## NEW ZEALAND POLICE GAZETTE.

A description of property, supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

### Incendiarism.

ON the morning of the 12th ultimo, at the Maori Reserve, near Riverton, three stacks of oats, the property of James Gilmour, were maliciously set on fire, by which they were destroyed. The stacks were insured in the Victoria Office for £50, which amount is considerably more than they were worth.

ON the 12th ultimo, at Urenui, Taranaki, two stacks of wheat, the property of Paul Bell and John Honeyfield, were destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was maliciously caused. At an inquest held on the 19th ultimo to inquire as to the cause of the origin of the fire an open verdict was returned. The stacks were insured in the Victoria Office for £100, which amount is largely in excess of what they were worth.

ABOUT 9.30 p.m. on the 10th ultimo, at Wyndham, an attempt was made to set fire to the body of a dray, the property of John Meikle. It was saturated with kerosene oil, and some straw placed under it, and the straw set on fire.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

ROBERT DAY is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, between the 9th and 16th ultimo, at Christchurch, absconded or being about to abscond from his bail to appear at the Supreme Court, Christchurch, on the 8th instant, to answer a charge of having forged a cheque for £1,000. Description: English, a farmer, between forty and forty-five years of age, 6 feet high, stout build, broad shoulders, very large rough hands, swarthy complexion, good-looking features, dark-brown beard whiskers and moustache worn fairly long, a yellowish tinge at points of moustache, heavy eyebrows, mark of an old wound on one of shins, believed the right one; generally wears dark-grey clothes. He will likely alter his appearance and dress, with a view of endeavouring to leave the colony. He left Kaikoura on the 16th ultimo by the steamer "Wakatu" for Wellington, under the name of Campbell, and was then shaved, except beard and moustache, and wore a dark-tweed coat and cord trousers. He may

have been joined at Wellington by a woman named Bush *alias* Dash, *alias* Ticen, who left Lyttelton on the 12th ultimo as a steerage passenger by the steamer "Waihora" for Wellington. She is about twenty-eight years of age, stout build, good-looking, features freckled, fair complexion, light-coloured hair; wore a greyish-coloured ulster, greenish-coloured hat, and had with her a child five months old. She had also with her a brown-leather portmanteau, labelled "Mrs. Ticen, Wellington," the property of the offender, and two boxes of her own, one of which was painted yellow, and bore a similar address to that on the portmanteau. Offender is also charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having forged the name of Daniel Day to a promissory note for £1,000. He may assume the name of Hornby. He and the woman will likely have large sums of money in gold in their possession. Photograph of offender in Inspector's Office, Wellington.

BETWEEN 9.30 p.m. on the 17th and 10 a.m. on the 18th ultimo, at Wyndham, the wheels of two double-furrow ploughs, the property of John Meikle, were maliciously broken, and damaged to the extent of £5.

JOHN WALSH, charged on warrant with having obtained two blankets from James R. E. Hatrick by false representations, has been arrested by Sergeant-Major Francis McGovern, Hamilton Police, and sentenced to seven days' imprisonment.

A MAN, name unknown, of whom no description can be obtained, is charged with having, during June last, at Kaikoura, Marlborough District, obtained a silver lever hunting-watch, maker Rotherham, No. 1692, value £8, from Henry Steward, by false representations. Watch identifiable. He falsely represented that he was sent for the watch by Dugald McLellan, who left it with Mr. Steward for repair.

EDWARD LARKINS (whose proper name is Edward Harkins), charged on warrant with embezzling money, the property of the Graziers' Butchery Company, has been arrested.

FREDERICK TAYLOR is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with having, on the 8th February last, at Auckland, embezzled £1 10s., the property of Messrs. Booth and Tillutson, of the Auckland Dairy Company. Description: Supposed English, about twenty-six or twenty-seven years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, slight build, fair complexion, dark-brown eyes, light-brown beard whiskers and moustache, very long finger-nails; dressed in old dark clothes and white-straw hat with puggery. He recently arrived at Port Chalmers from London by the steamer "Victory," and was employed as baker or cook on board. There are several similar charges to be preferred against him.

ANDREW WILLIAM WIAPO is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with having, on the 7th ultimo, at Auckland, uttered a forged cheque for £25 to Messrs. Halenstein Brothers. Description: A Maori, a solicitor's

clerk, about twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, medium build, rather light in colour for a Maori, face unshaven, speaks English fluently; dressed in dark-worsted suit, bound with dark braid. He purchased clothes to the value of £5 19s. 10d., and in payment tendered a cheque for £25 on the Bank of New Zealand, Auckland, purporting to be drawn by J. M. Speed in favour of Dawson Farland or bearer, but did not receive any money. He left Auckland on the 8th ultimo by the steamer "Australia" for Sydney, under the name of Andrew Williams.

A. LOCKHART is charged, on warrant issued by the Coalgate Bench, with having, on the 7th ultimo, at the Windwhistle Hotel, Rakaia Gorge, obtained £1 from William Adams by means of a valueless cheque. Description: Scotch, a clerk, twenty-three years of age but looks older, 4 feet 9 or 10 inches high, stout build, fair complexion, full blue eyes, large nose, brown hair, no hair on face except very small moustache, red spot on left wrist, slightly pock-pitted on forehead, small wen on back of head; wore dark coat, plaid trousers, tweed hat, and thin fancy shoes. He is identical with Andrew Samuel Lockhart, sentenced at Nelson on the 5th November last to two months' labour for false pretences. (See *Police Gazette*, 1885, page 14.) He represented himself as a clerk belonging to the Bank of New Zealand, Christchurch. He went to Christchurch. He was convicted of false pretences at Hampden on the 16th ultimo, and was discharged from Oamaru Gaol on the following day.

JOHN WILLIAM WENTWORTH, charged on warrant with having obtained money from Max Bulling by false pretences, has been arrested by Detective Kirby, Timaru Police, and remanded to Invercargill.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

JOHN FITZGIBBONS, charged on warrant with stealing a gold locket from the Tamahere Hotel, the property of James T. Camp, has been arrested by the Paeroa Police, and sentenced to four months' imprisonment.

PETER JANSEN is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with having, on the 22nd ultimo, broken into the dwelling of Robert Bradford Church, at Thorndon Quay, Wellington, and stealing therefrom a piece of silver-mounted greenstone, about 2½ inches long, value 10s. Identification doubtful. Description: A native of Denmark, a labourer, forty-eight years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, stout build, sallow complexion, light-brown hair, clean-shaved, blue eyes, flat nose, crossed swords on left arm, bullet-wound on left side of breast. He was discharged from Wellington Gaol on the 16th ultimo, after undergoing a sentence of eighteen months' labour for larceny. He is an old offender. He left Wellington with the intention of going to Masterton to seek employment at Messrs. Beetham's station, cutting scrub.

Two men, names unknown, are charged with having, about 10.30 p.m. on the 19th ultimo, at Jetty Street, Dunedin, assaulted and robbed Adam Walker of a yellow-leather pocketbook, containing seventeen £1 notes on the Bank of New Zealand, a half-sovereign, some silver, a number of letters, and a Government Life Assurance policy for £300. Purse, letters, and assurance policy identifiable. Description: First, about twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, slight build, fair complexion, a very little fair hair on face; dressed in a very light brownish suit and black soft felt hat. Second, between thirty and thirty-five years of age, 6 feet high, stout build, dark hair beard whiskers and moustache; wore long dark overcoat and black soft felt hat. Identification doubtful.

STOLEN on the 12th ultimo, from the dwelling of James McDonald, Fox Street, South Dunedin, a brown-leather tobacco-pouch, used as a purse, containing three £1 notes, a half-sovereign, a few shillings in silver, a cheque on the National Bank for £13 10s., drawn in favour of J. or Jas. McDonald by H. Gourley and Joseph Feltham, Mayor and Councillor of St. Kilda, and signed across face by Andrew Rankin, Town Clerk, and having the St. Kilda Borough seal thereon; a cheque for £1 10s., No. 10984, on the Union Bank of Australia, drawn by A. Dornwall in favour of "Licenses or bearer;" and a ladies' long gold chain, links about ¾ inch long, value £5. Identifiable, except money. Percy Charles Elliott, ten and a half years of age, has been arrested for this offence by Constable George Edward Cowen, Port Chalmers Police. The gold chain has been recovered, and traced to his possession.

STOLEN on the 18th ultimo, from a desk in the shop of James Joseph Watkins, Brougham Street, Wellington, three £1 notes.

STOLEN on the 23rd February last, from the person of Edward Shemilt, while drunk, at Auckland, two £1 notes, an open-faced English silver lever watch, maker Heyatt, No. 6764, value £6; a gold albert chain, value £4; a nearly-new meerschaum pipe, value 10s.; and a briar-root pipe, value 2s. 6d. Identifiable except money.

STOLEN on the 6th February last, from the Ellerslie Hotel, Ellerslie, near Auckland, six nearly-new table knives and forks with ivory handles, five silver-plated dessert forks, considerably worn, and three metal tablespoons; the property of John Ellis; value £3 7s. 6d. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from the shop-window of Edward Loft, Thames Street, Oamaru, a pair of ladies' imitation-kid shoes, lined with cream-coloured sheepskin leather, size 5 or 6, no nails or heel-plates, fastens with three dark compensation buttons; value 8s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 14th ultimo, from the bar of the Royal Hotel, Port Chalmers, a bottle of Hennessy's brandy; the property of William Sachlter; value 5s.

STEALING a cash-box, containing money, &c., from the dwelling of Henry Moore Morrison, at Sunnydale, North-East Valley: The cash-box, broken open, was found on the 18th ultimo, amongst some bushes in Queen Street, Dunedin. It contained all the stolen property except the money.

STOLEN on the 23rd or 24th February last, from the person of Francis Tiernan, while drunk, at Auckland, a gold hunting lever watch, maker Rotherham, No. 31709; and an 18-carat gold albert chain, consisting of long and short links alternately; value £28. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 13th or 14th February last, from a bedroom in Pye's boardinghouse, Auckland, a nearly-new silver Waltham watch, number not known, second hand missing, and a large plain-linked brass guard, with two brass keys and an American coin, attached; the property of Daniel Raynor; value £5 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the morning of the 12th ultimo, from the dwelling of John Redding, Nith Street, Invercargill, a cedar-box, 6 by 4 inches, containing five £5 notes and five £1 notes. Box identifiable. The box was stolen while the furniture, &c., was being removed from the house during a fire in the adjoining houses.

STOLEN between the 9th and 14th ultimo, from the dwelling of Ralph Wylde Brown, at Parnell, near Auckland, a new dark-grey tweed vest, value 10s., and a silver Burmese war-medal, about the size of a crown-piece, "Pegan" marked on bar, and "R. W. Brown, Mid., H.M.S. 'Spartan,'" round edge; value 5s. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to a Mrs. McCarthy, who was employed in the house. Description: Irish, a laundress, about thirty years of age, about 5 feet 2 inches high, slight build, fair complexion, lame.

STOLEN on the 8th ultimo, from the whare of Thomas Wallis, at Cape Egmont, a nearly-new bull-dog revolver, maker's name or number not known, head of side pin through lock broken; a nearly-new pair of watertight boots, right boot cut near toe; a window, about 2 feet square, with two panes of glass; a nearly-new wooden pipe with long amber stem, a sheath-knife, Lockwood brand, three brass screws through handle; two dark-coloured woollen shirts with red-and-black stripes, a flannel undershirt, a handkerchief, "M. H. Ayland" marked with marking-ink on one of the corners; a black-bone-handle pocket-knife with two blades in one end, 4lb. of sugar, and two boxes of matches; value £4. Revolver, boots, sheath-knife, and handkerchief identifiable. Maoris suspected.

On the 18th ultimo the whare of Antoni Rizi, at Kaiwara, near Wellington, was broken into, and the following stolen: A new single-barrel gun, twist make, black wooden ramrod mounted with brass top, and screw ramrod broken at top, to which a small piece of supplejack has been glued; a double-breasted dark-tweed coat and vest, sac-make; a nearly-new double-breasted dark-check tweed vest, and an old black-cloth paget-coat with a small hole in left sleeve near shoulder; value £7. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 5th ultimo, from the person of Angus McDonald, at Martinborough, a silver lever hunting-watch, maker Rotherham, No. 6489, value £8; and a silver chain, small-link pattern, value £1 5s. Identifiable. Suspicion

attached to George Webster, supposed English, a waiter and barman, about twenty-eight years of age, about 5 feet 2 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair, no hair on face except small fair moustache. He has come to Wellington.

BETWEEN 9 p.m. on the 17th and 6 a.m. on the 18th ultimo the railway-station office at Pukekohe, Auckland District, the property of the Government, was broken into, and a till in the office forced open, but nothing was stolen. The till contained no money.

STOLEN on the 18th or 19th ultimo, from the dwelling of George Clark, Douglas Street, Ponsonby, Auckland, an open-faced silver lever watch, high glass, "George Clark, Birmingham," on dial; value £5. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 10th ultimo, from the shop-door of Tone Duck, Fleet Street, Dunedin, eleven Chinese silk magenta-coloured flowered handkerchiefs; value £1 13s.

STOLEN on the 19th ultimo, from a bedroom in the Grand Hotel, High Street, Dunedin, six £1 notes on the Bank of New Zealand, the property of Francis Traynor. Suspicion attached to John Mills, who occupied the room with complainant. Description: A native of the colony, a cook, twenty-four years of age, 5 feet 6½ inches high, medium build, dark hair, clean-shaved except dark moustache, one of eyes injured; dressed in light-tweed coat, trousers slightly darker than coat, and a new light soft felt hat. He may have gone to Oamaru or Invercargill.

### Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

STOLEN on the 18th or 19th ultimo, from the fore-castle of the barque "Tyron," at the Queen's Wharf, Wellington, a pair of knee sea-boots, a pair of dark-tweed trousers, and a pair of woollen socks; the property of Soren Sorensen; value £2. Identifiable except socks. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who was on board the barque on the evening of the 18th ultimo. Description: Supposed English, a sailor, thirty years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, stout build, full sandy beard whiskers and moustache.

STOLEN about the 27th January last, from the Wallace-town Junction Railway Siding, Southland, a bale addressed "J. Grieve & Co., Storekeepers, Wallace-town," containing five pairs of new white blankets; the property of Brown, Ewing, and Co; value £5.

STOLEN on the 9th ultimo, from a railway carriage between Dunedin and Christchurch, a despatch-bag, 18 by 9 by 9 inches, covered with black leather and mounted with brass, RAF in gold letters thereon, containing several photographs, some notepaper with stag's-head crest, and "1st Battn. Seaforth Highlanders" on blue ribbon under crest, envelopes to match, stamped in a similar manner; a book entitled "Maori Land," a book entitled "Ups and Downs of Colonial Life," a map of New Zealand, a map of Oceania, a book entitled "Life of Colonel Burnaby," an account-book with RAF in gold letters on back, and a letter of credit for £100 on Cook and Co., Sydney, from Cook, of London; the property of Richard A. Fraser. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 9th or 10th ultimo, from a paddock off Lydell Street, Invercargill, a medium-sized galvanized-iron bucket; the property of Hugh Hunter; value 4s. Identification doubtful.

STOLEN between the 4th and 16th ultimo, at the Wallace-town Junction Railway Crossing, Southland, a 57lb. box of raisins, branded JG over W; and about 8lb. of currants; the property of James Grieve and Co.; value £1 18s. 3d.

STOLEN on the 17th ultimo, from off a horse at Whenuakura, Taranaki, a nearly-new bridle with steel bit, one of bars broken, WE marked with a pen-knife on inside of forehead-band, throat-strap partly chewed; the property of William Fulton; value 5s. Identifiable. Maoris suspected.

STOLEN between the 17th and 25th February last, from on board the steamer "Tekapo," at Port Chalmers, a case with steel clasp, with Dr. Watson's name engraved thereon, containing the following surgical instruments: Six knives, various sizes, straight and curved, and some of them with two blades; an artery forceps, a pair of dressing forceps, a pair of scissors, a gum lancet, a probe, a probe-pointed bistoury, a sharp-pointed probe, curved surgical needles, assorted; some silk thread and silver wire; the property of Dr. Arthur Watson; value £5. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 14th and 16th ultimo, from the orchard of Simon Andrews, at Huirangi, Taranaki District, about 7cwt. of apples; value £3.

STOLEN on the 19th or 20th ultimo, from the yard of Edward Cartwright, Mount Eden, Auckland, two duck-wing game roosters, and a black-red game pullet, about two months old; value £1 each. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 14th and 16th ultimo, at Mechanics' Bay, Auckland, a cast-iron boat-anchor, about 14lb. weight, a spot of red paint thereon, about 8 fathoms of rope attached; the property of F. D. Fenton; value 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 25th February last, at Wangaehu, Wanganui District, a silver lever hunting-watch, maker Croftley, London, supposed number 13228, a common steel guard, fetter-link pattern, and a watch-key with "S. H. Drew" in raised letters thereon, attached; the property of Charles Wilson Burdon; value £9. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 22nd February last and the 21st ultimo, on board the ship "Connaught Ranger," between London and Port Chalmers, a dark-grey tweed single-breasted walking-coat, dark lining, a breast-pocket and two side-pockets with flaps, "Cleary, maker, Dublin," supposed marked thereon; the property of Thomas Williams; value £1 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 18th and 17th ultimo, from a box in the fore-castle of the steamer "Koranui," between Grey-mouth and Lyttelton, a silver lever hunting-watch, maker supposed to be McMahon, Strabane, Ireland, No. 28347, "Thomas Gardiner" scratched neatly on back under key-hole, and a silver chain, close-link pattern, with two three-penny pieces, attached; the property of John Murphy; value £7. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Adam Skinner, who was a steerage passenger by the steamer from Grey-mouth to Lyttelton. Description: Supposed English, a boilermaker, between forty and forty-five years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, stout build, dark complexion, dark hair, clean-shaved except dark moustache and goatee; dressed in dirty tweed coat and trousers, and black soft felt hat. He went to Christchurch.

STOLEN on the 12th ultimo, at Featherston, a bullock-hide saddle, leather reversed, in good order but considerably worn, single flaps, branded B inside flap at pommel, common flat stirrup-irons, a soldiers' cross-belt for girth, and a common bridle with round buckles and plain iron snaffle-bit; the property of William Buckridge; value £7. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 14th or 15th ultimo, from a washhouse on the premises of Thomas Martin, High Street, Dunedin, a pair of men's elastic-side boots, size 8, small round-headed nails in soles, had only been worn on two occasions; value 15s. Identifiable.

BETWEEN the 21st and 23rd ultimo, a shed at the new High School, Arthur Street, Dunedin, was broken into, and a heavy round brass trap, value £2, the property of the Government, stolen. Identifiable.

### Horse and Cattle-Stealing.

SUPPOSED stolen on the 17th February last, from Buller Road, near Reefton, a light-bay saddle-horse, aged, fifteen hands high, branded B on near shoulder, value £15; had on a saddle about two years in use, one of flaps rather loose, maker Jones, Nelson, value £3; and an old bridle, value 5s; the property of Leonard McLoughlan. Identifiable.

STOLEN during the night of the 7th February last, from a paddock at Waikiwi, near Invercargill, a black gelding, medium draught breed, four years old, about fifteen and a half hands high, white stripe down face, off-hind leg white, in rather low condition, unbranded; the property of John Henry Smith. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the morning of the 16th ultimo, at Ohaupo, a dark-brown pony, four years old, about fourteen hands high, blaze down face, hind fetlocks white, girth-galled on off side,

unbranded; the property of George Colbeck; value £5. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Henry Jones, a deserter from the American ship "Iroquois," twenty-one years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, dark complexion, small brown moustache, scar on chin, small shot-marks on neck, one of finger-nails black and coming off, sailor tattooed on one of arms; dressed in grey-tweed coat and trousers, and lace-up boots cut in front by an axe; rough sailor-like appearance. He is also suspected of stealing a small saddle with flowered flaps, newly mended across the seat; the property of a man named Ninkey; value £1. He was working at the Ohaupo Saw-mills up to the morning of the 16th ultimo. It is supposed he has gone towards Tauranga or Taupo. It is said that his friends live at the Thames.

SUPPOSED stolen during the night of the 14th ultimo, from a paddock at Warkworth, a bay mare with black points, about seven years old, about thirteen and three-quarter hands high, star on forehead, a white speck on off eye, off side of mouth torn by bit when being broken in, shod all round, unbranded; the property of Archibald Thomson; value £10. Identifiable.

STOLEN during the night of the 12th ultimo, at Featherston, a bay gelding, hack-breed, aged, fourteen and a half hands high, black points, anchor brand on near shoulder; the property of Alexander McKenzie; value £40. Identifiable. It is supposed that the person who stole this horse also stole William Buckeridge's saddle and bridle.

WILLIAM WALTERS is charged, on warrant issued by the Clive Bench, with stealing, on the 1st February last, at Clive, a roan mare, about fifteen hands high, aged, branded D on near shoulder; the property of Alfred Dyett; value £15. Description: About twenty years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, fair complexion, brown hair, no hair on face; wore blue-serge sac-coat, dark-tweed trousers, black soft felt hat, and light lace-up boots. He exchanged the mare with Samuel Crowther, hotelkeeper, Opipi, for another horse, receiving £3 to boot. He is supposed to have gone to Tauranga.

STOLEN on the 23rd or 24th ultimo, from a paddock, at Waimea Road, Nelson, a grey pony-mare, aged, about fourteen hands high, unbranded, answers to the name of Polly; the property of Andrew Bogle.

CHARLES WAKEFIELD, charged on warrant with deserting his children, has been arrested by Sergeant-Major John Bevin, Dunedin Police, and discharged.

HENRY COLE is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with deserting his wife, at Christchurch, since the 23rd ultimo.
