### Incendiarism.

On the evenings of the 3rd and 7th instant, a gorse fence at Ashburton Forks, Canterbury District, the property of George Church, was wilfully set on fire in several places, by some person or persons at present unknown.

ABOUT 3 p.m. on the 3rd instant, the dwelling of Cornelius Flynn, situate on the farm of Mrs. Stevenson, East Taieri, Otago District, was discovered on fire by which it and all it contained were destroyed. At an inquest held on the 6th instant, by James Fulton, Esq., Resident Magistrate and Coroner, to inquire as to the cause of the origin of the fire, the following verdict was returned: "That there is not sufficient evidence to show directly how the fire originated, but there is, in the opinion of the jury, circumstances of grave suspicion against Charles Edward Lloyd, which will justify the police in taking further proceedings in a Court of law." Lloyd is Irish, 26 years of age, 6 feet high, slight build, sallow complexion, dark brown hair, small whiskers, chin shaved, smart active appearance; usually wears grey tweed suit. He is at present employed managing Mrs. Stevenson's farm.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

**OBSTRUCTION PLACED ON THE MOSGIEL AND OUTRAM RAILWAY.—£500 REWARD.**

WHEREAS on the 18th instant, the train which left Mosgiel at 3 p.m. for Outram, Otago District, encountered near the siding at North Taieri an obstruction consisting of an iron spike 4 inches long, which some evil-disposed person or persons had driven between the main rail and one of the points:

**OBSTRUCTION PLACED ON THE DUNEDIN AND CLUTHA RAILWAY.—£250 REWARD.**

JAMES McMILLAN is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, on the 7th instant, at Waipawa, Hawke's Bay District, of fifteen £1 notes, and two cheques for £10 15s., the moneys of Henry Berthie Reed. Description: Irish, speaks with a strong Northern accent, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 10 or 11 inches high, slight build, clean shaved, except small light brown moustache; wore dark tweed coat and vest, light tweed trousers with dark stripes on seams, and drab wideawake hat. He was employed as rate collector for the Waipawa County Council up to the day he committed the larceny. He was intrusted with a letter, addressed to the manager of the Bank, containing the money, with which he absconded. He cashed the cheques at Waipawa and Te Aute. He is supposed to have come to Wellington.

### House-Breaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

JAMES CALLIGHAN is charged, on warrant, with having stolen, on the 7th instant, from the person of Thomas J. McManus, in Miller's Hotel, Tinui, Wellington District, two pocketbooks, containing a cheque for £37 10s., supposed on the Bank of New Zealand, drawn by David Hunter, Porangahau, on Bethune

and Hunter, Wellington, and £6 in notes and silver. Description: A baker, about 5 feet 7 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, black hair, clean shaved, except black moustache. No further particulars have been furnished.

ROBERT EDWARDS, *alias* ROPATA, is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with having stolen, on the 5th instant, from the shop of Robert Somerville, at Hastings, Hawke's Bay District, a cheque for £7 1s., since recovered, having been cashed by the offender. Description: A half-caste Maori, speaks very good English, twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, very large eyes, unusually long eyelashes; wore pilot coat, new straw hat, which is a little too large, and is padded inside the lining. He left Napier for Galatea, between Taupo and Tauranga, supposed for the purpose of getting married. He was seen at Tarawera on the 10th instant.

Identifiable. Two sailors, names unknown, belonging to the ship "Columbus," suspected. Second, Dutch, twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, dark hair, beard, and moustache, cheeks shaved.

Description: English, twenty-nine years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, no hair on face except black moustache; wore light tweed suit and hard black felt hat. **A POLICE STATION** has been formed at Amberley, in the Canterbury District; and the Police Station at Leithfield, in the same district, has been broken up.

**A MAN**, who gave his name as James McGregor, which may be fictitious, was, on the 8th instant, committed for trial at the sittings of the Supreme Court, to be held at Napier about the middle of December next, for rape and bestiality committed at Hampden, in the Hawke's Bay District, on the 4th and 7th instant. Description: A native of Scotland, an engine-driver, twenty-seven years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, sandy hair and moustache, swarthy complexion, brown eyes, roman nose; tattoo marks—CHA, shield, and US on right arm, a cross and several small marks on left arm middle finger of right hand wanting. He is a stranger in the Hawke's Bay District, and from his appearance and demeanour it is supposed he has committed other crimes. Immediate inquiries should be made, and if the offender was previously convicted, or is wanted for any other offences, particulars should be furnished with the least possible delay to the Inspector of Police at Napier, and also to this office.

**DURING** the night of the 3rd or the morning of the 4th instant, at Russell, Auckland District, a horse, the property of John Prior, was maliciously wounded in the left side, supposed with a knife.
