RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Nominations must be accompanied by fees. All fees must be paid before competitor starts. No competitor will be allowed to start unless colours, dress and gear are in good order and condition.

Rule 136.—Every owner shall register his racing colours, and shall not race a horse in colours other than his registered colours, except by permission of the Stewards, which permission shall be granted only under special circumstances, and upon payment of the sum of 10s. for each time a horse belonging to such owner starts in colours other than his registered colours.

No horse will be allowed to compete in hoppers in races for Trotters Only.

Rule 196.—Every person applying for admission to any course, and every person entering or endeavouring to enter a horse for any race, and every person having, or subsequently acquiring, any interest in such horse, shall be deemed to accept all the conditions and restrictions imposed or implied by these Rules, and to be barred from questioning the action of the Conference, Appeal Judges, Association, Club, Racing Club or Body, Committee, Stewards, Officials, Agents or Servants in respect of any such person or horse, or any person connected therewith otherwise than is provided for in Part XXX. of these Rules. A copy of this Rule shall be printed in all programmes and printed and conspicuously placed at the entrance to every course.

Placed horses doing better time than that specified in their race may be nominated for a shorter limit race on any succeeding day of the meeting. Such nominations may be made at any time up to half an hour after the finish of the last race on the first and second days of the meetings.

The Committee reserve the right to refuse any entry, and to exclude any person or persons from the ground without giving any explanation.

Before any horse can be entered for handicap races the Provident Fund fee (L) must be paid to the Secretary of the New Zealand Trotting Association, under a severe penalty or disqualification, vide Rules of Trotting.

Entrance money must be enclosed with nominations, together with name, age and address of owner, name, age, and pedigree of horse, name of trainer, and colours.

Entries made by telegraph must be confirmed in writing by first mail, with full particulars and entrance money, otherwise fines (provided for under Part XVI., Rule 4 of Racing) will be rigidly enforced.

Owners are responsible in the matter of penalties and allowances. All races to be run under the New Zealand Rules of Racing. Any horse winning after publication of weights is liable to be re-handicapped.

In no case will tickets be issued to trainers or jockeys except on production of licenses to the Secretary.

Owners desiring tickets to be forwarded are requested to notify the Secretary (when accepting), stating what tickets are required.
