Infanticide.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.

Whereas on the morning of the 7th instant the body of a male child, without clothing, about four or five days old, was found dead in a water-closet at the residence of Percival Barker, junction of Albert and London Streets, Dunedin; and whereas, at an inquest held on the 9th instant at the Dunedin Hospital, the jury returned the following verdict:—"Found dead, but no evidence to show from what cause;" and whereas there is little doubt but the crime of infanticide was committed: Notice is hereby given that a reward of £25 will be paid by Government to any person or persons who shall first give such information to the police as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the offender.

Incendiarism.

About 9 o'clock on the night of the 1st instant, a three-roomed cottage situate at Rangitata Island, Canterbury District, the property of W. K. Macdonald, value £150, was destroyed by fire; believed to be the act of an incendiary.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

JOHN PALMER is charged with having, between the 29th of May and 11th of June last, at Invercargill, embezzled about £6, the moneys of Thomas Manning, his employer. Description:—A quarter-caste Maori, about fifteen years of age, 5 feet 8½ inches high, slight build, pale sallow complexion, sharp piercing eyes, wore old dark-coloured jacket and black wideawake hat. He received about £6 for fish and oysters during the absence of his employer, and has failed to account for the money. No warrant.

RICHARD BURN is charged, on warrant issued by the Port Chalmers Bench, with the abduction of Emma Russell, aged 14 years, at Maori Kaik, Otago Heads, on the 21st ultimo. Description:—A half-caste Maori, twenty-three years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, medium build, black hair, light brown whiskers and moustache, brown eyes; supposed to be dressed in dark tweed coat, light tweed trousers and vest, black felt hat, and elastic-side boots. He is supposed to have gone to Kaiapoi, near Christchurch.

WILLIAM JAMIESON, charged with having obtained a cheque for £4, by false pretences, from Messrs. Weir and Samson, at Dunedin, has been arrested by the Oamaru police.

House-Breaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from the person of David Anderson, in a brothel in Machin's Lane, Dunedin, an old open-face silver lever watch, second hand wanting, hour hand broken; maker, Oliver, Liverpool, No. 986; value £4. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Margaret Willis and Margaret Clarke, who occupied the brothel. Willis is English, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 2 inches high, stout build, pale complexion, hazel eyes, dark brown hair. Clarke is Scotch, eighteen years of age, 5 feet 2 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, grey eyes, and sandy hair.

Identifiable. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who slept in the bedroom on the night the theft was committed, and left early next morning by train, supposed for Timaru. Description:—Supposed English, about twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair, small fair beard on chin; wore a new silver Albert guard.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having, on the 30th ultimo, stolen a new blue pilot cloth jacket, value 28s.

(since recovered), from the shop-door of William Mudgee, King Street, Dunedin. Description:—Between thirty-five and forty years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fair hair, sandy whiskers, beard, and moustache; wore dirty grey tweed suit, and black soft felt hat.

Stolen during the night of the 11th instant, from a safe in the warehouse of John Anderson, Willis Street, Wellington, three £5 notes, thirty-three £1 notes, six half-sovereigns, and £4 in silver.
