Incendiarism.

On the morning of the 19th ultimo the Presbyterian Church, at New Plymouth, the property of the Presbyterian Church Trustees, was maliciously destroyed by fire. The building, harmonium, and fittings were insured in the Victoria Office for £400, by the Rev. Moses Somes Breach, the late minister. The majority of the congregation were on unfriendly terms with the Rev. Mr. Breach, and recently succeeding in effecting his removal from the charge of the New Plymouth Church. It is believed that the church was set on fire from the outside, as the doors were barricaded and secured on the inside in order to prevent Mr. Breach from preaching in it on the following Sunday.

On the morning of the 20th ultimo the photographic establishment of Henry Coxhead, George Street, Timaru, was destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was wilfully caused. The fire extended to three adjoining shops, which were also destroyed. Coxhead had his stock, &c., insured in the Standard Office for £150, which amount is considered to be in excess of the value of the property destroyed.

On the morning of the 23rd ultimo an unoccupied three-roomed house, at Smart Road, Waiwakaiho, Taranaki, the property of Charles White, value under £100, was destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was wilfully caused. The house was insured in the South British Office for £100.

DURING the night of the 26th July last, at Waitohi Road, Canterbury, two stacks of barley, the property of Denis Heffernan, were maliciously destroyed by fire. The stacks were insured in the New Zealand Office for £100. Heffernan was arrested and charged with the offence, but the case was dismissed.

On the morning of the 21st ultimo, at One-Tree Point, Southland, an unoccupied six-roomed house, the property of Christopher Bonney, was destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was wilfully caused. The house was insured in the Colonial Office for £75.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

JOHN HUGHES is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with uttering a forged cheque for £4 on the Bank of New Zealand, Christchurch, purporting to be signed by James Holmes to Edward Ravenhill, at Christchurch, about the 14th April, 1881. Description: A North of Ireland man, a labourer, about twenty-eight years of age, about 5 feet 5½ inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, very little on front of head, clean-shaved except small dark moustache, brown eyes, rather long pointed nose; wore pepper-and-salt-coloured tweed suit, and soft black hat. He left Christchurch on the 14th ultimo, and is said to be working with six other men about nine miles from Ashburton.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having assaulted Emily Newman, in Gloucester Street, Christchurch, at 8.50 p.m. on the 5th ultimo. Description: Supposed a native of Lancashire, looked like a labourer or ploughman, tall and thin, light-coloured beard; wore light-coloured Yankee hat, dark monkey-jacket, and supposed dark trousers. Identifiable.

JAMES MARTIN SHEPHERD, charged on warrant with uttering a forged promissory note to Anthony Christophers, has been arrested by Sergeant Henry Martin, Auckland Police, remanded to Timaru, and committed for trial.

THOMAS STEVENS is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with embezzling, on the 7th ultimo, at Christchurch, the sum of 10s., the property of William Jackson, by whom he was employed. Description: English, a cab-driver and jockey, about twenty-one years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, slight build, fair complexion, black hair, clean-shaved; wore dark-tweed coat and vest (jockey pattern), light-tweed tight-fitting trousers, and soft black-felt hat. He may have gone to the West Coast.

CHARLES MARKS is charged, on warrant issued by the Invercargill Bench, with having obtained, on the 22nd ultimo, by false pretences, at Invercargill, an old-fashioned single-barrel gun with boar's head on bottom of stock, five square barrel, stock extends nearly the whole length of barrel; the property of William McIntosh; value £1 10s. Identifiable. Description: A Native of Dunedin, fifteen years of age, but looks younger and small for his age, fair hair; dressed in grey coat, brown-moleskin trousers, watertight boots, and soft-felt hat. He is supposed to be an absconder from the Caversham Industrial School. He may have gone to Dunedin, where his mother lives, or seek employment on a farm.

GEORGE J. BAXTER is charged, on warrant issued by the Tapanui Bench, with having obtained, on the 23rd ultimo, from Andrew McKinnon, at Tapanui, £2 15s. by means of a valueless cheque. Description: A fishmonger, 5 feet 10½ inches high, age and country not stated, dark complexion, dark beard whiskers and moustache, stooped shoulders, walks badly; wore blue coat, coloured-moleskin pants, and soft black-felt hat. He formerly drove a coach between Tapanui and Waipahi. He is supposed to have gone to Waipori.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

CHARLES PRINIZEN, charged with stealing an overcoat from the Victoria Hotel, Featherston, the property of John Thomas Hodder, has been arrested by Constables James Smith and Joseph Eccleton, Featherston and Greytown Police, and sentenced to fourteen days' labour.

ASSAULTING and robbing James Allan, at Dunedin: Thomas Keating has been arrested for this offence by Detective John Mitchell Walker, Dunedin Police, and committed for trial.

STOLEN on the 23rd ultimo, from the hotel of Thomas Davis, at Kamo, Auckland, four £5 notes, forty-five £1 notes, three sovereigns, four half-sovereigns, £30 in silver, and cheques to the amount of £44, payment of which has been stopped. Cheques only identifiable.

A MAN, only known as Bill, is charged with stealing, on the 19th ultimo, at Geraldine, a plain silver brooch with round ball in centre; the property of Arthur Price; value £3 15s. Identifiable. Description: Supposed English, an umbrella and lamp repairer, about forty years of age, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, well made, dark complexion, dark-brown hair, very dark beard whiskers and moustache worn full, scar near one of eyes; dressed in dark-tweed suit and peaked cap. The brooch was given to him to put a pin in it, but he left Geraldine on the day he received it without returning it to the owner, and went towards Winchester, accompanied by his mate. Description: Irish, thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, light-brown hair whiskers and moustache, chin hairless and red from a burn or scald; dressed in light clothes, trousers patched at knees, billycock hat, and elastic-side oxford shoes. They travel together through the country repairing umbrellas, lamps, &c.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

JANE DE MAUS, *alias* Thompson, is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with deserting her child, at Dunedin, since about the 29th June last. Description: Scotch, forty-two years of age, about 5 feet 3 inches high, rather stout build, dark complexion, long dark hair, and blue eyes. She left Dunedin about 28th June last for Oamaru or Christchurch, and may be living with a man named Henderson, *alias* Smith, about thirty years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, slight build, fair hair; wore dark-tweed coat, black-and-white check trousers, fur cap, and brass watch-chain. He left Dunedin about a fortnight later than offender, taking with him his furniture.

Description: A native of the North of Ireland, a widow (age not stated), about 5 feet 3 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, squints; fond of drink.

MICHAEL WALSH is charged on warrant of commitment to gaol for three months, issued by the Palmerston South Bench, in default of distress or payment of £75 12s. 6d. due for the support of his three children in the Caversham Industrial School. Description: Irish, a labourer, fifty years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair turning grey, beard whiskers and moustache nearly white and cut short. He left Palmerston on the 12th ultimo by train for Dunedin.

JEIDA THOMAS is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with deserting his wife and three children, at Christchurch, since the 12th ultimo. Description: English, a printer, thirty-two years of age, about 5 feet 7 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, brown hair and eyes, clean-shaved except moustache; dressed in dark-blue paget-coat and plaid trousers. He left Lyttelton on the 12th ultimo by the steamer "Wanaka" for Wellington, and will likely endeavour to leave the colony.

PETER McDONALD is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with deserting his child at Sydenham.
