### Infanticide.

ON the morning of the 29th ultimo the body of a newly-born male child, wrapped in a piece of white calico, was found in the coach-yard of Robert Braid, Princes Street South, Dunedin. At an inquest held on the body on the same day, at the Farmers' Arms Hotel, Princes Street, to inquire as to the cause of the child's death, the following verdict was returned: "Wilful murder against some person or persons at present unknown." The cause of death was suffocation, or from cold and exposure.

### Incendiarism.

ABOUT 9 p.m. on the 6th instant, at Grove Town, Blenheim, a stack of oats, a stable, fifty bags of barley, and one hundred empty sacks, the property of William Jones, value £150, were destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was wilfully caused. The property was not insured.

**BURNING** of Enoch Jones's and John Templeton's stables, &c., at Wyndham.—The manager of the New Zealand Insurance Company, Invercargill, guarantees £100 reward for such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the offender or offenders.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with being illegally in the dwelling of Colonel Edward Pearce, Abel Smith Street, Wellington, with his boots off, at 1 o'clock on the morning of the 8th instant. Description: A Dane, a labourer, about thirty-five years of age, 5 feet high, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache; wore dirty grey-tweed suit and soft drab-felt hat. He is supposed to be identical with Andreas Thorson, alias Andrew Torson. (See *Police Gazette*, 1881, page 78.)

JAMES KENNEDY, charged on warrant with embezzling two bridles, &c., the property of James South, has been arrested by Inspector Peter Pender, Timaru Police.

JOHN SYMINGTON is charged, on warrant issued at Christchurch, with embezzling £1 6s., on the 11th instant, at Springfield Road, the money of Henry Knight, by whom he was employed. Description: Scotch, an assistant-butcher, about thirty years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, dark-blue eyes, dark-brown hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache; wore light-tweed suit and soft low black hat.

THOMAS THOMPSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Hawera Bench, with embezzling £1, at Normanby, about the 9th ultimo, the money of his employer, William Lilly England. Description: A Dane, a carter, twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, fair florid complexion, rather large features with rather high cheek-bones, small reddish beard and moustache, cheeks shaved, holds his head down when walking; wore brown-twill suit, vest with sleeves, and light-coloured soft alpine hat with broad brim. He was seen at Inglewood on the 5th instant. It is believed that he formerly lived in the Manawatu District.

ANNIE GIFFEN, aged sixteen years, reports that about 7.30 p.m. on the 17th instant, at Beaumont Road, near Lawrence, she was assaulted by a Chinaman, name unknown, with intent to commit a rape. The girl says she cannot describe the offender. The case appears doubtful.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having indecently exposed his person to Mrs. George Frederick Ritso, at the corner of Madras Street and Latimer Square, Christchurch, about 8 p.m. on the 15th instant. Description: Between twenty-five and thirty years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, medium build, very pale complexion, small beard, looked like a clerk; wore long dark overcoat, light-coloured trousers, and small dark hat; respectable appearance; spoke with a whining voice. Supposed identifiable.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having indecently exposed his person to Mrs. C. H. Williams, in Park Terrace, Christchurch, at 5.30 p.m. on the 15th instant. Description: Between twenty-five and thirty years of age, tall active appearance, medium build, supposed to have small whiskers; wore brownish coat, coloured shirt, white-moleskin trousers, and deer-stalker hat with large round crown and medium brim.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

JAMES THOMPSON is charged, on warrant issued by the New Plymouth Bench, with stealing fourteen £1 notes on the Bank of New Zealand from the dwelling of Andrew Neilson, at Norfolk Road, near Inglewood, between 2 p.m. on the 6th and 9 a.m. on the 7th instant. Description: A Dane, twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, fair hair, a small tuft of fair beard on chin, cheeks shaved; wore blue sac-coat, cord trousers, brown-woollen vest with sleeves, soft brown-felt hat, and elastic-side boots; holds his head down when walking. He was lately employed by England Brothers, at Normanby, and was seen at Bell Block on the 8th instant.

ANDERSON HUNTER, charged on warrant with stealing a meerscham pipe from the store of Donald Blyth, at Masterton, is identical with John Hunter, *alias* Anderson, sentenced at the Supreme Court, Dunedin, on the 4th instant, to five years' penal servitude for housebreaking and larceny.

BETWEEN 5 p.m. on the 6th and 8.45 a.m. on the 7th instant, the shop of Alexander Simpson, at Sydenham, was broken into, and a glaziers' diamond with black-walnut handle, value 15s., stolen.

SUPPOSED stolen on the 7th instant, from the person of Mark Bayliss, while in a brothel in Fraser's Lane, Wellington, forty £1 notes on the Colonial Bank.

### Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

THE warrant issued by the Waimate Bench for the arrest of Henry William Dutton, for deserting his wife, has been cancelled.

THE warrant of commitment to gaol issued against John Quinn, in default of paying £1 fine and 6s. 6d. costs for being drunk and disorderly at Black's, has been cancelled.

WILLIAM PENFOLD is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with disobeying an order to provide for the maintenance of his wife at Kensington, near Dunedin, since the 1st April last. Description: English, a blacksmith, thirty years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, fair hair, and very red moustache, no whiskers. On the 9th instant he was £15 15s. in arrear. He is supposed to be employed in or near Invercargill.

WILLIAM DUFF is charged, on warrant issued by the Timaru Bench, with deserting his wife at Washdyke since the 28th ultimo. Description: Scotch, a stock-rider and labourer, thirty-two years of age, about 6 feet high, stout build, brown hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache; wore grey-tweed coat and vest, brown-moleskin trousers, and soft black-felt hat; fond of drink. He was formerly a coach-driver at Dunedin, and is well known by the police there. He left Timaru on the 30th ultimo by rail for the South.

THOMAS LACY is charged, on warrant issued by the Picton Bench, with deserting his wife at Picton since the 14th instant. Description: A native of Australia, a labourer and bushman, thirty-one years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, medium build, thin features, sandy hair and whiskers, top off middle finger of right hand. He went to Wellington, supposed with the intention of going to Australia by the steamer "Arawata."

Mrs. Spargo, who was supposed to be cohabiting with Climo, arrived at Wellington on the 17th instant by the steamer "Grafton."

EDWARD CROSSWELLER is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with deserting his wife at Wellington since the 1st instant. Description: English, a painter, thirty-six years of age, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, medium build, fresh

complexion, brown hair, whiskers, and moustache; wore black-cloth coat, light-tweed trousers and vest, and black-felt hat. He left Wellington on the 1st instant by the steamer "Tui" for New Plymouth. He may assume the name of Cross.

CHARLES JONES is charged on warrant of commitment, for want of distress, issued by the Auckland Bench, in default of paying £1 fine and £1 19s. costs, for a breach of the Municipal Corporation Act, by removing a water-meter, at Auckland, without giving the necessary notice. Description: About forty years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair, whiskers, and moustache.

JOHN HARRISON is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with disobeying an order, since the 7th instant, to pay 10s. per week towards the maintenance of his wife. Description: English, a seaman, forty-eight years of age, 5 feet 4 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, grey eyes, light-brown hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache. He left Auckland on the 4th instant by the steamer "Southern Cross" for Fiji.

Cunningham is Irish, forty-five years of age, brown hair turning grey, no hair on face except brown moustache, pockpitted; wore brown corduroy suit. Bunch is English, twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, medium build, brown hair, clean-shaved; wore brown guernsey, dark trousers, and soft black-felt hat.
