FIXING SITTINGS AT PATEA OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF WANGANUI.

#### ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in this behalf enabling me, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby fix and appoint that sittings of the District Court of Wanganui, for civil and criminal business, shall be held as follows, in lieu of those previously fixed and appointed :—

In the Courthouse at Patea, on the Monday before the second Thursday in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.
