Incendiarism.

BETWEEN 9.30 p.m. on the 9th and 6 a.m. on the 10th of April last, at Riversdale, Southland, two stacks of oats, the property of Roderick Matheson, value about £50, were maliciously destroyed by fire. The stacks were insured in the National Office for £75.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

JAMES WELLS is charged, on warrant issued by the Hamilton Bench, with having, on or about the 5th ultimo, at Tuhikaramea, embezzled £45 7s. 3d., the moneys of the Tuhikaramea Highway Board, by whom he was employed as rate-collector. Description: English, about fifty years of age, about 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, dark complexion and eyes, dark hair turning grey, upper front teeth out, shows his eye-teeth when smiling; usually wears dark-tweed suit, shabby appearance.

WILLIAM DAVIDSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with having, in March last and at other times, obtained goods, &c., value £80 11s. 7d., from Messrs. Thompson, Shannon, and Co., at Wellington, by false representations. Description: English, a cabinetmaker, thirty-seven years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, slight build, pale fair complexion, blue or grey eyes, rather sharp nose, thin features, fair hair beard whiskers and moustache, all rather thin and straight, slightly round-shouldered; usually wears grey-tweed suit and black hat, smart active appearance and movements.

ON the 30th ultimo or 1st instant thirty-six planks, 12 feet long by 12 inches by 3 inches, the property of James Calder, which were placed on the bridge at Riverton for the purpose of repairing it, were maliciously thrown into the river.

BETWEEN the 9th and 11th instant two panes of glass, value 4s., the property of Alexander Wilson, were maliciously broken in the windows of the Presbyterian Church, Adelaide Road, Wellington; during the same time four windows of the church were maliciously smeared with excrement.

ON the 12th or 13th instant two windows, value 15s., were maliciously broken in a building at the graving dock, Port Chalmers; the property of the Dunedin Harbour Board.

BETWEEN the 30th ultimo and 2nd instant, at Ashburton, three panes of plate-glass, 8 feet by 4 feet, value £42, were maliciously broken in the windows of the shop of R. Alcorn.

DURING the night of the 14th instant the brass plate in front of the premises of Messrs. Wright, Stephenson, and Co., High Street, Dunedin, was maliciously wrenched off and taken away. The plate has since been recovered by Acting-Sergeant Thomas Livingston.

ON the morning of the 18th instant two panes of glass, value £1, were maliciously broken in the shop-window of William Willis, Ross Place, Lawrence.

Licensing Districts altered.

(L.S.) WM. F. DRUMMOND JERVOIS,
 Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the Districts of Wairau and Albert:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, alter and redefine the boundaries of the Wairau and Albert Districts, which shall henceforth be those described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Wairau.

BOUNDED towards the North-east by Whangarei County; towards the South-east and South generally by Rodney County to Section No. 28, Paparoa Parish; and towards the North-west generally by the said parish and by Mareretu Parish to Whangarei County.

Albert.

Bounded towards the North by the Parish of Mangawai from the Hakaru River eastward; thence towards the East and South-east by the Parish of Arai to the north-west angle of Section No. 104, of the Parish of Oruawhoro; thence by the north-east boundary of said Section No. 104 to the eastern boundary of the Oruawhoro Block; thence towards the South-east by the east and south-east boundaries of the said Oruawhoro Block to the centre of the road which forms the south-east boundary of Section No. 9, Otamatea Survey District; thence by said road to its junction with the road which forms the south-west boundary of Sections Nos. 9 and 8 of the said district; thence towards the South-west by the centre of the said road to the Paraheke Native Reserve; thence by part of the southern and by the eastern boundary of the said Native reserve to the Waireia Creek, and by said creek and the Wharehine River to Te Tanuka; thence towards the North-west and West by the waters of the Kaipara Harbour to Hobson County; and thence towards the North, North-east, and North-west by the said county.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, Lieutenant-General in Her Majesty's Army, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
