Offences Not Otherwise Described.

CHARLES WHITE, charged on warrant with disobeying a summons to appear at the office of the Official Assignee in Bankruptcy, Dunedin, was arrested on the 23rd ultimo by Sergeant Patrick Fair, at Wellington, and discharged on the following day, as the warrant was not then in possession of the Wellington Police. Offender left Wellington on the morning of the 25th ultimo, by the barque "G. M. Tucker," for Newcastle, New South Wales. Amended description: He is quite bald except a rim of long dark curly hair on back of head, whiskers turning grey, round features, round-shouldered, holds his head low; short-sighted, and can see very little without spectacles, which he always wears; wore dark-tweed sac suit, hard black-felt hat with flat crown, an open-faced silver lever watch, No. 29484, no maker's name, an English gold guard, gold shirt-studs and solitaires. He had in his possession a portmanteau containing a new black-cloth suit, a brown-tweed suit, shepherds' plaid trousers, a soft black-felt hat, a pair of elastic-side boots, and several articles.

SAMUEL ROTHWELL, charged on warrant with personating one Patrick Kelly at the Inangahua County Council election, has been arrested by Constable John Keating, Boatman's Police, and discharged.

DANIEL SULLIVAN, charged on warrant with having uttered a forged cheque for £10, at the Bank of New Zealand, Wellington, has been arrested by Constable Henry H. Carr, Otaki Police, and committed for trial on three charges of forgery and uttering.

WILLIAM SANDFORD is charged, on warrant issued by the Temuka Bench, with threatening, on the 20th ultimo, at Rangitata South, to destroy harvest machinery. Description: A native of the North of Ireland, a labourer, about forty years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, blue eyes, flat face, light-brown hair, light-sandy

beard whiskers and moustache; dressed in grey-tweed coat, vest with sleeves, coloured-moleskin trousers, lace-up boots, light soft-felt hat or old Scotch cap with peak; carried a swag. He crossed the Rangitata railway bridge on the morning of the 23rd ultimo, and went towards Ashburton. He may look for work in the Hinds District. He threatened to destroy reapers and binders by fire if not paid £1,000.

On the 25th ultimo, at Hanover Street, Dunedin, a man suspected of being identical with William Pearce, *alias* Carroll, obtained 3s. from Margaret Oaten by false representations. Description: Irish, twenty-eight years of age, about 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, dark beard whiskers and moustache, point of nose turned to one side; dressed in dark dirty clothes and old soft black hat. He falsely represented that he was a warder in Dunedin Gaol, and that he was sent for the money by complainant's husband, who is a prisoner in the gaol.

ANN RUSSELL, charged on warrant with having indecently exposed her person, has been arrested by Constable John Gillespie, Palmerston North Police, remanded to Wellington, and sentenced to one month's labour.

JOHN MARGETTS is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with having, on the 14th November last, at Auckland, obtained £4 15s. from Joseph Caffrey by false representations. Description: English, a bottler, forty-two years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, round-shouldered, florid complexion, dark-brown hair whiskers and moustache, chin shaved, Jewish cast of countenance; dressed in grey striped-tweed suit. He was employed as traveller and collector for John Levy, bottler, Auckland, up to the 10th November last.

GEORGE HOUSE is charged, on warrant issued by the Masterton Bench, with obtaining, between the 15th and 30th ultimo, from Joseph Wilson, at Whakataki, Tenui, goods and money to the value of £10 9s. by false representations. Description: English, about fifty-five years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, slight build; fair whiskers and moustache, turning grey; when last seen wore short black sac-coat, corded pattern, grey-tweed trousers and vest, and round black-felt hat with hard crown; very assuming and bounceable in manner. He falsely represented that he had money in the Bank of New Zealand at Wellington. He said that he owned property at Tahoraita, Hawke's Bay District, and that he had money in the Bank of New Zealand at Napier.

On the 8th or 9th ultimo, at Oruaiti, near Mongonui, a horse, value £5, the property of Charles Thompson, was maliciously wounded with a sharp instrument on the off-thigh, which rendered it necessary to have the animal destroyed.

THOMAS BRENNAN is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with having embezzled £78, the money of the Onehunga Racing Club, for whom he acted as secretary. Description: About thirty years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high,

slight build, very light-brown hair, fair complexion, clean-shaved except fair moustache, swaggering gait, swings his arms about when walking; dressed in blue diagonal cloth suit. It is said that he left Auckland on the 31st ultimo by the steamer "Wairarapa" for southern ports, but he could not be found on board the steamer when searched by the police at Gisborne and Wellington. The steamer "Hawea" left Onehunga on the 30th ultimo also for southern ports. He may be accompanied by a Mrs. Smith, who has left her husband, a publican at Onehunga. Description: Thirty years of age, 5 feet 2 inches high, dark eyes, oval features, good-looking.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having assaulted Matilda Wilkinson with intent to commit a rape upon her, at South Road, near New Plymouth, at 9.45 p.m. on the 24th ultimo. Description: Short stature, stout build, dark whiskers and moustache; wore dark overcoat and dark billy-cock hat.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

DANIEL MALONE is charged, on warrant issued by the Whangarei Bench, with stealing, on the 12th ultimo, from the person of John Keegan, at Whangarei, a double-cased silver Waltham watch, number not known, value £4. Identifiable. Description: Irish, a bushman, about fifty years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, stout build, dark-brown hair beard whiskers and moustache worn full and tinged with grey; dressed in dark-tweed coat and trousers and soft black-felt hat. He left Whangarei on the 14th ultimo by the steamer "McGregor" for Auckland.

— JONES, *alias* Johnson Metcalf, charged on warrant with stealing a coat, the property of Charles Huggleston, from the Governor Browne dining-rooms, has been arrested by Detective Edward Hughes, Auckland Police, and sentenced to three months' labour.

ANTONIO, charged on warrant with having violently assaulted and robbed Alfred Grey, at Wellington. A man, believed to be identical with the offender, who gave his name as Marten Le Light, was arrested at Martinborough on the 9th ultimo for this offence by Constable William Campbell, Wellington Police, but as the complainant could not then be found he was admitted to bail on his own recognizance to appear at the Resident Magistrate's Court, Featherston, on the 21st ultimo. He did not appear, and a warrant has been issued for his arrest for failing to do so. He left Masterton on the 17th ultimo, and went towards Eketahuna, carrying a blue blanket-swig. The complainant in the case has been found.

STOLEN on the 9th ultimo, from the shop-door of John Rendell, Grey Street, Auckland, about 9 yards of felt carpet, red-and-green-diamond pattern; value 12s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 18th ultimo, from the dwelling of Michael Galvan, Piako Swamp, Auckland, three £1 notes, two shillings, a black-cloth coat, value £2 5s., and a pair of grey-tweed trousers, value £1 5s. Coat and trousers identifiable. Suspicion attached to two Maoris. It is supposed they went to Morrinsville or Te Aroha.

STOLEN between the 7th December last and the 15th ultimo, from a dwelling at Coal Creek Station, Waihemo, Otago, a ladies' gold chain, rope pattern, one link missing, brass bar, value £3; and a large red cornelian breast-pin with a representation of our Saviour's head engraved thereon, plain gold border; value £1 10s.; the property of Charles Hall. Identifiable.

Description: About twenty years of age, 5 feet 5 or 6 inches high, slight build, sandy complexion, tender eyes, lame, shuffling gait. He left Dargaville on the morning of the 15th ultimo by steamer for Auckland.

SUPPOSED stolen on the 17th ultimo, from the person of Edward, a Maori, in the Criterion Hotel, Akaroa, an open-faced silver lever watch, maker's name and number not known, silver chased dial, plain gold-gilt figures, bow broken off, an oval-linked brass guard tied to watch with a piece of string, a greenstone pendant and a brass key attached; value £3. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 17th or 18th ultimo, from a bedroom in the Somerset Hotel, head of Akaroa Bay, a brown waterproof overcoat, nearly new, lined with scarlet tweed, made for a man about 6 feet high; the property of Henry Cross; value £3. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to — Salvanter and Martin Sly, members of Woodyear's circus troupe, who occupied the bedroom from which the coat was stolen. Description: Salvanter is about 5 feet 4 inches high, stiff build, dark hair turning grey, grey moustache, American appearance; wore dark-tweed clothes; supposed to be manager for the troupe. Sly is about 5 feet 10 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark moustache; wore dark-tweed suit. They went to Christchurch.

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from a bedroom in the Bush Hotel, Geraldine, an English silver lever hunting-watch, maker's name and number not known, "T. Corkery" engraved on inside of back case; the property of Thomas Corkery; value £4 10s. Identifiable. Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

CHARLES S. MCGREGOR, charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee of £80, the property of Job Coulam, has been arrested by Constable Henry Johnston, Christchurch Police, and remanded to Invercargill.

VICTOR ALFRED MORDENCY or Mordeny, charged on warrant with stealing a saddle and bridle at Blenheim, the property of Robert Phillips, has been arrested by Constable Charles Knapp, Spring Grove Police, and sentenced to three months' labour.

WALTER SMITH is charged, on warrant issued by the Waiau Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, about November, 1882, at Hanmer Plains, Amuri, of a silver lever watch; value £9; since recovered; the property of Mary McLean Hill. Description: Scotch, a watchmaker, about twenty-six years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, slight build, fair complexion, regular features, brown hair, clean shaved except moustache; generally wears light-tweed suit; smart active appearance; fond of drink. He left Kaikoura on the 11th ultimo with the intention of going to Lyttelton to ship as a steward. He has a sister living in Nelson.

JOHN LEE, *alias* Alabama Jack, is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with stealing on the 21st or 22nd ultimo, from the Taradale Hotel yard, Taradale, a black-and-tan collie dog; value £10; since recovered; the property of Robert McLeod. Description: Irish, a sailor, about thirty-eight years of age, about 5 feet 7 inches high, stout build, thin features, sandy complexion, reddish beard and whiskers; wore dark-tweed suit, dark-felt hat, and blucher boots; carried a small bundle tied in a handkerchief. He had recently been employed harvesting at Hastings. He sold the dog to a Maori at Pakapaka on the 22nd ultimo. It is supposed he went in the direction of Waipawa, and may come to Wellington.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

HENRY JUPP is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with deserting his wife, at Christchurch, since the 9th ultimo. Description: English, a carter, forty-six years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, fair hair, small fair beard whiskers and moustache, light-blue eyes, very round-shouldered, teeth all out except two in front, large flat feet, slightly lame; dressed in blue calico slop or dark-grey tweed coat and vest, corduroy trousers, watertight boots, and soft black-felt hat; impediment in speech; fond of drink. He left Lyttelton about four months ago by the steamer "Rotorua" for Wellington, taking with him two horses and a dray, supposed with the intention of working on Messrs. O'Malley and Pepperell's railway contract, Foxton.

WILLIAM GILL, *alias* Gillett, is charged on warrant of commitment to Waipawa Gaol for seven days, in default of paying £2 fine and 15s. costs, for being drunk and committing a nuisance on the railway premises, at Takapu. WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the bound-

aries of the Districts of Okahu, Matakoho, Tauhoa, Waitakerei, Otahuhu, Manurewa, Turanga, Wairoa, Hunua, Pokeno, Waitoa, Te Aroha, Hamilton, Pukekura, Meanee, Clive, Otoia, Kiwitea, Oroua, Alfredton, Masterton, Featherston, Wai-iti, Motueka, Moutere, Wangapeka, Awatere, Mount Somers, Upper Ashburton, Waiareka, Waitahuna, and Brown's:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts, which shall henceforth be those described in the Schedule hereto.
