Infanticide.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on the morning of the 7th instant the body of a male child, without clothing, about four or five days old, was found dead in a water-closet at the residence of Percival Barker, junction of Albert and London Streets, Dunedin; and whereas, at an inquest held on the 9th instant at the Dunedin Hospital, the jury returned the following verdict:—"Found dead, but no evidence to show from what cause;" and whereas there is little doubt but the crime of infanticide was committed: Notice is hereby given that a reward of £25 will be paid by Government to any person or persons who shall first give such information to the police as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the offender.

Incendiarism.

ABOUT 9 o'clock on the night of the 1st instant, a three-roomed cottage situate at Rangitata Island, Canterbury District, the property of W. K. Macdonald, value £150, was destroyed by fire; believed to be the act of an incendiary.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

JOHN PALMER is charged with having, between the 29th of May and 11th of June last, at Invercargill, embezzled about £6, the moneys of Thomas Manning, his employer. Description:—A quarter-caste Maori, about fifteen years of age, 5 feet 8½ inches high, slight build, pale sallow complexion, sharp piercing eyes, wore old dark-coloured jacket and black wideawake hat. He received about £6 for fish and oysters during the absence of his employer, and has failed to account for the money. No warrant.

RICHARD BURN is charged, on warrant issued by the Port Chalmers Bench, with the abduction of Emma Russell, aged 14 years, at Maori Kaik, Otago Heads, on the 21st ultimo. Description:—A half-caste Maori, twenty-three years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, medium build, black hair, light brown whiskers and moustache, brown eyes; supposed to be dressed in dark tweed coat, light tweed trousers and vest, black felt hat, and elastic-side boots. He is supposed to have gone to Kaipoi, near Christchurch.

PAUL CHARLES GUBDARTH, *alias* Charles Gilbert, charged with the larceny of a saddle and bridle, the property of James Rhind, has been arrested by the Port Chalmers police.

WILLIAM JAMIESON, charged with having obtained a cheque for £4, by false pretences, from Messrs. Weir and Samson, at Dunedin, has been arrested by the Oamaru police.

House-Breaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from the person of David Anderson, in a brothel in Machin's Lane, Dunedin, an old open-face silver lever watch, second hand wanting, hour hand broken; maker, Oliver, Liverpool, No. 986; value £4. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Margaret Willis and Margaret Clarke, who occupied the brothel. Willis is English, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 2 inches high, stout build, pale complexion, hazel eyes, dark brown hair. Clarke is Scotch, eighteen years of age, 5 feet 2 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, grey eyes, and sandy hair.

STOLEN on the 23rd ultimo, from the person of Edward Elborn, in Christchurch, a small flannel bag containing 31 sovereigns. Bag identifiable.

STOLEN about the 23rd ultimo, from the vest pocket of Thomas H. J. Belby, on board the schooner "Omaha," at Queen Street Wharf, Auckland, a Union Bank of Australia £1 note, 1s. 6d. in silver, and 3d. in copper.

STOLEN between the 16th and 20th ultimo, from the dwelling of Daniel Connors, near Mercer, Auckland District, a £5 note.

R. AND R. DUDER'S House-breaking and Larceny.—A bill for £168, drawn by William Duder, in favour of R. and R. Duder, payable at the Union Bank of Australia, Auckland, was also stolen at the same time. The other bills stolen are payable at Messrs. Duder's store. The stolen cheques are on the Auckland branches of the banks on which they are drawn, and are in favour of R. and R. Duder, except the one drawn by—Tattan.

STOLEN during the night of the 3rd instant, from a bedroom in Cogan's boarding-house, at Oamaru, twenty-five dozen ivory and silver watch-chain appendages, some of which represent dogs and other animals; all contain small views of towns and cities, which can be seen by looking through a small hole; twelve nickel-silver tea-spoons; twelve nickel silver table-spoons; two meerschaum pipes, "Irish Pipe" stamped on front of each bowl; a nearly new pair of elastic-side boots, size 7, a few nails without heads in soles; the property of a hawker named Bott; value £21 4s. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who slept in the bedroom on the night the theft was committed, and left early next morning by train, supposed for Timaru. Description:—Supposed English, about twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair, small fair beard on chin; wore a new silver Albert guard.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having, on the 30th ultimo, stolen a new blue pilot cloth jacket, value 28s.

(since recovered), from the shop-door of William Mudgee, King Street, Dunedin. Description:—Between thirty-five and forty years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fair hair, sandy whiskers, beard, and moustache; wore dirty grey tweed suit, and black soft felt hat.

STOLEN during the night of the 11th instant, from a safe in the warehouse of John Anderson, Willis Street, Wellington, three £5 notes, thirty-three £1 notes, six half-sovereigns, and £4 in silver. Suspicion attached to Richard Haybittle, an iron-mongers' assistant, who, about a fortnight previous, borrowed the key of the safe from Mr. Anderson, and, it is now supposed, obtained a duplicate. It is believed that the offender was concealed in the warehouse when the establishment was locked for the night, and opened the safe with a skeleton key, as the back door, which was secured on the inside, was found open on the following morning.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having, on the 23rd ultimo, at Dunedin, stolen five Crimean shirts (recovered) from the shop of Bennett and Jamieson, value £2 16s. 6d. Description:—About thirty years of age, 6 feet high, stout build, fair hair, sandy whiskers, beard, and moustache, Roman nose; wore black cloth frock coat, dark trousers and vest, and thick soft felt hat.

STOLEN on the 29th ultimo, from the person of Ann Jennings, in an auction mart in Nelson Street, Auckland, an old chamois-leather purse with brass clasps, containing a £1 note, a half-sovereign; about 20s. in silver, amongst which were five or six three-penny pieces; two gold keeper rings, one New South Wales gold, with plain shield, the other English gold; value of rings, £2 10s. Purse and rings identifiable.

STOLEN on the 29th ultimo, from the office of Henry Elliott, Queen Street Wharf, Auckland, a carpenter's new claw-hammer, ordinary pattern, value 7s. 6d.

STOLEN during the night of the 30th ultimo, from the shop of Thomas Allan, Cumberland Street, Dunedin, three canvas bags, 18 inches long by 14 inches wide, value 1s. 6d. Identifiable. A large square of glass was broken in the shop window, and the stolen bags, which contained onion and parsnip seed, emptied, and the seeds mixed.

Description:—English; a labourer, thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, dark hair, whiskers, and moustache; carried a new white waterproof coat, with slit in back, having two buttons and button-holes.

Freeman is English, 5 feet 6 inches high, brown hair, fair complexion, blotched face, dark eyes, large nose; wore light-coloured tweed trousers, black wideawake hat, and lace-up boots.

CATHERINE RAMSAY is charged, on warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench, with having on the 2nd instant, at Oamaru, stolen a Brahmopootra cock and hen, large size, both speckled grey, no feathers on the back of the cock's neck, the property of Hugh McLaren; value 30s. Identifiable. Description:—Thirty years of age, stout build, light brown eyes, black hair, dark complexion, false teeth; wore winey dress, paisley shawl, and felt hat with white feather. She left Oamaru for Dunedin on the 2nd instant. STOLEN on the 16th ultimo, from the shop-door of James Hardie, Rattray Street, Dunedin, a new black waterproof coat, about 48 inches long; "S 126, cross," written with pencil near bottom; value 20s. Identifiable.

Horse and Cattle Stealing.

JOHN SCOTT is charged, on warrant issued by the Waipawa Bench, with having, on the 23rd ultimo, at Waipawa, Hawke's Bay District, stolen a horse (since recovered, having been sold by the offender), the property of William Olley. Description:—English, a butcher and general labourer, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, slight build, thin features, fair hair, fair whiskers and moustache, whiskers slightly tinted with red, shaved on chin; wore dark tweed suit and cheese-cutter cap. He left Napier on the 29th ultimo, supposed for Auckland, overland *via* Taupo.

Had been in the army. He was seen on the 14th ultimo at Halfway Bush, near Mataura, riding a roan mare and leading a chestnut gelding, answering the description of the one stolen. Wheeler is English, twenty years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, blue eyes, fair complexion, light hair, goatee, and moustache. Ewing is thirty years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, dark full whiskers and moustache.

GEORGE HASSACK is charged with deserting from the barque "Drimclay," at Port Chalmers, on the 13th ultimo. Description:—A seaman, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, slight build, dark complexion, brown hair, pale thin features, dark eyes, beardless, smart appearance; wore blue coat, dark tweed trousers, felt hat, and elastic-side boots.

HORSES AND CATTLE.

C. W. BUCKNELL is charged, on warrant issued by the Townsville Bench, with stealing No. 5 on this month's list (a bay mare), the property of David Walker. Bucknell, who was seen riding the mare, is described as about twenty-seven years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, fresh complexion, sandy whiskers and moustache, smart appearance; is a native of Parramatta, New South Wales, and is supposed to have made for Sydney. Bucknell is also known by the soubriquet of the "Marquis of Rags." 12th February, 1877.

C. W. Bucknell, charged with horse-stealing, has been ar-

rested by the Sydney Detective Police, and remanded to Townsville. 8th March, 1877.

C. W. Bucknell, remanded to Townsville, from Sydney, on bail, has failed to appear in answer to the charge preferred against him. 25th March, 1877.

Information has been received from the police authorities at Sydney that Charles Wentworth Bucknell, charged with horse-stealing, left Newcastle, New South Wales, as a stowaway on board the barque "S. M. Stetson," bound for San Francisco, which vessel was beached on Lord Howe Island, whence he expected to obtain a passage to Auckland, New Zealand, in the schooner "Josephine," which had called there on her way to that port. A photograph of Bucknell has been received and filed in the Detective Office, Brisbane, for reference. He was clean-shaved when on the island. 15th May, 1877.
