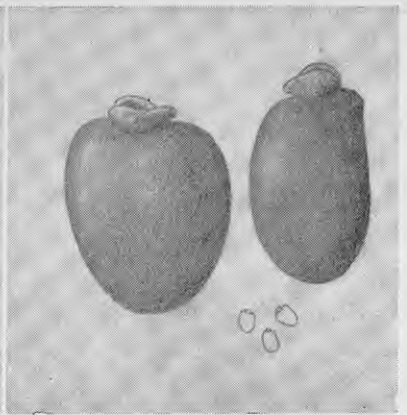




**CORONOPUS DIDYMUS:** HOG-CRESS. Colour yellow to grey. Occurs frequently in white clover seed. Australia admits not more than 100 seeds per ounce. An annual weed of cultivated land and open pastures.



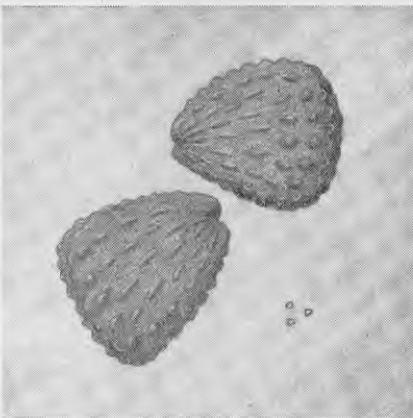
**SONCHUS ASPER:** PRICKLY SOW-THISTLE. Colour light brown. Occurs with medium frequency in cocksfoot and crested dogtail. Australia admits not more than 100 seeds per ounce. An annual weed of cultivated land.



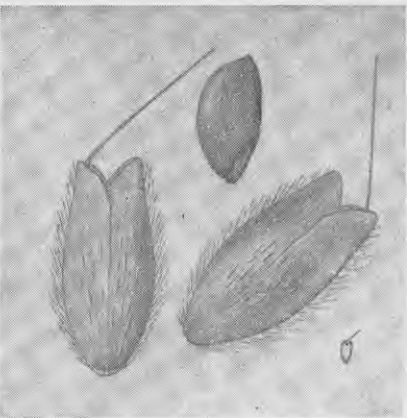
**CYTISUS SCOPARIUS:** SCOTCH BROOM. Colour olive green to brown. Occurs infrequently in cocksfoot seed. Australia admits not more than 50 seeds per ounce. A shrub common on waste land and occasionally invading pastures.



**ANAGALLIS ARVENSIS:** SCARLET PIMPERNEL. Colour dark brown with ridges or scale-like excrescences of lighter colour. Occurs frequently in white clover seed. Australia admits not more than 200 seeds per ounce. An annual weed of cultivated land and open pastures.



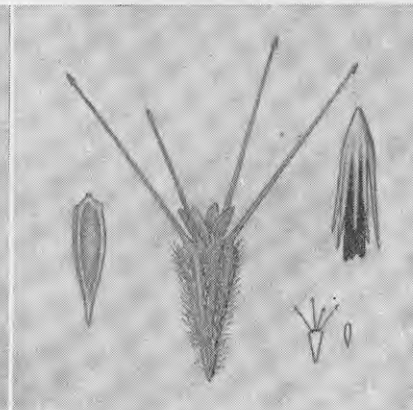
**CERASTIUM VULGATUM:** MOUSE-EARED CHICKWEED. Colour brown. Occurs frequently in browntop. In Canada classed as a secondary noxious weed seed when occurring in seed of turf and forage grasses. An annual or biennial weed common on cultivated land and in pastures.



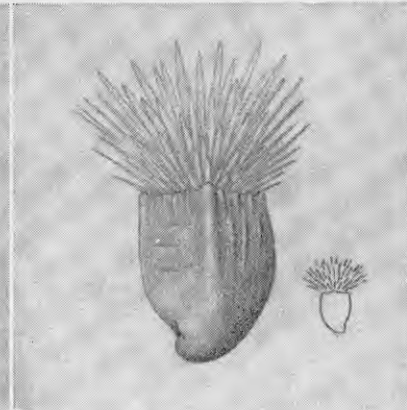
**ALOPECURUS GENICULATUS:** FLOATING FOXTAIL, or KNEE-JOINTED FOXTAIL. Colour light to dark grey. Occurs with medium frequency in crested dogtail and cocksfoot. The caryopses are not uncommon in white clover. A perennial grass often abundant in wet pastures.



**SISYMBRIUM OFFICINALE:** HEDGE MUSTARD. Colour brown. Shape highly variable. Occurs with medium frequency in white clover, and in grain imported from Australia. Australia admits not more than 20 seeds per ounce. An annual or biennial weed of cultivated land.



**ACAENA SANGUISORBÆ:** PIRI PIRI, BIDI-BID. Colour brown. Occurs infrequently in *Danthonia pilosa*, crested dogtail, and cocksfoot. A native perennial weed of pastures, especially objectionable because of the burr-like seeds which spoil wool.



**CARTHAMUS LANATUS:** SAFFRON THISTLE. Colour light yellow or purple. Occurs with medium frequency in grain imported from Australia. Australia prohibits importation. An annual weed occasionally found on cultivated land in the North Island.
