The two main rotations most favoured by this farmer are as follows:-

- 1. Old pasture peas wheat barley rape and grass seed.
- 2. Old pasture rape wheat barley, and sown down with grass.

In many cases circumstances have necessitated the adoption of varying rotations, some of which are as follows:-

- 1. Old pasture barley wheat rape and grass seed, or turnips and grass seed.
- 2. Old pasture peas wheat Italian ryegrass and Montgomery red clover.
- 3. Old pasture turnips barley wheat rape and grass seed.
