On the morning of the 31st ultimo an unoccupied house at Tapanui, the property of George Woods, was maliciously set on fire, but the fire was discovered and extinguished before any damage was done. The house was not insured.

Sunedin

On the morning of the 22nd ultimo, at Toi Tois, Southland, a stack of wheat and a stack of oats, value £50, the property of Philip Vincent, were maliciously set on fire, by which they were desta ved. 4

On the morning of the 4th instant, a straw shed in Sydney Street, Wellington, occupied by Terence Gormley, was discovered on fire, which damaged the shed, a cab, and oaten hay to the extent of £50. It is supposed that the fire was wilfully caused. The property was not insured.

DURING the night of the 26th ultimo, at Limestone Plains, five stacks of oats, value £90, the property of Thomas Gilmour, were destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was wilfully caused. The stacks were insured.

#### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

NEWTON H. ALLUM is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, on the 2nd February last, at Christchurch, induced Edward George to accept a bill for £20 by false pretences. Description: English, a clerk, about twenty-four years of age, 5 feet 4 inches high, medium build, very sallow complexion, thin fair hair, small fair whiskers, and moustache, good address; usually wears blue-serge suit and small quilted grey-tweed hat. He was last heard of at E. A. Fields, Seafield, near Ashburton.

ABOUT 1 o'clock on the morning of the 29th ultimo a man, name unknown, was found in the dwelling of John Graham, Stuart Street, Dunedin. Description: Short stout build; wore dark clothes, and it is supposed had his face blackened.

ABOUT 10 a.m. on the 31st ultimo the points of the Ocean Beach Railway-line, near the Forbury Racecourse, were wil-fully altered, which caused the 10.30 a.m. passenger train from Dunedin to Forbury to run off the rails of the line.

On the morning of the 31st ultimo a sleeper was maliciously placed across the rails of the railway-line near Waipahi, which threw two of the ballast engine trucks off the line, one of which was broken. A workman employed on the line suspected.

HENRY WATKINS is charged, on warrant issued by the Fryerstown Bench, Victoria, with having, on the 5th July last, at Fryerstown, committed rape on Mary Ann Ryan, his step-daughter, under twelve years of age. Description : A native of Gloucestershire, a miner, thirty-four years of age, 5 feet 4 or 5 inches high, stout build, about 12 stone weight, sallow com-

plexion, brown hair, small light whiskers and moustache, blue eyes, very large mouth, very short legs, wadding gait; wears dark paget coat, plaid trousers and vest, black wideawake hat, and large silver neck watch-chain. He is foud of frequenting publichouses and billiard-rooms. He will likely seek employment as a miner. It is supposed he has come to this colony or gone to Tasmania.

# Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

JOHN STRANN, alias Strain, charged on wargant with stealing a watch from the person of Joseph Dougal, at Boundary Creek, has been arrested by the Wanganui Police, remainded to Oamaru, and committed for trial.

Tux warrant issued for the arrest of Margaret Roach, charged with stealing a ladies' jacket from the dwelling of her mother, Mary Roach, at Oamaru, has been withdrawn.

STOLEN on the 12th instant, from the shop of Charles Broadbent, at Carterton, a silver albert watch-chain, long curb-link pattern, yellow stone set in silver and a silver watch-key attached; value £1 10s. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to a man named Jagger, who was in the shop during Mr. Broadbent's absence. Description : English, twenty-five years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, whiskers, and moustache, no beard; wears dark-grey tweed suit and soft grey-felt hat; carries a small black bag with steel mounting. He had until lately been employed as an operator in the Wellington Telegraphic Office, but he is now travelling for an insurance company.

It is supposed they have gone to Rangitikei.
