#### Incendiarism.

At 7 p.m. on the 24th ultimo, a house situate at the corner of Dixon Street and Maori Row, Wellington, the property of John Quin, value about £200, was discovered by the police on fire, which was extinguished before much damage was done. The fire originated in a room used by Morton Quin as an office, and papers, letters, &c., found burning therein were saturated with kerosene oil. The floor, on which kerosene had been thrown, had just caught fire when discovered. The house was insured for £400. Suspicion attached to Morton Quin, a son of John Quin, a native of New Zealand, a clerk, twenty-eight years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark brown or black hair, dark beard, whiskers, and moustache; wore dark twee I suit and soft hat.

On the evening of the 27th ultimo an attempt was made to burn an unoccupied house at Woodend, Canterbury District, the property of William Antell, by placing gorse under the house and setting it on fire, but the fire was soon after discovered and extinguished before much damage was done.

At about 1 a.m. on the 25th ultimo, a building used as barn and stable containing agricultural machinery, harness, &c., situate at Murray's Flat, near Waitahuna, Otago District, the property of Sinclair Williamson, was discovered on fire, by which it and all it contained, except some harness, were destroyed. At an inquest held at Havelock, on the 27th ultimo, to inquire as to the cause of the origin of the fire, the following verdict was returned:—"That the barn and stable were wilfully set fire to by some person or persons unknown." The property destroyed was insured in excess of its value.

At 3 p.m. on the 28th ultimo, a fire was wilfully lit on the reserve at Governor's Bay, Canterbury District, near the dwelling of Thomas Henry Potts, by which a number of trees and shrubs, his property, value £20, were destroyed. Suspicion attached to two boys, about fourteen years of age, dressed in dark tweed suits and wideawake hats, who were seen running from the direction of the fire soon after it was lit. #### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

About six or eight months ago he was employed mining near Silver Peak, Waikouaiti, and previously at Moeraki Beach and Southland, Otago District.

TIMOTHY HEALEY, of whom no description can be given, is charged with having, at Christchurch, on the 7th October, 1876, obtained £40 by false pretences from Robert Wilkin. He represented that he had 449 sheep in the Malvern District, and

agreed to deliver the wool at Mr. Wilkin's store, in Christchurch, when the sheep were shorn, which he has failed to do. Inquiry has been made by the police, but no person named Timothy Healey is known in the Malvern District.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, between 3 and 5 p.m. on the 25th ultimo, in Armagh Street West, Christchurch, wilfully and obscenely exposed his person to Margaret Smith and other females. Description: About thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fair hair and moustache, short stubly hair on face; wore light holland coat, black vest, dirty moleskin trousers with straps round the knees, and old brown slouch hat. Identifiable. He stood opposite Miss Aswhin's Ladies' Boarding School, and wilfully exposed his person to the inmates several times.

John Bolonga is charged, on warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, on the 4th September last, at Boundary Creek, near Oamaru, of 4s., the moneys of Frederick Coombe. Description: A native of Austria, a labourer and miner, about thirty years of age, 6 feet high, dark complexion and eyes, long dark curly hair, dark moustache, no beard or whiskers; wore dark tweed clothes and black felt hat. His wife resides at Waihola. He was seen in Dunedin on the 18th or 19th ultimo. He received 4s. from each man employed at the Oamaru Waterworks as a subscription towards the Oamaru Hospital, but has failed to pay it over to the Hospital Secretary. A warrant in only one case has at present been issued.

Henry Chann is charged, on warrant issued by the New Plymouth Bench, with having indecently assaulted Mary Jane Cooper, aged six years, at New Plymouth, on the 26th ultimo. Description: A native of New Plymouth, eighteen years of age, 5 feet 4 inches high, round shouldered, stoops when walking, sallow complexion, dark brown hair, hair beginning to grow on face; wore dark tweed coat, light tweed trousers, billycock hat, and strong lace-up boots. It is supposed he left New Plymouth by the mountain road for Normanby.

## House-Breaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

Between 6 p.m. on the 20th and 9 a.m. on the 22nd ultimo, the office of Henry Guthrie, corner of Liverpool and Crawford Streets, Dunedin, was entered by means of a picklock, and a safe in the office broken open, but nothing was stolen, as the safe contained only old books and papers. A 14-1b. sledge-hammer, a smaller hammer, a brace and two bits, three steel punches, a tool known as a "drift," and two pieces of wire, one of which had a kind of screw on it, by which it is believed the office door was opened, were left in the office by the offenders. The tools found in the office have been claimed by Messrs. Cousens and Black, engineers, who say they were stolen from their shop in Princes Street South, since the evening of the 20th ultimo, they believe by some person well acquainted with their premises.

He arrived at Coromandel about the 1st ultimo, supposed from Ohinemuri, and had at the time in his possession a dark bay horse, branded W H on near shoulder, fore fetlocks white, which he sold to a Mr. Jones, together with an old saddle and bridle. #### Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

Henry Rudolph De Zastrow is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with having deserted his wife at Dunedin, on the 23rd ultimo. Description: A German, a gardener, about forty years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, very light-brown hair, reddish whiskers and moustache, light blue eyes, short red neck, three upper front teeth wanting; wore blue cloth coat, black cloth vest, light-tweed trousers, black soft felt hat, lace-up boots, silver watch and gold guard with locket. Speaks English fluently.

John Lambert is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with having deserted his wife and two children at Dunedin, about the 1st October, 1875. Description: English, a labourer and bushman, twenty-nine years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, slender build, fair complexion, light sandy hair, clean shaved when last seen, blue eyes, the first joint of the middle finger of one hand wanting. It is believed he has assumed the name "Osbond," and is living with a woman at Waimate, Canterbury District.

#### Inquests.

An inquest was held on the 23rd ultimo, at the Hospital Invercargill, by Henry McCulloch, Esq., Resident Magistrate and Coroner, on the body of a man, name unknown, which was found in a coffin on the Ocean Beach, near Invercargill, on the 21st ultimo. The jury returned an open verdict. Description of deceased: About thirty years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, medium build, small handsome hands and feet, the second back tooth in upper jaw wanting, one of upper front teeth inclined inwards; had on a grey striped crimean shirt with large white common studs, a white knitted under-flannel, and a pair of brown merino socks, all nearly new. There were no marks of violence on the body, which was partly wrapped in a pair of white blankets with a red and black stripe in centre and at ends. The coffin, which was roughly but firmly constructed, was made of American pine, secured by nails, except the lid which was fastened by screws, the seams were tarred, and there were shavings under the head and shoulders, and a piece of board under the feet of deceased. The medical evidence went to show that deceased died about six weeks or two months previous from the bursting of an abscess in the left lung. It is supposed that deceased, who did not appear to be a working man, died on board ship, was buried at sea, and washed ashore. It is requested that inquiry may be made at the various seaports.

#### Missing Friends.
