thoroughly carrying out his part of the programme, as otherwise the fac-tory will have no margin at all for their operations, which include carting, deseeding, retting, scutching, grading and baling the final product.

## Aim to Reduce Tow

It is most disappointing to find after a good fibre crop has been produced that the result is tow. Only the best fibre produced can be used for its main purpose, which is, first and foremost, for aeroplane wing fabric. Remember that good quality straw can be turned easily into low quality fibre, and every operation that tends to increase the proportion of tow does so at the expense of the quantity of line fibre produced. Tow is worth approximately one-third of the value of line fibre, and in addition costs more to produce, as it has to receive further treatment and has to be hand scutched. When straw becomes discoloured the resultant fibre is graded as barré flax, which reduces its value by approximately half.


Linen flax fibre is a vital war necessity, as is emphasised by the fact that this commodity obtains priority of all shipping space. Farmers, make it your aim to reduce tow and discoloured straw in your handling of this crop.
