

## Why and When to change inflations

Recent research by the New Zealand Department of Agriculture has proved that milking inflations should be changed regularly.

It has been found that slack inflations tend to slow up milking, and slow milking tends to cause "strippy" cows and lower production. Old inflations harbour bacteria and, when slack, could result in increased mastitis. Dirty inflations cause secondgrade milk.

The Department recommends that inflations be changed every six weeks if milking up to 15 cows per set per milking; more frequently if more cows are milked.

Inflations changed every six weeks will help to -

- 1. Speed up milking.
- 2. Keep up production.
- 3. Minimise mastitis.
- 4. Maintain milk quality.
