The Wellington Trotting Club held heir annual meeting at Hutt Park while the attendance reached record proportions. The offer of a $£ 100$ purse to any horse lowering the Aus ralasian mile grass track record wa esoonsible for the presence at the neeting of the two cracks, Aut and Dillon and Cathedral Chimes, and heir missthy attraction Author Dil on, driven ky his trainer, B. Jarden nacc the first attempt, being paced hroughout by the galloper Rakaia ith J. Olsen in the saddle. The son f Harold Dillon-Authoress arouse niversal admiration by his free movement and rare pace, and travel ing with characteristic evenness hroughout he got to the end of the aile in 2 min. 8 sec., thus lowering the $11.3-5 \mathrm{sec}$ ) for the eizht furlongs by $3-5 s e c$. for the eiriver and horse re ceived a great ovation in recognition of the record-hreaking achievement Catherlral Chines, with J. The gathering was capably con rolied by the secretary, Mr. R. W short, and his staff, the day's pro eedings passing off in a highly-satis actory and enjoyable manner.
Sea Nymph was the elect of backer in the Hutt Park Trial Handicap, in which there were seven starters, but Xim Kim sict out in the lead at the start, and though the favourite made a o o effort to catch the claughter o mainana in the strantage to maintained her advantage to the fin sh, winning by way, third.
Of the half-dozen satdled up for the Eorough Handicap Lelia Denver and Blue Drift were best supported The Iatter flattered his backers in the early stages, but over the last halimile he tired perceptibly and wa passed by Delta, who, finishing trongly, won by eight lengths from Annie Black, with Blue Drift a couple if lengths away, third. Tarkorea wa ourth.
The New Zealand Trotting Gold cup brought out a field of ten run ners, favouritism being accorde Partner, with Lochnagar and Em peror most in demand of the others Partner (10s.) broke at the start, but auickly settled down, Fair Purita (i0s.) assuming the lead. The far urite, however, was in charge as the stand was passed the first time, with air Puritan, Birrwood and Empero following in that order, Lochnagar being last Birdwood improved h: eing last. bad break caused him to drop back.
