On the morning of the 8th ultimo the shop of Edward B. Larkin, painter and paperhanger, Wansbeck Street, Oamaru, was discovered on fire, by which it and two adjoining shops to which the fire extended were destroyed. At an inquest held on the 30th ultimo to inquire as to the cause of the origin of the fire, the following verdict was returned—namely, "That the fire had been wilfully caused, but by whom there is no evidence to show. Larkin's stock was insured largely in excess of its value.

£20 REWARD.

WHEREAS James Lyons, an important witness in the case of James and Patrick McMenamin, charged with arson, having failed to appear to give evidence at the Resident Magistrate's Court at Invercargill, on the 5th of May, 1879, and whereupon a warrant was issued for the arrest of the said James Lyons:

This is to notify that a reward of £20 is offered for such information as may be given to the police that shall lead to the arrest of the said James Lyons.

Description of James Lyons: Forty-six years of age, 5 feet 8½ inches high, stout square build, brown hair, whiskers, and moustache, grey eyes, flat nose, native of Ireland, a labourer, has been in the army and through the Maori war. Last heard of on the 9th ultimo, about five miles from Tapanui.

Particular marks: The name "Mary Murphy," also "anchor and star," tattooed on right arm.

Lyons was seen about three weeks ago at the Haast Pass, on his way to Westland.

On the morning of the 19th ultimo two stones were found placed on the rails of the railway line about half a mile from the Bluff Station.

EDWARD WILLIAM BENNETT is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with wilfully and maliciously breaking a window with a stone, and damaging trees to the value of £1, at Napier, on the 27th ultimo; the property of Major Slingsby Bell. Description: English, a gardener, about forty-eight years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair and whiskers mixed with grey, chin shaved, two or three front teeth wanting, impediment in speech; wore grey-tweed suit and white-felt hat.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

GEORGE DELL is charged, on warrant issued by the Ashburton Bench, with stealing, on the 26th of May last, from the hut of John McGuire, at Orari, a new tent, made of white drill and unbleached calico; value £1 15s. Identifiable. Description: Supposed English, a labourer, about forty or forty-five years of

age, 5 feet 10 inches high, stout build, fair complexion, sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache, round-shouldered and knock-kneed; wore grey-tweed suit, soft black-felt hat, and water-tight boots. He at one time kept an hotel in Christchurch.

JOHN WILLHOFF is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with stealing, on the 26th ultimo, from the dwelling of Robert Ings, at Tomahawk Valley, a saddle with one girth, a very strong nearly-new bridle, and a light-grey mackintosh coat, with brown buttons; one button off; value £5. Identifiable. Description: A German, but speaks good English, a labourer, nineteen years of age, 6 feet high, stout build, fair complexion and hair, small fair beard, whiskers, and moustache, broad face, small eyes, and flat nose.

STOLEN on the 3rd instant, from a bedroom in the Captain Cook Hotel, King Street, Dunedin, an oval-shaped gold brooch, about 2 by 1½ inches, carbuncle in centre, fancy work all round, gold pendant carbuncle and fringe, value £12; an oval-shaped locket-brooch, about 1½ by 1¼ inches, large leaf in centre, a rose on each end, a thistle on one side and a shamrock on the other, value £8; and two sixpences; the property of John Scott. Brooches identifiable.

STOLEN on the 26th ultimo, from the person of John Eddie, at Napier, an open-face gold lever watch, maker George White, Glasgow, "Presented to Alexander Wilson, Surgeon, Whitbourne, 1840," on inside of case; a curb-pattern gold Albert chain, with large gold seal set in cairngorm stone attached; value £30. Suspicion attached to Samuel Lupton, English, a tailor, about thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, medium build, sallow complexion, sharp features, dark-brown hair, whiskers, and moustache, chin shaved; had been in the army.

STOLEN on the 29th ultimo, from the Imperial Hotel, Princes Street, Dunedin, a brown-silk umbrella with brown handle, and a greenish-brown-speckled waterproof-coat with light-buff velvet collar and drab buttons, flap pockets—two on right side and one on left—in which were a wooden pipe and a black oil-cloth umbrella cover; the property of Edward Thomas Collinson; value £2 5s. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 28th ultimo, from an hotel at Kowai Pass, a new black-and-white check-pattern overcoat, with belt, two outside pockets, and an inside breast pocket; the property of John McKenzie; value £3. Identification doubtful.

STOLEN between the 22nd and 30th ultimo, from a bedroom in Moore's dining-rooms, Willis Street, Wellington, a grey Crimean shirt, "Thresher and Glenny, 135, Strand," on a piece of calico at neck; the property of Frank Hamilton Watson; value 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 23rd ultimo, from a bedroom in the Commercial Hotel, Port Chalmers, a ladies' plain gold keeper ring; the property of Catherine Penclion; value 12s. 6d. Identification doubtful. Suspicion attached to a Mrs. O'Connor or O'Connell, who lives near Blueskin. Description: Irish, forty years of age, fresh complexion, brown hair, light-blue eyes; wore blue- serge dress.

STOLEN on the 15th ultimo, from the person of John Donovan, while drunk at Auckland, a silver lever Geneva hunting watch, a slight indent in front case, and a thick brass-mounted hair guard; value £4. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 26th ultimo, from the Congregational School, Manchester Street, Christchurch, two boys' ulster overcoats, one dark-blue cloth, the other dark grey, both of rough knotted

material like Irish frieze, with brown bone buttons, a large and a small button on the belt of one, the lining of one of the sleeves of the other ripped and re-sewn with long stitches; the property of Marion Dunlop; value £2. Identifiable.

THE overcoat, the property of Alfred Wakeford, stolen from the Bank Hotel, has been recovered, and traced to the possession of John Connell, who has been arrested by Probationary Detective Arthur Warren, Wellington Police, and sentenced to eight weeks' labour.

DURING the night of the 24th ultimo an attempt was made to break into the shop of Edward Wayte, Queen Street, Auckland.

BETWEEN the 1st of March last and 7th ultimo, the dwelling of James B. Wilson, Waimakariri Gorge, was broken into and the following stolen: Three pairs of twill sheets, two pairs of grey blankets, five white-cotton table-covers, a scarlet-and-black table-cover, a blue-cloth double-breasted coat, and a nearly-new double-rein bridle; value £8 5s. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 5th ultimo, from the dwelling of John Dunsmuir, at Whangarei, two £5 notes.

Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Henry Shirley, a native of Napier, a billiard-marker, about twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, slight build, dark hair, usually clean-shaved, sallow complexion, scar on bridge of nose, which is broken; peculiar walk as if his leg had been broken; generally wears black clothes and white shirt. Identifiable.

Identifiable. Suspicion attached to William Watson, Scotch, a labourer, thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, sandy hair, whiskers, and moustache. He has gone to Green Island.

Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

CORNELIUS VON HOOGENDORF is charged, on warrant issued by the Masterton Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, on the 27th ultimo, at Taratahi, of a life-saving black-waterproof coat, which can be inflated by blowing in a hole in the left breast, pockets closed by pulling a string, and a pair of leggings; the property of William Benjamin Campion; value £2. Identifiable. Description: A Belgian, a ship cook, thirty-two years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, stout build, dark complexion and eyes, dark-brown hair, beard and moustache, cheeks shaved; wore dark cross-bar tweed coat and vest, moleskin trousers, new soft black hat with high crown, and watertight boots; tattoo marks on one arm. It is supposed he has come to Wellington.

HENRY CURTIN, *alias* Kelly, is charged, on warrant issued by the Bull's Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, at Bull's, on the 18th ultimo, of sixteen £1 notes; the property of William Mills. Description: A native of London, a labourer, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, dark-brown hair inclined to curl, clean-shaved except light-coloured moustache, prominent eyes with a slight cast in one, smart active appearance, flag and anchor tattooed on arms; wears a new silver hunting watch, with the following inscription on inside: "Made expressly for E. E. Metard, Palmerston, N.Z.," and a new rope-pattern silver chain. He usually works in the bush, but has not the appearance of a labourer. He is known in the Patea District, and it is said that he was employed about a year ago in the *New Zealander* Newspaper Office, Wellington.

DAVID MASON, charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee of a gun, &c., the property of James Inglis, has been arrested by Detective Patrick Quinn, Hokitika Police.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with stealing, on the 28th ultimo, from the railway station, Dunedin, a black-leather bag, 12 by 9 inches, with clasp and strap, pocket outside, containing a brown-leather purse, two £5 notes, a £1 note, 6s. in silver, a memorandum-book with a name written on the first page and chemical notes written with a pencil, a small pocket-diary with blue cover, a white-linen collar, and a white pocket-handkerchief; the property of Robert Neil. Identifiable, except the money. Description: About 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build; wore brown overcoat, light-coloured trousers, and hard felt hat; has a wooden leg.

Description: English, a ploughman and carter, twenty-six years of age, about 5 feet 7 inches high, slight build, dark complexion, dark hair and beard worn short, no moustache, pleasing appearance. THOMAS WATERWORTH is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with failing to provide his wife and two children with adequate means of support at Christchurch since about the 7th of May last. Description: A native of Preston, England, a carpenter, fifty-three years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, medium build, dark hair, whiskers, and moustache turning grey, chin shaved, slovenly appearance, fond of drink.

JOHN VAUGHAN is charged, on warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench, with deserting his wife at Ngapara since March last.
