Incendiarism.

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS, at 1.15 o'clock on the morning of the 19th ultimo, the china and glass warehouse of Weir and Samson, situate in Princes Street, Dunedin, was discovered on fire by the police, but the fire was soon after extinguished, before much damage was done: And whereas at an inquest held on the 22nd and 23rd ultimo, to inquire as to the cause of the origin of the fire, the following verdict was returned: "That the fire was feloniously, wilfully, and maliciously caused by some person or persons unknown:"

Notice is hereby given that a reward of £500 will be paid by the insurance companies interested to any person who shall first give such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons by whom the fire was caused.

At 9 p.m. on the 5th ultimo, the building known as the Red Lion Brewery, situate at Queenstown Gorge, Otago District, the property of William Lovel Davis, was discovered on fire, by which it was destroyed. At an inquest held on the 12th ultimo, by H. A. Stratford, Esq., R.M. and Coroner, to inquire as to the cause of the origin of the fire, the jury returned an open verdict. The building, which was insured for £800, had not been used for some time previous. Suspicion attached to William Lovell Davis, the owner of the premises.

On the 17th ultimo, an unoccupied eight-roomed weather-board house, value £300, situate at Happy Valley, Nelson District, the property of Isaac Harvey, was destroyed by fire. At an inquest held on the 25th ultimo, at the Black Horse Hotel, Wakapuaka, by W. W. Squires, Esq., Coroner, to inquire as to the cause of the origin of the fire, the following verdict was returned: "No evidence to show how the fire originated." The house was insured for £300.

At 3.15 a.m. on the 12th instant, a shed, situate on the beach at Campbelltown, Otago District, the property of Thomas Johnston Thompson, containing ship-building tools, ship tackle, &c., value £400, was discovered on fire, by which it and contents were destroyed. The shed and stock were uninsured. Suspicion attached to Thomas Richard Fordham, English, late liceusee of the Engle Hotel, Campbelltown, about fifty years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, light brown hair, sandy whiskers, beard, and moustache, mixed with grey; dissipated appearance.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

John Hampton is charged, on warrant issued by the Ashburton Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, about the 10th instant, at Ashburton, of a watch the property of Robert Smyth. Description:—Supposed English, a barman, about twenty-two years of age, 5 feet 5 or 6 inches high, stout

Dr. Aspinall is now residing in Brisbane, Queensland. A gentleman named Wood, now in the Government Survey Office, Brisbane, can identify the box and books, as he had the use of the books on the passage from Liverpool. The two cases are the property of the Rev. Frank Coghlan, now residing in Perth, Western Australia.
