Incendiarism.

DURING the nights of the 15th and 16th ultimo, at Hilderthorpe, Oamaru, 200 bags of barley, and a shed containing farm implements, corn, &c., the property of Thomas Y. Duncan, value £150, were maliciously destroyed by fire. The property was not insured. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who was seen near the corn two hours before the fire was discovered. Description: English, a labourer, thirty-three years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, very stout build, dark complexion and hair, dark-brown bushy whiskers; wore dark-brown tweed coat, white moleskin trousers, and soft black hat; dirty appearance. He had been in Mr. Duncan's employment.

On the 19th ultimo, near Rakaia, 150 acres of English grass, about twenty acres of wheat in stook, and about two miles of fencing, the property of the Bank of New South Wales, value about £167, were destroyed by fire, which it is believed was wilfully caused. The property was not insured.

DURING the night of the 24th ultimo, at Waihao, Canterbury, three stacks of wheat, the property of George Milne, value £210, were maliciously destroyed by fire. The stacks were insured in the New Zealand Office for £157 10s.

DURING the night of the 2nd instant, at Papakaio, Oamaru, five stacks of wheat, value about £350, the property of Messrs. Anderson and Stewart, were maliciously destroyed by fire. The stacks were insured in the Colonial Office for £350.

Missing Friends.

JOSEPH FARRAR JONES, licensee of the Grand Pacific Hotel, Ocean Beach, near Dunedin, is missing from there since the 7th ultimo. Description: A native of the United States of altimo. Description: A native of the United States of America, an hotel-keeper, &c., fifty-two years of age, about 6 feet high, medium build, sallow complexion, grey hair, whiskers, and moustache, chin shaved, stooping gait. His clothes were found at 6 o'clock on the morning of the 7th ultimo, on the Ocean Beach, by Louis Routher, who says that he saw a corpse among the breakers at the time. As the body has not since been found, and as M. Louis Routher when the same are in contracted in the same according to the same accor and as Mr. Jones was in embarrassed circumstances, it is thought that he may not be drowned. He was licensee of the Excelsion Hotel, Melbourne, in 1860, and came to this colony from there in 1862, and since then, up to the time of his disappearance, kept and managed hotels at Invercargill and Dunedin.

INFORMATION is requested respecting the whereabouts of William Hargreaves Birtwell, about 5 feet 7 inches high, fair complexion, small beard; when last seen wore grey suit. He left his home in Oamaru early in January last for the purpose of going to Dunedin to consult a doctor about a cancer or tumour in his stomach from which he suffered. It is said that he came to Wellington, but he cannot be heard of here. Inquiry is made for him at the request of his wife, who resides at Oamaru.
