The two main rotations most favoured by this farmer are as follows:—

1. Old pasture — peas — wheat — barley — rape and grass seed.
2. Old pasture — rape — wheat — barley, and sown down with grass.

In many cases circumstances have necessitated the adoption of varying rotations, some of which are as follows:—

1. Old pasture — barley — wheat — rape and grass seed, or turnips and grass seed.
2. Old pasture — peas — wheat — Italian ryegrass and Montgomery red clover.
3. Old pasture — turnips — barley — wheat — rape and grass seed.
