Incendiarism.

ON the morning of the 10th instant, at Taratahi, a seven-roomed wooden house, furniture, &c., the property of James Driscoll, was destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was wilfully caused. The house was insured in the Colonial Office for £250, and the furniture, &c., in the New Zealand Office for £100.

BETWEEN 6 and 8 p.m. on the 8th instant a two-roomed wooden house, at Corsterphine, near Caversham, the property of William Ferrie, was maliciously set on fire, by which it was destroyed. On the morning of the 11th instant his cowshed at the same place was found on fire, but the fire was extinguished before much damage was done.

BETWEEN 5 and 6 p.m. on the evening of the 27th ultimo an unoccupied four-roomed wooden house, a dairy, and a cart-house, at Albert Road, New Plymouth, the property of Samuel

Alexander, were destroyed by fire. At an inquest held on the 1st instant to inquire as to the cause of the fire, the following verdict was returned: "That the houses were wilfully set on fire by some person or persons unknown." The houses were insured for £150.

ABOUT 11 p.m. on the 7th instant, the blacksmith- and wheelwright-shops of Swann and Company, at Hamilton East, were discovered on fire, by which they were destroyed. At an inquest held on the 13th instant, the following verdict was returned: "There is no evidence to show how the fire originated, but we are of opinion that it was an act of incendiarism." The property destroyed was valued at £500, and was insured in the South British Office for £200.

AT 8.15 p.m. on the 15th instant, at the farm of the School of Agriculture, Lincoln, four stacks of hay, value £150, the property of the Government, were maliciously set on fire, by which they were destroyed. The hay was not insured.

ABOUT the 26th ultimo, an unsuccessful attempt was made to set fire to an unoccupied two-roomed wooden house at Taradale, the property of Richard Hollis. Kerosene oil was found spilt on the floor and walls of the house, and a fire made in one of the rooms, which appeared to have died out of its own accord. The house was insured in the Union Office for £80, which is more than both house and land are worth. Richard Hollis, the owner, was arrested for the offence by Detective Martin Grace, Napier Police, but was discharged for want of sufficient evidence.

MAURICE KANE, charged with having obtained money by false pretences from James Hume, at Ashburton, has been arrested by Sergeant Percy Carlyon, Temuka Police.

JOHN WILLIAMS is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with having, on the 6th instant, and on other days, obtained goods and money, value £3 10s., from James Johnstone, at Napier, by false pretences. Description: English, a station labourer, about fifty years of age, about 5 feet 8 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, whiskers, and moustache, tinged with grey; wore dark-tweed suit and black-felt hat.

W. A. BAKER, charged with having obtained goods and money, value £3, from Peter Connolly, at Lyttelton, by means of a valueless cheque, has been arrested by Detective Alexander Henderson, Dunedin Police.

STEWART GILL, charged with having embezzled money, the property of William Adamson, has been arrested by Constable William Streat, Milton Police, and remanded to Invercargill.

JAMES DEANS is charged, on warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench, with fraudulent bankruptcy, committed at Oamaru on the 7th instant. Description: English, a farmer, twenty-eight years of age, 5 feet 8½ inches high, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, very thin light beard, whiskers, and moustache, thin features, a lump about the size of a pea behind left ear. He left Oamaru about the 20th ultimo for Dunedin, and was seen at Shag Valley about the 12th instant. John Clarke, a bushman at Blueskin, is married to a niece of his, and he may go there. He spoke of going to the Cape of Good Hope.

ALEXANDER BIMLER is charged, on warrant issued by the Ashburton Bench, with having, on the 16th February, 1879, at Wheatstone, obtained £1 6s. 6d. from George Willecocks by false pretences. Description: Scotch, a labourer, about forty-four years of age, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, slight build, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair, sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache, broad Scotch accent; wore old dark-tweed coat, light-tweed trousers and vest, and black billycock hat. He was seen in Ashburton on the 26th ultimo.

FORGED Union Bank of Australia £10 and £5 notes.—It has been ascertained that John McGarrigle is in no way connected with the American Permanent Photograph Company of Oxford Street, Sydney, as represented by him.

BETWEEN 8.30 and 11 a.m. on the 6th instant ten stones were maliciously placed on the rails of the Picton and Blenheim railway line at Koromiko. It is supposed that the stones were placed there by boys who live in the neighbourhood.

CHARLES PAUL, charged on warrant with having obtained two horses and a saddle and bridle from W. H. Taggart, at Dunedin, by false pretences, was seen at Wellington on the 2nd instant. He said he intended to open a fishmonger's shop.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

STOLEN about the 13th instant from Cavendish House, Sydney Street, Wellington, a grey overcoat, a large outside-pocket on each side with a small pocket above them, and an inside breast-pocket; the pockets contained a pair of brown-kid gloves with sealskin fur round wrists and steel-spring band-fasteners, and a railway pass; the property of the Hon. J. Paterson; value £2 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 10th instant from the shop-door of Ho Kum, Fleet Street, Dunedin, a boys' pair of lace-up boots, No. 13; value 6s. 9d. Identifiable.

ALL the watches, except the silver hunting lever No. 64445, stolen from the shop of John Nelson, at Dunedin, have been recovered, and traced to the possession of John and Isabella Thomas and John Dutton, who have been arrested by Detectives Alexander Henderson and Robert Bain, Dunedin Police.

STOLEN on the 17th instant, from the person of John Campion, while drunk, at Christchurch, a silver hunting lever watch, No. 39116, maker Urquhart, Christchurch, whose name is on dial; value £7. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who was drinking with complainant. Description: Supposed English, about thirty-three years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, light-brown hair, light-brown or sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache.

STEALING from the shop-doors of the New Zealand Clothing Company, Thomas Austin, Walker, Smith, and Co., and Daniel Maher.—A boy named William R. Bradley has been arrested by Constable Hugh Beaumont, Lyttelton Police, for these offences, ordered to be whipped, and his father bound over in £25 for his future good behaviour. The two umbrellas, the red-knitted muffler, and three pairs of stockings have been recovered by the police.

STOLEN on the 22nd instant from the bedroom of James Whately, in Mrs. Thompson's boarding-house, Willis Street, Wellington, a double-breasted black-pilot cloth overcoat, black-horn buttons, three outside pockets and an inside left-breast

pocket, a hole burnt in left-skirt pocket, a red stain on front corner of left skirt; value £2. Identifiable. John Davis, *alias* John Patrick Davis, suspected. (For description see *Police Gazette*, 1878, page 100.)

STOLEN on the 9th instant, from a bedroom in the All Nation's Hotel, New Rush, near Greymouth, a silver lever hunting watch, No. 18947, maker's name not known, plain silver Albert guard attached; the property of Jacomo Ilneste; value £4 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 20th instant, from the whare of John Ritchie, at Upper Tauheru, near Alfredton, a blue-rip dress-coat with small ticket pockets on outside, a greyish-woollen ulster overcoat with straps at back, a hard black-felt hat with high crown, size 6½, a German-silver spur, three teeth bent in roller, and 15s. in silver. Identifiable, except the money. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, about thirty years of age, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, long thin features, fair whiskers, and short moustache; wore dark coat, light trousers, light boots without tacks or heel-plates, and supposed to be wearing the stolen ulster and hat. He was riding a bay horse with fore-shoes only, long body and tail, looked like a coach-horse, and went in the direction of Eketahuna and Woodville.

STOLEN between the 14th and 21st instant, from a tent at Awamoa, near Oamaru, a dark-tweed sac-coat, side pockets with flaps, and an inside breast pocket; the property of Alexander Falconer; value £3. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to William Dumas, thirty years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, dark hair inclined to curl, with full light beard. He occupied the tent from which the coat was stolen.

THE gold open-face watch stolen from the dwelling of Margaret Jfwerren, at Christchurch, has been recovered. It was found in the possession of John Thomas when arrested by Detective Robert Bain, Dunedin Police, for housebreaking, &c.

STOLEN about the 20th ultimo, from the Prince of Wales Hotel, Christchurch, a nearly-new dark-tweed waterproof overcoat, with black-cloth buttons, in the pockets of which were a pair of scarlet knitted cuffs, a pair of black-kid driving gloves, and a tartan-woollen scarf; the property of John Fox; value £2 12s.

STOLEN about the 24th September last, from a bedroom in the Imperial Hotel, Dunedin, an opal scarf-pin; value £1; since recovered; the property of Thomas F. Johnson. Edward Lanning, who was employed as a waiter in the hotel, pawned the pin at Dunedin on the 24th September last, but Mr. Johnson declines to prosecute him. Description: A Londoner, a cook and waiter, thirty-three years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, black hair, clean shaved except dark moustache; usually wears black overcoat with black-fur collar and cuffs. It is said that he has come to Wellington.

STOLEN on the 7th instant, from the dwelling of Mrs. Archibald St. Clair, Manners Street, Wellington, a gold scarf-pin, head made of part of a broach formed like two leaves; and a gold-and-ivory shirt-stud, gold shank; value 7s. 6d. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to John Hellis, *alias* James Johnson, *alias* Elson, *alias* Harris. (For description see *Police Gazette*, 1880, page 121.)

STOLEN on the 25th ultimo, from the person of William Moore, at Awahuri, a red-leather pocketbook, containing four £1 notes, and a cheque for £2 drawn by H. S. Palmerston on the Bank of New Zealand, Palmerston North, and indorsed by Maurice, Samuails, and Co.; and a white-cotton handkerchief. The cheque was cashed on the 7th instant, at the store of Messrs. London, Haybittle, and Co., Feilding, for a person of whom no description can be given.

STOLEN about the 7th instant, from the tent of John Bain, at Coleman's Camp, Piako Swamp, three £1 notes, about ten shillings in silver, and a few pence in copper.

IT has been ascertained that the watch reported stolen from the hut of Avin Gill, near Kihikihiki, was not stolen, but was sold by Gill in January last. It is an imitation-gold watch.

STOLEN about the 12th instant, from the dwelling of the Rev. Father Walsh, Rattray Street, Dunedin, a round oil stock about 3 inches long, marked IBC, three compartments; two briar-wood pipes with straight stems and amber mouth-pieces; and a large meerschaum pipe, slightly coloured, straight stem, and amber mouthpiece; value £3 10s. Identifiable.

On the 13th instant the hut of Samuel Shepherd, at Lyttelton, was broken into, and the following stolen: A dark-tweed sac coat with three outside pockets each fastened with a button, a crimean shirt, three white singlets, a light-brown-striped vest, and 5s. 6d. in silver; value £2. Clothing identifiable.

STOLEN during the night of the 6th instant, from the dwelling of James Friend, South Town Belt, Christchurch, a volume of the "Life and Travels of President Grant," a brown turkish towel may be marked "T. Dixon," a white comb about 7 inches long by 2 inches wide, about 7 lb. roast beef, and a loaf of bread; value £1 13s. Book identifiable; identification of towel doubtful. Suspicion attached to Richmond B. Page, who was staying in the house. Description: English, about twenty-three years of age, about 5 feet 7 inches high, stout build, fair hair and complexion, clean-shaved except small fair moustache; wore brown pepper-and-salt single-breasted sac suit; fond of drink. He arrived at Lyttelton from England about the 15th ultimo by the ship "Ashbred." It is supposed he has gone to Hokitika, where he will likely seek employment in a wholesale wine and spirit store.

STOLEN between the 3rd and 12th instant, from the tent of John Mear, at Mullocky Gully, a pair of blue blankets, a white single blanket, a twill sheet, a pillow and cover filled with pieces of blue cloth, and a tin containing 5 lb. white sugar; value £1 17s. Pillow identifiable.

THE silver watch stolen from the dwelling of Margaret Bowie, at Dunedin, has been recovered, and traced to the possession of John and Isabella Thomas and John Dutton, who have been arrested by Detectives Alexander Henderson and Robert Bain, Dunedin Police. A gold brooch and a pair of earrings, stolen at the same time, but not reported stolen, have also been recovered. These offenders are also charged with several other cases of housebreaking and larceny.

BETWEEN the 10th and 12th instant the shop of William Reid, Tancred Street, Ashburton, was broken into, and a smoothing-plane, with varnish nearly all worn off, "Mathew Muir" stamped thereon, value 5s., and a jack-plane, about half worn, "Philip Williams" stamped thereon, value 5s., stolen. Identifiable.

BETWEEN the 29th March last and the 16th instant the dwelling of Frederick Urry, at Moa Block, Taranaki, was broken into, and a yellow octagon-shaped concertina with ten white-bone keys on each side, wooden box covered with black oilcloth and lined with red paper, leather strap at top, two hinges, and lock and key, stolen; value £2. Identifiable.

Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

JAMES ELLIS is charged, on warrant issued by the Picton Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, on the 14th instant, at Picton, of a nearly-new blue frock coat, diagonal cut; a pair of light-tweed trousers and vest, a white pocket-handkerchief, and a meerscham pipe with silver ferrule; the property of Mrs. Anna Brooks; value £4 10s. Identifiable. Description: English, a sailor and bushman, about thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, stout build, round features, brown complexion, dark-brown hair, sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache, fore-finger of right hand off. May be wearing the stolen coat. It is supposed he has gone to Blenheim or Havelock.

THOMAS ROBINSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with the larceny as a servant, on the 12th instant, at Christchurch, of a diamond ring, in claw setting, value £5; an emerald ring, in claw setting, value £3; and a four-chambered revolver, with patent spring in barrel, which, when pressed, causes the barrel to shoot out, value £2; the property of Samuel Stewart. Emerald ring and revolver identifiable; identification of diamond ring doubtful. Description: A native of Yorkshire, about thirty years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, very fair hair, light-sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache; wore blue-serge sac-coat, brown-tweed trousers and vest with black stripe, and dark-drab felt hat.

THE white blanket, part of the swag the property of Rowland Edwards, stolen off a horse at Te Aute, has been traced to the possession of John Murray, who was arrested for the offence by Constable Denis Brosnahan, Waipawa Police, but was discharged, as the blanket could not be satisfactorily identified.

yellow-brown carpet on top, and a piece of a flour-bag sewn on bottom; two cab-cushions, 2½ feet x 1 foot, covered with green-flowered carpeting; and a near-side cab-lamp, No. 166, plate-glass in front, which is cracked, one side silver-mounted, catch on socket broken off and soldered on again; value £3. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 14th instant, from the porch of the house of Duncan Campbell, Russell Street, Dunedin, a roll of bacon, about 26 lb. weight; value £1 1s. Two bottle-gatherers, who had a spring-cart with them, suspected.

STOLEN about the 18th instant, from the yard of David Asher, Willis Street, Wellington, a white-flannel petticoat, a white-cotton chemise worked with red thread round neck, and two or three old dog chains; value 10s. Chemise identifiable.

Burnside;" a pair of linen drawers, three tucks at bottom, marked "Nellie Burnside;" and three pairs of plain linen drawers, marked E.L.B., L.B., and M.L.B. respectively; value £3. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 16th ultimo, at Grahamstown, a wheelbarrow, "C. Tongue" stamped on body between handles; the property of Maurice Casey; value 15s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 5th instant, at Ngaruawahia, a bag containing 40 lb. of onions; the property of Charles Limmer; value 6s. 3d.

STOLEN on the 10th instant, from a cart in Johnston Street, Wellington, a large Chinese china flower-vase, red, white, and green colour, a triangular piece about 5 in. by 2½ in. broken off top; the property of Valentine Shott; value £2 5s. Identifiable.

STOLEN during the night of the 8th instant, from the coal-house of George Halm, at Caversham, two bags of coal; value 7s. 6d.

STOLEN between the 8th ultimo and 14th instant, from the box of Francis Knowles, on board the ship "Benvenue," between Glasgow and Wellington, or at Wellington, an open-faced silver Geneva watch, crack across dial, part of enamel broken off face at figure X. and filled up with plaster of paris, maker's name and number not known, G.T.K. and some French words engraved on back of inside case; curb-pattern silver chain, with two anna pieces, a fourpenny piece, and a silver penny piece attached; value £3 10s. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Ernest Muirhead, who was an apprentice on board the ship. Description: A native of the colony, eighteen or nineteen years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, pale complexion, blue eyes, prominent nose, fair hair, no hair on face.

STOLEN on the 15th ultimo, at West Melton, Canterbury, a silver hunting lever watch, No. 350067, small round aluminium chain attached; the property of Richard Kemp; value £10 10s. Identifiable. A lad named George Bell, who resides at West Melton, suspected.

STOLEN about the 25th May last, from the verandah of the store of Frederick T. Menkin, Taratahi West, a coil of No. 7 fencing wire, 1 cwt; value £1.

STOLEN on the 1st instant, from the Ashburton Hotel stables, Ashburton, an old saddle, small size, newly lined, patent-leather seat, top of off-pad torn off, new stirrup leathers and old stirrup irons, twisted bullock-hide girth, and an old bridle; the property of John Armstrong; value £4 5s. Saddle identifiable.

STOLEN between the 27th and 30th ultimo, at Naseby, a tin kerosene lamp; the property of the Naseby Municipality; value 7s. 6d. Identification doubtful.

STOLEN about the 9th instant, from the fowlhouse of Alexander Hastie, at Greytown, Otago, five turkey hens, two geese, two game roosters, and a number of hens; value £3. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 7th instant, from off a tramway bridge at Castle Street, Dunedin, a patent tubular kerosene lamp, 18 inches

high, OB marked on globe, which is protected by two tin bars; the property of David Proudfoot; value 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 14th instant, from the yard of Michael Britt, Riddiford Street, Wellington, a small anvil, about 26 lb. weight, nail-marks at bottom; value £1 6s. Identifiable.

STOLEN during the night of the 9th instant, from the fowl-house of James Geddes, at Blueskin, a rooster and three hens; value 9s. 6d. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 10th instant, from Strachan's brewery, Pitt Street, Dunedin, an opera-glass with centre slide, electroplate case lined with green silk, which is worn off the lid, value £1; and a large meerschaum pipe with amber mouthpiece and the figure of a woman reaching from bowl to stem, value £1; the property of Robert Church. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 7th instant, from the Domain, at Ashburton, twelve young trees—*pinus insignis*, *pinus pinaster*, Irish yew, &c.; the property of the Ashburton Domain Board; value £1. Identification doubtful.

THE gig-whip stolen from the trap of Valentine Shott, at the Upper Hut, has been traced to the possession of Jesse O'Kell, who was summoned for the offence and sentenced to fourteen days' labour.

STOLEN about the 19th instant, from the yard of William Richard Callam, Webb Street, Wellington, an oval galvanized-iron bath-tub, 2½ feet long, 20 inches wide, and 14 inches deep; value 10s.

STOLEN on the 15th instant, at King Street, Dunedin, a short-handled coal-shovel with square mouth, partly worn, split at top of handle; the property of George Murdock; value 6s. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 18th instant, from the coach-house of Dr. MacCarthy, at Rangiora, a cross-bar tweed-waterproof overcoat, ventilated at back and armpits, "Box and Co., London," marked on inside; value £5. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 20th instant, at Wanganui, a swag rolled in a piece of canvas, consisting of a nearly-new rug, one side dark-grey, red-and-white stripes on the other side; a red blanket, considerably worn; a pair of elastic-side boots, No. 7 size, about half worn; and two light-check cotton shirts; the property of William Platts; value £1 5s. Identifiable.

STOLEN during the night of the 18th instant, at Campbelltown, Wanganui, three old planks, 15 feet long, 4 by 12 inches; the property of the Wanganui Harbour Board; value 10s.

Horse and Cattle Stealing.

STOLEN on the 17th February last, from a paddock at Tauheru, Wellington District, a draught grey gelding, aged, about 15½ hands high, branded HB on off side of neck under the mane, hind legs stiff; the property of Darley and Knight; value £50. Identifiable. The horse is supposed to be at present working in a dray at the formation of a road at the Waimate Plains. William Thompson, *alias* Darkey Bill (see *Police Gazette*, 1880, page 6), who it is said is working on the road-line, knows the horse.

WILLIAM McCORMACK, charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee, at Rangiora, of a bay gelding, the property of John Brock, left Wellington on the 18th ultimo. He may have gone to Wanganui or New Plymouth.

JAMES WYLIE, charged on warrant with stealing a bay gelding, at Tauranga, the property of David H. M. Bell, is believed to be identical with John Jenkins, charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee, at Masterton, of a horse-brake and three sets of harness; the property of John McDonald. (See *Police Gazette*, 1879, page 133, and 1880, page 73.) Jenkins is also believed to be identical with C. (L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made under "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873," dated the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, it was declared that hares should cease to be deemed game within the Provincial District of Nelson: And whereas it is expedient to amend such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the above-named Act, and by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," do hereby rescind the aforesaid Proclamation, and do proclaim and declare that, from and after the date hereof, hares shall be deemed to be game, and to come within the operation of the said "Protection of Animals Act, 1873."

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty.
