WAIRARAPA RACING CLUB.

AUTUMN MEETING.

The Wairarapa Racing Club will hold their autumn meeting on the Tauherenikau racecourse, Feathers-ton, on Easter Saturday and Monday (April 3 and 5). A varied and richlyendowed programme has been drawn up for the two days, and is certain to receive wide attention from owners and trainers. The chief event on the opening day will be the Easter Handicap, of 400sovs., 1% miles, in which the entry promises to be par-ticularly strong. Another open event which will will wide where the big which will undoubtedly prove a big inducement to sportsmen to be represented at the Wairarapa fixture is the Railway Handicap, of 250sovs., six furlongs. The Wairarapa Two-year-old Stakes, of 200sovs., 5½ furlongs, is a handicap that should meet with a ready response from those with juveniles under their charge, while the Martinborough Welter Handicap, of 200sovs, seven furlongs, in which the minimum weight is 8.0, is among the most popular events on the opening day. Four events are provided for the hack division, as follows:-Moaki Hack Welter Handicap, of 150sovs., seven furlongs, minimum Mokai Hack Welter Handicap, of 150sovs., six furlongs; Members' Hack Handicap, of 150sovs, one mile; and the Maiden Hack Stakes, of 150sovs., $5\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs, for three-year-olds and upwards that have never won a race at the time of starting. These excep-

tional opportunities of picking up a decent stake at Easter time are not likely to be lost sight of by owners of hacks, and the response from this quarter should be of a highly gratifying character to the club.

On the second day the Autumn Handicap, of 300sovs., one mile and a distance, will claim chief attention, and the chance to annex another good stake is certain to be fully availed of by owners. The Stewards' Handi-cap, of 200sovs., six furlongs, and the Tauherenikau Welter Handicap, of 200sovs., seven furlongs, minimum weight 7.10, will both constitute a strong draw on the second day, while the two-year-old division will make their second appearance at the meeting in the Juvenile Handicap, of 200sovs. six furlongs. The remaining second day's events consist of the Moroa Hack Welter Handicap, of 150sovs. seven furlongs, minimum weight 7.10; Electric Hack Handicap. 150sovs, six furlongs; Settlers' Hack Handicap, of 150sovs., one mile;

six furlongs, and the Halcombe Welter Handicap, of 350sovs., seven furlongs, are a brace of events which should fill particularly well. Other events on the first day's programme are the Kawa Kawa Hurdles (Handicap), of 300sovs., 134 miles; Onepuhi Hack Welter (Handicap), of 250sovs., one mile and 54 yards, minimum weight 7.11; Taonui Hack Handicap, of 200sovs., seven furlongs; Ongo Hack Handicap, of 200sovs., 5½ furlongs; and the Maiden Stakes, of 200sovs., 51/2 furlongs, weight 9.0, for two-year-olds and upwards that have never won a flat race at time of starting.

On the second day the Easter Handicap. of 500sovs. 11/4 miles, will claim chief attention, and a splendid nomination for this event can be con-fidently looked for. Next in importance come the Denbigh Handicap, of 300sovs, six furlongs, and the Makino Welter (Handicap), of 300sovs., seven furlongs. Another jumping event, the Kimbolton Hurdles Handicap, of 200-

remunerative prize money offering Not only does the Riverton meeting make a strong claim for consideration from owners of cross-country candidates, but the programme is also particularly attractive to those who have flat racers under their control. The Riverton Cup (1¼ miles), to be run on the first day, carries with it the valuable stake of 500sovs., and can be depended upon to induce a good entry of the leading handicap horses in the south. Next in importance comes the Great Western Steeple-chase, of 400sovs., about three miles, which affords the 'chasers an early opportunity of competing for a lucra-tive stake. The Waiau Steeplechase, of 150sovs., about two miles, also comes up for decision on the first day, and is open to horses that have never won a hurdle race or steeplechase at a totalisator meeting, the minimum weight carried to be 10.7. Other first day's events are the Aparima Handicap, of 180sovs., six furlongs; First County Handicap, of 115-

The Feilding Jockey Club have drawn up a highly-attractive pro-gramme for their Easter meeting, which takes place on Monday and Tuesday, April 5 and 6. For the two days the large sum of £47500 is to be distributed in stakes, £2650 being set aside for the first day, and £2100 for the second. The meeting is one of the most popular in the Dominion, and as no race on either day's programme is of less value than 200sovs. it is seen that exceptional opportunities are provided owners and train. ers for picking up one or more valuable stakes at Feilding during the Easter holidays.
