### Supposed Murder.

£350 REWARD.

WHEREAS on the 6th of August, 1879, a man named George Vennell was missed from his home on the New Brighton Road, near Christchurch, and has not since been heard of: And whereas, from inquiries made, it is now believed that the said George Vennell has been murdered:

Notice is hereby given that a reward of £100—viz., £50 supplemental to that offered in notice dated 11th September last—will be paid to any person who shall give such information as will lead to the discovery of the missing man or his body; and, in the event of a murder having been committed, a further reward of £250 will be given for such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the guilty party.

In addition to the above rewards, His Excellency the Governor will be advised to extend a free pardon to any accomplice not being the person who actually committed the murder, and who shall first give such required information.

Description of the missing man when last seen: Age, about sixty years; height, about 5 feet 5 or 6 inches; build, stout; hair and whiskers grey, the latter small, no moustache or beard,

nearly all the face being clean-shaved; wore old faded pea-jacket, corduroy trousers, and usually a black billycock hat; an Englishman, a gardener.

Particulars: On the 15th of August the police examined Vennell's house, and found a pane of glass broken in the kitchen window, a number of shot holes in the wall opposite the broken pane, and several small spots of blood on the wall and furniture. The table was found laid as if for tea, and a pot containing meat was on the fireplace. The following property is missing from the house, namely: A pair of new white blankets, a pair of sheets, marked "Vennell, No. 5, 1876," and "Vennell, No. 6, 1876;" a kerosene lamp with coloured delf globe, a small common money-box with two slits in lid, a mahogany box, about 6 by 4 by 2 inches, lid inlaid with mother-of-pearl; a black mackintosh coat, and a pair of reins. Some of the articles missing were seen in the house on the 11th and 14th August. He had about £9 in his possession on the 5th of August, but no money has been found in the house. He separated about six months ago from his wife, who resided in Christchurch with her son by a former husband, between whom and the missing man great enmity existed. Some pieces of an old blanket which belonged to Vennell were found by the police in the river near his house, and the result of an analysis goes to show that they are stained with what is believed to be human blood, and were, it is supposed, used in cleaning the house after the man was murdered. A large stain of human blood, supposed about a quart, has been found on a sandhill about 150 yards from Vennell's house, and the sand at the place presented the appearance as if the body of a man had been laid down there. A piece of brown paper, stained with blood, and which appears to have been used in wiping blood—probably from the hands—has been found in a gorse fence about a chain from the house. The circumstances go to show that Vennell has been murdered, and that his body has been carefully concealed or otherwise disposed of.

*Offer of Pardon to Accomplice in case of Murder.*

NOTICE.—Whereas a person of the name of George Vennell, of New Brighton Road, near Christchurch, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, has mysteriously disappeared, and there are reasons for supposing that he may have been murdered by some person or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that, should the said George Vennell have been murdered, His Excellency the Governor will grant a free pardon to any person implicated in such murder, except the actual murderer, who shall give such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the murderer or murderers.

SETTING fire to a house at Matura, the property of Donald McKay, which was insured in excess of its value: Donald McKay, Frank Whiddon, and Duncan Cameron have been arrested for this offence by Detective James Joseph Tuohy and Constable Henry Fretwell, Invercargill and Matura Police, remanded, and bail refused.

**Offences Not Otherwise Described.**

EGERTON NEMIS is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, on the 9th of June last, at Christchurch, forged the name of George Reeves, of Heathcote Valley, to a promissory note for £15, which he uttered to Michael Murphy, by whom it was discounted. Description: English, about thirty years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, black hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache; wore blue coat, brown-moleskin trousers, and black soft-felt hat; well educated. He kept a flax-mill at Kaiapoi some years ago; had been employed by Grant D. Dennis, surveyor, Oamaru, as a field-hand, and latterly acted as clerk and time-keeper at the new bridge, near Amberley. It is said that his father died recently at or near Auckland.

DENIS ANGLIN, charged on warrant with failing to appear at the Supreme Court, Dunedin, on the 6th of January last, to answer to a charge of perjury, has been arrested by Detective L. D. Benjamin, Christchurch Police, and remanded to Dunedin.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with having indecently assaulted Jane Anderson, aged twelve years, at the Ocean Beach, near Dunedin, at 5.30 p.m. on the 25th ultimo. Description: About twenty-seven years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, slight build, pale complexion, dark-brown hair, small dark goatee, squints with left eye; wore dark suit, silver albert guard, and crape round left arm. Identifiable.

ABOUT 9.15 a.m. on the 24th ultimo the Dunedin North express train encountered an obstruction at Sealiff, consisting of a trolley-spragg, which caused the leading wheels of the engine to go off the line. It is believed that the spragg was negligently left there by Henry Cossey and Henry Wilson, who are employed keeping the line in repair.

A MAN named Cleary is charged, on warrant issued by the Onehunga Bench, with having wilfully exposed his person on two or three occasions to females on the Beach Road, Onehunga, on the 31st ultimo. Description: Irish, a gardener, about fifty-four years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, dark-brown hair, short brown beard mixed with grey, red nose, blotched dirty-looking face; wore black frock-coat, dark-grey tweed trousers, and hard round black-felt hat; had been in the 58th Regiment.

CHARLES STEINMETZ is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having obtained goods and money, value £7, from John Steinmetz, on the 10th instant, at Christchurch, by means of a valueless cheque. Description: A German, an actor, about twenty-four years of age, about 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, fair hair parted in centre, small fair moustache, cheeks shaved, blue eyes; wore blue shooting-coat, tight-fitting light-tweed trousers, black billycock hat, and Oxford shoes. He was playing with the Lingard Opera Company in Christchurch, and may endeavour to rejoin the company, which is at present in Wellington.

**Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, and from Dwellings.**

THOMAS HISLOP, charged on warrant with stealing an overcoat and sealskin cap from the Glasgow Piehouse, Dunedin, the property of James Allan Nicol, has been arrested by Constable Thomas King, Oamaru Police, and remanded to Dunedin.

JOHN F. WILLHOFF is charged, on warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench, with stealing, during the night of the 31st ultimo, from a dwelling at Big Hill, Pebblestown, four £5 notes, a £1 note, two two-shilling pieces (a small piece cut off one), a threepenny piece, 2½d. in copper, and a pair of striped-moleskin trousers; the property of Frank Barber. Trousers and the two-shilling piece with piece off identifiable. Description: A German, a clerk and labourer, nineteen years of age, 5 feet 9½ inches high, fresh complexion, fair hair, small fair moustache, large nose and mouth, large scar on right side near armpit. He was sentenced to seven days' labour on the 24th of July last, at Dunedin, for larceny, and on the 31st of same month to twenty-eight days' labour for embezzlement. #### Horse and Cattle Stealing.

##### CONDITIONS FOR TROUT FISHING IN OTAGO.

##### HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Governor doth hereby make the following regulations for the District of Otago:—

1. Any holder of a license may fish with rod and line for trout in all the streams and lakes within and forming the boundaries of the following district (except the Water of Leith), from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, both inclusive, viz.:—

All that area in the Provincial District of Otago bounded on the East and South by the ocean, from Shag Point to the mouth of the Mataura River; on the West, South-west, and South by the Mataura River and the Counties of Southland and Wallace; on the North-west by the ocean; and on the North, North-west, and North-east by the Counties of Westland and Waitaki.

2. Any holder of a license may fish with rod and line for trout in the Water of Leith, in the months of November, December, January, and February next ensuing.

3. Licenses to fish with rod and line in the above-described district will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatisation Society of Dunedin, and for every license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged.

4. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with rod and line.

5. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any ranger, police officer, or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, ranger, police officer, or constable his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length taken by any person fishing as aforesaid shall be immediately returned alive to the water, and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

7. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any lake, river, or stream within the above-described district, and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

8. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed, into any lake, river, or stream in the said district, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

9. These regulations shall come into force as from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

##### CONDITIONS FOR TROUT FISHING IN SOUTHLAND.

##### HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby make the following regulations for the District of Southland:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations shall come in force as from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. Any holder of a license, as hereinafter mentioned, may fish with rod and line for trout in all the streams and lakes within and forming the boundaries of the district bounded on the East by the Mataura River, on the North by the County of Lake, and on the West and South by the sea from Bligh Sound to the mouth of the River Mataura, from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, excepting in the Rivers Oreti and Aparima, and their affluents.

3. Licenses to fish with rod and line within the said boundaries will be issued under the hand of the Secretary to the Southland Acclimatisation Society at Invercargill, and for every license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged.

4. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with rod and line.

5. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any ranger, police officer, or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, police officer, or constable, his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length taken by any person fishing as aforesaid shall be immediately returned alive to the water, and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

7. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any lake, river, or stream within the above district, and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

8. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed, into any lake, river, or stream within the above district, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.
