while Hautawa and Sail Home were evenly backed, fair support being accorded Rienzi, the other pair going out at long prices. Zeus led Hautawa at the start, the latter taking charge racing up the straight the first time, but going along the back was headed by Sail Home, who was closely attended by Hautawa and the favourite entering the straight. Negotiating the last obstacle safely Sail Home ran home an easy winner by several lengths from Hautawa, with Zeus a length and a-half away third, and Rienzi fourth.

Import was the only defection from the Juvenile Handicap, in which a dozen two-year-olds started. Mr. J. Walsingham's bay filly, Canyon (by Wolawa — Wairakau), was made a warm favourite, the locally-owned Saima being second choice, the pair carrying over half the investments on the machine. Canyon, who had the services of L. Morris, was quickest away, and never gave her opponents a chance, winning as she liked from the little-fancied Handy, who defeated Saima by a neck for second place. Verbosity was fourth.

The top weight, Kilrush, was not asked to contest the Liverpool Handicap, the Hawke's Bay representative, Maioha, on whom A. Oliver had the mount, being installed little better than an odds-on favourite, while Moutoa Ivanova and Demos were both well backed. After Omahu and Astinome had taken turns at making the pace Hyttus rushed to the front attended by Moutoa Ivanova, the pair leading Maioha and Demos into the straight. Once whips were out Maioha moved up to the leaders, while Rose Queen also put in a brilliant run, a great finish being witnessed, in which Oliver got the favourite home by a head from Moutoa Ivanova, half a length after whom came Demos, with Rose Queen fourth.

There were a dozen starters in the Westbury Hack Handicap, from which Hallowvonia and Barleycorn were withdrawn. Nursing Sister was made a better favourite than Samarang. The favourite set out to win from end to end, but half-way up the straight both Tama-a-roa and Sycorax had her measure, the latter pair battling out an exciting finish, in which honours went to Tama-a-roa by a couple of lengths, the favourite being third, and Asterina, who was prominent throughout, fourth.

The half dozen carded for the Claudeboye Handicap all fulfilled their engagements, Daytime having the call in the betting over Bonnie Heather, with First Salute also substantially backed. Daytime took the lead from the start and piloted the way into the straight, where Teka made a determined effort to head him, but J. Olsen kept the favourite hard at it and passed the post a length in advance of the Hawke's Bay candidate, First Salute being half a length away third, and Bonnie Heather fourth.

Railand, who had run in the opening event of the day, and March On declined their engagements in the Christmas Hack Welter Handicap, leaving a field of nine. War Baby, the three-year-old daughter of Martian-Bebe, was made a warm first choice, Moutoa Camp being
