JOHN BEATTIE is charged with having, on the 12th instant, at Ettrick, Otago, assaulted and stabbed John Wilson, with intent to do grievous bodily harm. Description: A native of Ayrshire, Scotland, a labourer and rabbiter, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, stout square build, fresh complexion, brown hair, fair beard, whiskers, and moustache, down-cast look; wore light-grey tweed suit, soft black-felt hat, and lace-up boots; carried a blue-blanket swag. He left his camp on the Spylaw Ranges on the night of the 12th instant, and it is supposed went in the direction of Lawrence or Tapanui. Warrant for his arrest to issue.
