Joyce and Kerry Jack. Forbes was better known about Coleraine as "Blathering Charlie," and had a large scar on the upper lip, supposed right side. Nothing has been seen of him since he left Mr. Whitaker's. Kerry Jack had a set of false teeth.—O. 582.—5th June, 1882.

Description: Forty-five to fifty years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, and heavy dark moustache; is addicted to drink. He left Adelaide for Melbourne in the s.s. "South Australia" on the 15th instant, and had with him a draft on the Colonial Bank of Australasia, Melbourne, for £130.
