## NEW ZEALAND POLICE GAZETTE.

**NOTICE.**—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette*, see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property, supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

Communications for this *Gazette* should be addressed to the Commissioner of Constabulary, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For *Gazette*."

### Incendiarism.

On the 17th ultimo some dry tea-tree and wood, saturated with kerosene oil, and a piece of lighted candle, were placed under the floor of the house of Alexander Farmer, at Kamo, Auckland, with the intention of destroying the house, but the fire was discovered and extinguished before any damage was done.

On the 5th ultimo, at North Otatau, Southland, about six chains of a post-and-rail fence, the property of the Government, value £6, was maliciously destroyed by fire.

On the morning of the 25th ultimo an unoccupied four-roomed house, at Tapanui, the property of Bremner and Washer, was maliciously destroyed by fire. The house was insured for £100 in the National Office.

ABOUT 10.40 p.m. on the 22nd ultimo the drapers' shop of Wood and Smith, at Timaru, was maliciously set on fire, but the fire was discovered and extinguished before much damage was done. The stock was insured for £1,400, which is considerably less than its value.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

SAMUEL GARRETT, charged on warrant with embezzling money, the property of Messrs. Brown and Everett, has been arrested by Constable Thomas Loose, Waimate Police, and sentenced to three months' labour.

G. S. SKINNER is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with forging and uttering a cheque for £1 5s. to Walter Smart, in Manners Street, Wellington, on or about the 15th ultimo. Description: English, supposed to be a clerk, about twenty-three years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, slight build, fair complexion, sandy hair, clean-shaved except small sandy moustache, short nose; dressed in grey-tweed suit and round grey-tweed hat, no necktie; rather respectable ap-

pearance; fond of smoking cigarettes, and blows the smoke through his nostrils; addicted to drink, and frequents brothels. He is supposed to have gone to Wanganui. The cheque is drawn on the Bank of New Zealand, Te Aro, payable to "A. Cameron," and signed "J. McLean."

SAMUEL ROTHWELL is charged, on warrant issued by the Reefton Bench, with personating one Patrick Kelly, at the Inangahua County Council election for Antonio's Riding, at Antonio's Flat, on the 16th ultimo. Description: Supposed Irish, twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, whiskers, and moustache; dressed in dark coat, tweed trousers and vest, and black hat. He was seen at Lyell on the 24th ultimo.

BILL ROWLAND is charged with having indecently exposed his person to Annie Willoughby and others, at Timaru, on the 30th ultimo and 1st instant. Description: English, a labourer, about thirty-five years of age, about 5 feet 7 inches high, stiff build, reddish face, hair inclined to be sandy, reddish moustache, whiskers shaved off about three weeks ago; dressed in dark or dark-brown coat, dirty-brown-moleskin trousers, and dark-felt hat; carried a blue-blanket swag. He is well known in the Ashburton and Rakaia Districts.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

JAMES HOGAN, charged on warrant with burglariously entering the Golden Age Hotel, Cromwell, the property of Charles McKenna, has been arrested by Constable William Bell, Black's Police, and remanded to Cromwell.

WILLIAM MYBRAE, charged on warrant with stealing a pair of opera-glasses from the dwelling of James Longbottom, at Auckland, has been arrested by Constable Frederick Wild, Hamilton Police, and sentenced to fourteen days' labour.

A MAN, who gave the name of Brown, is charged with stealing, between the 26th and 28th ultimo, from the library of the Young Men's Christian Association Rooms, Moray Place, Dunedin, three books, value £1 10s., since recovered. Description: English, about twenty-eight years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, slight build, dark hair, very small whiskers and moustache, chin shaved; wore dark-grey-tweed suit, and hard black-felt hat. Identifiable. He sold the books to George Rowlands and Charles Shepard, dealers, George Street, Dunedin.

STOLEN between 11 p.m. on the 1st and 1 a.m. on the 2nd instant, from the person of Edward Rolleston, whilst drunk, at Dunedin, a £20 note and five £5 notes. Suspicion attached to Thomas Mills, English, a cook, twenty years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair, a little fair hair on chin and upper lip; dressed in dark-blue-cloth coat, grey-tweed trousers and vest, and soft black-felt hat.

THE gold watch and chain, &c., supposed stolen from the person of Alexander Murphy, while drunk, at Wellington, have been recovered. Suspicion no longer attaches to Jessie Walker and Arthur Jones, *alias* Punch.

STOLEN during the night of the 2nd instant, from a bedroom in the Victoria Hotel, Featherston, six £1 notes on the Bank of New Zealand, and a £1 note on the Bank of Australasia; the property of Louis Truman. Identifiable. Five of the Bank of New Zealand notes have since been recovered; they were found concealed under a box outside the bedroom.

SUPPOSED stolen on the 19th or 20th ultimo, from the person of James Todd, while drunk at Tapanui, a silver lever hunting watch, maker W. Nicol, Balclutha, No. 119650; steel chain with bit in centre attached; value £7. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 14th and 20th ultimo, from the ware of Patrick Shaw, at Porangahau Station, Hawke's Bay, a ladies' double-case gold watch with gold face, maker's name and number not known; value £10. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to John Carroll, Scotch, a shearer, twenty-eight years of age, 5 feet 11 inches high, dark complexion, black whiskers; rides a big bay mare with sore wither. His family reside at Bull's.

ON the 26th or 27th ultimo the office of William Henry Hargreaves, Lichfield Street, Christchurch, was broken into, and a cheque for £1 6s. 7d. on the Bank of Australasia, Christchurch, dated the 25th ultimo, drawn by W. S. Allen in favour of Mr. Hargreaves, stolen. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 19th ultimo, from the hut of William King, Level's Station, near Pleasant Point, a red-leather purse with clasp, containing 19s. in silver, and a pair of dark-moleskin trousers with dark stripe at sides; value 10s. 6d. Purse and trousers identifiable. Suspicion attached to a man known as Big Pat, Irish, about forty years of age, 6 feet high, light hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache, worn long; dressed in old faded blue-monkey jacket, right breast torn, and old torn trousers, but may be wearing the stolen ones. STOLEN in August last, from a bedroom in Muller's boarding-house, Timaru, a nearly-new dark-blue-cloth paget-coat and vest, a nearly-new navy-blue trousers, and a long dark-blue-cloth overcoat, dark-grey lining, cloth buttons; the property of William Mossman; value £4 10s. Identification doubtful.

STOLEN on the 17th ultimo, from a bedroom in Leahy's boarding-house, Hobson Street, Auckland, a silver Geneva hunting watch, case engraved, No. 5928; the property of Charles Ramsay; value £5 2s. Identifiable.

ON the 20th ultimo the Queen's Head Hotel, Auckland, the property of Joseph Boulter, was broken into, and four bottles of gin and old tom stolen.

BETWEEN 8.50 p.m. on the 20th and 8 a.m. on the 21st ultimo the chemist's shop of Stephen Gilbert, Queen Street, Auckland, was broken into and ransacked, but nothing was stolen.

ON the 20th ultimo the shop of Annie Lloyd, Victoria Street, Auckland, was broken into, and £4 1s. 6d. in silver stolen.

STOLEN on the 9th ultimo, from a till in the shop of Thomas Armstrong, Colombo Street, Christchurch, 14s. in silver.

ON the morning of the 19th ultimo the dwelling of Theophilus Cooper, Pousonby, Auckland, was burglariously entered, but nothing was stolen.

#### Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

EDWARD TRENWITH, *alias* Donovan, is charged, on warrant issued by the Invercargill Bench, with the larceny, on a bailee, at Invercargill, on the 29th ultimo, of a paget-coat, value £2, since recovered; the property of John Patterson. Description: Irish, a clerk, forty-four years of age, 5 feet 5½ inches high, stout build, round florid features, dark-brown hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache, mixed with grey; dressed in dark-tweed suit, considerably worn, and round black hat. He travels through the country selling composition for cleaning clothes and furniture. (See *Police Gazette*, 1881, page 77.)

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from a cart in Lorne Street, Auckland, a dark-grey waterproof coat; the property of Richard O'Callaghan; value £2 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 24th ultimo, from St. George's Bay Road, Auckland, a black-and-white hen and eight black chickens; the property of William Flood. Hen identifiable.

STOLEN on the 22nd or 23rd ultimo, from the yard of A. Hammond, Parnell, Auckland, a brown-and-speckled hen and

eleven young ducks, some yellow, others black and yellow; value 8s. Hen identifiable.

STOLEN, supposed between the 20th ultimo and 3rd instant, from the Museum, Christchurch, a gold quarter-guinea of George I., dated 1714; a Canadian silver 50-cent piece of Victoria, dated 1872; a silver rupee of Victoria, dated 1862; a silver half-rupee of Victoria, East India Company, dated 1840; a silver florin of Victoria without the usual D.G. on it, brighter colour than the other coins, dated 1849; a German gold five-mark piece, dated 1877; and a two-krooner Danish silver coin, reign of Christian IX., dated 1875; the property of Dr. Julius Von Haast. All identifiable by a peculiar blue tarnish on them.

STOLEN on the 19th ultimo, at Morningside, Auckland, a bundle of clothes, consisting of the following: Four white shirts, five chemises (three large and two small), a night-dress, seven linen collars, two ladies' ties, a sheet, a bolster-case, four pairs of girls' drawers, a muslin pinafore, two aprons, a flannel shirt, a small white petticoat, a boys' coloured-cloth jacket, a toilet cover, two small dresses, a pair of ladies' drawers, and a bed valance; the property of Mary McBride. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 1st September last and 21st ultimo, from a new building in Hepburn Street, Auckland, 1,000 feet of tongued-and-grooved timber; the property of Thomas Maunders; value £7.

STOLEN between the 8th and 10th ultimo, from the yard of Thomas Armstrong, Colombo Street, Christchurch, four rough brown-holland aprons, plain pattern, and an old axe; value 9s. 6d. Identifiable.

THE youth charged with stealing an overcoat, at Dunedin, the property of John McLauchlan, has been arrested by Constable Power, Dunedin Police, and sentenced to fourteen days' labour. His name is Philip Grantley, *alias* De Costa.

Suspicion attached to the crew of the ship.

STOLEN on the 30th ultimo or 1st instant, from Tory Street, Wellington, two grey Rouen ducks; the property of William H. Pascoe; value £1 10s. Identifiable.

#### Horse and Cattle Stealing.

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from a paddock in Kilmore Street, Christchurch, an iron-grey horse, suitable for a cab, about 15 hands high, shod, no visible brand, value £20; and a bay mare, suitable for a buggy, about 14½ hands high, near hip slightly down, shod, no visible brand, value £14; the property of Edward Laughton Patrick. Identifiable. Swagmen suspected.

JOHN HENNIGAN, charged with breaking out of the lock-up at Hawera, on the 15th November, 1878, has been arrested by Detective George Jeffrey, Auckland Police, remanded to New Plymouth, and committed for trial.

#### Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

THE warrant issued by the Wanganui Bench for the arrest of Richard Quin, for deserting his wife and children, has been cancelled.

JOHN WILLIS, *alias* Racehorse Jack, is charged, on warrant issued by the Dargaville Bench, with disobeying a summons to appear at the Resident Magistrate's Court, Dargaville, on the 17th ultimo, to answer a charge of using obscene language. Description: Irish, a bushman and gum-digger, thirty-seven years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, stooped shoulders, fair complexion, fair moustache and goatee; usually wears light-tweed trousers, white soft hat, and elastic-side boots. Supposed to have gone to Hokianga.

JOHN WILSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Timaru Bench, with disobeying an order, since about the 23rd May last, to pay 12s. per week for the maintenance of his wife and three children. Description: English, a labourer, about thirty years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, slight build, dark-brown curly hair, small sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache, scar on temple; when last seen wore grey-tweed suit.

DANIEL HIRLEHY is charged, on warrant issued by the Oxford Bench, with disobeying an order to pay £1 5s., due since the 22nd June last, for the support of his children in the Burnham Industrial School. Description: Irish, a labourer, forty-two years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, stout build, large full face, flat nose, fair hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache. He was working near Geraldine in June last.

ALFRED WADSWORTH is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with deserting his wife at Opari, Canterbury, in November, 1880. Description: English, formerly an hotel-keeper, thirty-three years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, very stout build, dark complexion, blue eyes, pockpitted, black hair and whiskers, slight moustache, chin shaved, bow-legged.

ORPEN DANIEL FINCH is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with deserting his wife at Wellington since the 15th ultimo. COLONY OF NEW ZEALAND, }  
TO WIT. }

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Prisons Act Amendment Act, 1881," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare that such police stations as he shall name therein shall be police gaols:

And whereas it is desirable to proclaim the police stations mentioned in the Schedule to be police gaols:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the said colony, in pursuance of the above-recited power, do hereby declare that the police stations mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be police gaols.

**CLOSING CERTAIN PUBLIC PRISONS.**

A. GORDON, Governor.

COLONY OF NEW ZEALAND, }  
TO WIT. }

WHEREAS by the eighth section of "The Prisons Act, 1873," it is enacted that, as to any public prison which the Governor shall be of opinion has become unfit for the purpose, or unnecessary, or for any other reason ought to cease to be a public prison, the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare that such public prison shall be no longer a public prison; and upon the publication of such Proclamation in the *Gazette*, or from and after any later date fixed in such Proclamation for the purpose, such public prison shall cease to be a public prison:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the said Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the publication of this Proclamation in the *Gazette*, the public prisons at Clyde, Gisborne, Naseby, Oamaru, Tauranga, and Westport shall cease to be public prisons.
