Incendiarism.

On the morning of the 16th ultimo, at Winton Plains, Southland, a two-story barn, containing a large quantity of chaff, 700 bushels of oats, 120 bushels of rye-grass seed, ten bags of wheat, fifty sheepskins, &c., the property of John Thomson, jun., value about £220, were maliciously destroyed by fire. The barn was insured in the Colonial Office for £100, but the contents were not insured.

On the morning of the 21st ultimo the general store of Alexander Gilmour, at Waitara, value about £1,850, was destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was maliciously caused. The back door of the store was found open, and a bag, containing tobacco, tins of preserved fish, salmon, lobsters, milk, and cocoa, was found by the police about 15 yards from the back of the store. The building was insured in the Union Office for £200 and the stock for £750 in the Northern Office, and for £500 in the Victoria Office.

SETTING fire to the house of George Philips, at Kaikoura: James Campbell was arrested for this offence by Constable William Wilson Smart, Kaikoura Police, but discharged for want of sufficient evidence.

FREDERICK VENTRY, charged with embezzling money, the property of the Tasmanian Government, has been arrested by the George Town Territorial Police.

RODERICK HARRY McLENNAN is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, on the 12th June last, at Waiatu, Amuri, Nelson District, obtained £5 from Edward Herbert King, by means of a valueless cheque. Description: A native of Rothshire, Scotland, a shepherd and road-contractor, thirty-one years of age, 5 feet 10½ inches high, medium build, pale complexion, very dark-brown hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache, dark-grey eyes, large mouth, long thin pointed nose, slight impediment in speech, inclines slightly forward when

walking; dressed in grey-tweed suit and hat, and watertight boots; may represent himself as a man of property. He issued several other valueless cheques. He is identical with Roderick Harry McLennan, referred to in the *Police Gazette*, 1880, page 22, and 1881, page 138. He left the colony by the steamer "Manipouri," which arrived in Melbourne on the 9th ultimo.

ROWLAND PAUL MAHONEY, *alias* Davis, is charged, on warrant issued by the Lyttelton Bench, with obtaining board and lodging, value £3 12s., from Patrick O'Brien on the 22nd June last, at Lyttelton, by false representations. Description: Irish, about thirty-six years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, sandy beard whiskers and moustache worn long, lame in right leg, carries a walking-stick; dressed in light-tweed suit and light-tweed hat; respectable appearance; well educated. He falsely represented himself as a brother of the Rev. Father Mahoney, of Nelson.

A TALL fair young man, name unknown, dressed in a black overcoat and a black soft-felt hat pulled over his eyes, is charged with having indecently exposed his person to Isabella Duncan, in Worcester Street, Christchurch, about 9.30 p.m. on the 22nd ultimo.

RICHARD PORTER is wanted on warrant for embezzling £4,000, the money of the Clitheroe Building Society, of which he was secretary. Description: A native of Clitheroe, Lancashire, fifty-three years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, complexion dark (sallow), hair whiskers and moustache dark (grey), small eyes, long features, cut-mark on back of right hand, proportionate build, square shoulders; wears a grey-tweed suit and billycock hat. CHARLES WILLIAM RINTOUL, a rate-collector, absconded from Peterborough, England, on the 17th April last, charged on warrant with embezzling £2,300 from the Corporation. Description: Thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, complexion dark, inclined to be sallow, hair and eyes black; when last seen had a black moustache and beard, square but rather slender build, has a springy step, and looks on the ground when walking; is a great smoker; dresses well, and had with him a light-coloured suit; is about 10 stone in weight. Description: About forty years of age, about 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, long dark beard and moustache; wore blue overcoat. He was riding a horse, and went in the direction of Waipukurau. Mrs. May lost the shawl on the road, and the offender, soon after he found it, was asked to give it up, but declined to do so.

Escaped Prisoner.

ERUERA TEWHATANUI, *alias* Kingie, *alias* Kingie Haira, is charged with breaking out of the police gaol at Wairoa, Hawke's Bay, about 11.30 a.m. on the 27th ultimo. Description: A Maori, about twenty-seven years of age, about 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, high cheek-bones, low forehead, sullen appearance, no hair on face; dressed in dark-tweed paget-coat, grey-tweed trousers, and elastic-side boots. He was remanded until the 28th ultimo on a charge of horse-stealing and on two charges of larceny. He is identical with Kingie, charged with escaping from the lock-up at Opotiki on the 18th December last. (See *Police Gazette*, 1882, page 3.) He is supposed to be making towards the Urewera country.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

EDWARD CARRINGTON BUXTON SUTHERLAND is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with disobeying an order, since June, 1879, to pay £1 per week towards the support of his five children, at Dunedin. Description: Scotch, a labourer, forty years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, slender build, fair complexion and hair, long fair sandy whiskers, slight fair beard and moustache.

WILLIAM McKEOWN, charged on warrant with deserting his wife, at Christchurch, has been arrested by Sergeant William Henry Scott, Oxford Police, and discharged.

JOHN WILSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Timaru Bench, with deserting his three children at Timaru since the 12th June last. Description: A native of the North of Ireland, a groom and farmer, thirty-two years of age, 5 feet 7½ inches high, slight build, thin features, blue eyes, tender eyelids, dark hair, thin short sandy beard whiskers and moustache; when last seen wore dark-grey tweed coat, bedford-cord trousers, leather leggings, and soft black felt-hat. (See *Police Gazette*, 1882, page 105.) He left Timaru on the 12th June last by train for Christchurch. His father lives at Styx, near Christchurch.

JOHN BROWN is charged, on warrant issued by the Dargaville Bench, with disobeying a summons to appear at the Resident Magistrate's Court, Dargaville, on the 13th ultimo, to answer a charge of having made use of obscene language in a public place at Dargaville, on the 10th June last. Description: Scotch, a bushman, about forty-five years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, stout build, sandy complexion, full face, blue eyes, hair and whiskers turning grey; usually wears grey-tweed sac-coat and vest, moleskin trousers, and black billycock hat. He is supposed to have gone to the Mangokohia bush.

WILLIAM RYDER is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with deserting his wife and five children, at Blenheim, since the 30th June last. Description: English, a labourer (generally employed at bush-work), thirty-six years of age, 5 feet 11 inches high, stout build, fair complexion, dark eyes, brown hair, dark beard whiskers and moustache, sharp nose, active appearance; dressed in light-tweed suit, paget-coat, and pepper-and-salt-tweed hat. He was heard of at the Albion Hotel, Dunedin, on the 7th ultimo.

EDWARD HITCHMAN is charged, on warrant issued by the Waimate Bench, with disobeying a summons to appear at the Resident Magistrate's Court, Waimate, on the 19th ultimo, to answer a charge of assaulting his wife.
