THE IMPORTED AMERICAN SIRE, PETER MOKO.

By PETER THE GREAT, sold for 50,000 dollars at 21 years old and standing this season at 1000 dollars and voted the greatest sire that ever lived. PETER MOKO, who is a full brother to PETER NASH (2.01 1/4), is himself one of the fastest and handsomest class trotters that ever left America. Foaled in 1912, he is now seven years old, stands 15.3 and weighs about 1100lb. PETER THE GREAT (2.07 1/4) is sire of Miss Harris (1.58 1/4), Peter Nash (2.01 1/4), Peter Stevens (2.0 1/4), Peter Volo (2.02), Mabel Task (2.02 1/4), Peter Loko (2.03), Margaret Drineen (2.03), Peter Mac (2.03 1/2) and 58 others under 2.10.

MRS. NASH, the dam of Peter Nash (2.0 1/4) and Peter Moko, both by Peter the Great, was got by MOKO, sire of 53 in the list, including the world's champion two- and three-year-old trotter, The Real Lady (2.04 1/4) and 2.03, winner of the Kentucky Futurity, Dinner Stakes, Horse Review Futurity and Horse Breeders' Futurity at two years and Kentucky Futurity and Horse Review Stakes at three years. Moko's sons have sired 275 with records down to 2.03 1/4, and his daughters have produced 115 with records, including those of The Harvester (2.01), Peter Nash (2.01 1/4) and The Problem (2.04 1/4).

PETER MOKO'S second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh dams have made trotting history. He has authenticated trials of 2.8 1/2, half in 1.03, quarter in 3.0 1/4.

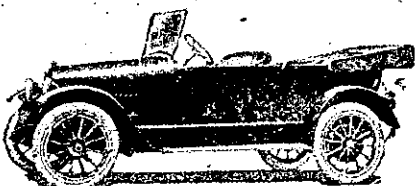
