Incendiarism. (From New Zealand Gazette, 1885, page 127.) Offer of Free Pardon to an Accomplice.

Department of Justice,

Wellington, 21st January, 1885. WHEREAS on or about the 10th day of January instant the premises of the New Zealand Timber Company,

situated in the City of Auckland, were set on fire : This is to notify that His Excellency the Governor will grant a free pardon to any person implicated in the said act, not being the principal offender, who will give such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of any one or more of the other offenders.

Ar 9.40 p.m. on the 10th ultimo the premises of the New Zealand Timber Company, Customs Street West, Auckland, was discovered on fire, which it is supposed was maliciously caused, by which property to the value of £3,000 was de-stroyed. The building, stock, and machinery were insured in the Norwich Union Office for £3,000. A reward of £100 and a free pardon to an accomplice are offered for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons who caused the fire.

BETWEEN 7 and 8 p.m. on the 9th December last an old two-roomed cottage at Ashburton Forks, Canterbury Disby fire. The cottage was insured in the United Insurance Office for £60, which amount is in excess of what it was worth.

ABOUT 10.50 p.m. on the 30th December last, at Winton, a house, the property of Thomas Sellars, was maliciously set on fire, but the fire was discovered and extinguished before much damage was done. A heap of rags saturated with kerosene oil was found on fire in one of the rooms. Sellars left the house at 8 p.m. on the date of the fire, leaving it unlocked. His property was not insured. The adjoining house was occupied by Henry Crawford, a shoemaker, who had his clothing, &c., insured for £50, which is largely in excess of its value. The insurance company have since cancelled his policy of insurance.

On the 5th or 6th ultimo, at Ryal Bush, Southland, about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  cords of firewood, the property of William Baird, value  $\pounds 1$  10s., was destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was maliciously caused.

SETTING fire to a house at Leeston, occupied by Thomas Frankish: Elizabeth Ireland, who was employed as a ser-vant in the house, has been arrested for this offence by Constable W. J. Simpson, Leeston Police, and committed for trial.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

ELI JONES, *alias* Robert Winters, charged with having uttered a forged cheque to Richard Trueman, at Waikari, has been arrested by Constable Thomas Whitty, Waiau Police.

ROBERT EVERETT FRANKLIN is charged, on warrant issued by the Supreme Court, Auckland, with absconding from his bail to appear at the Supreme Court, Auckland, at 10.30 a.m. on the 12th ultimo, to answer a charge of perjury committed at the Resident Magistrate's Court, Whangarei. Descrip-tion: English, a brewer, about twenty-five years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, medium build, oval face, fresh com-plexion, pleasant expression, brown hair, thin brown moustache, small thin side whiskers, brown hair, thin brown mous-tache, small thin side whiskers, brown eyes, slightly stooped when walking; when last seen wore brown-tweed paget-coat and vest with light spots through material, light-tweed trousers, and black hard felt hat. He is supposed to have left Auckland on the 6th ultimo by mail steamer for San Francisco.

HARRY AUSTIN REVELL is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with having, on the 31st December last, at Auckland, uttered a forged promissory note for £15 to Samuel Cohen. Description: Supposed a native of Tara-naki, a blacksmith, twenty-two years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, rather stout build, dark complexion, dark hair, clean-shaved except small dark moustache. He was seen at Onehuwas on the 10th ultimo supposed on his way to Onchunga on the 10th ultimo, supposed on his way to Taranaki. The promissory note purports to be signed by F. W. Revoll, the offender's uncle.

FRANCIS TUKE, charged on warrant with having uttered a forged cheque to Thomas Harrison, has been arrested by Sergeant Andrew Clarke, Auckland Police, and remanded to Dunedin.

DURING the night of the 30th December last a number of flowers and plants were maliciously pulled out of the ground in the garden of Charles Winkleman, at Poto, Kaipara Heads, and damaged to the extent of £5.

On the 11th ultimo, at Invercargill Jetty, the brake of a railway-truck laden with timber was maliciously raised, which caused the truck to run into a shed, the property of the Invercargill Corporation, damaging it to the extent of £4.

BETWEEN the 13th December last and the 13th ultimo, at Tauranga, six holes were maliciously cut with a knife in three lengths of the fire brigade canvas hose, the property of the Tauranga Borough Council, damaging it to the extent of £1 10s.

On the morning of the 23rd ultimo a stone was maliciously thrown through one of the plate-glass windows of the Bank of New Zealand, New Plymouth, damaging it to the extent of £3.

#### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

STOLEN on the 16th ultimo, from the person of Robert Scott, while drunk in the Studholme Junction Hotel, Studholme Junction, Canterbury District, an English silver lever hunting-watch, "Adair" on dial-plate, No. 12422; value £8. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to John Ramsay and William Johnston, who were drinking with complainant. Description: Ramsay is a native of London, a labourer, between thirty and thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, very stout build, dark complexion, black hair, short thick black beard whiskers and moustache; dressed in dark-tweed paget-coat and vest, light-grey striped moleskin trousers, black soft felt hat, and water-tight boots. Johnston is Scotch, a labourer, thirty years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair beard and moustache; wore dark-tweed frock-coat and vest, light-plaid moleskin trousers, soft black-felt hat, and watertight boots.

STOLEN on the 7th or 8th ultimo, from the person of George William Hutchison, while drunk, at Auckland, a diamond scarf-pin, star pattern, value £35; three £5 notes and four £1 notes on the Bank of Australasia, Nelson, and about £16 in sovereigns, half-sovereigns, and silver. Pin identifiable.

BETWEEN the 3rd and 5th ultimo the store of James Thomas Johns, Mount Albert, Auckland District, was broken into, and the following stolen: Light glass tumblers containing strawberry jam, two bottles of essence, a bottle of limejuice and glycerine, eight reels of black - cotton thread, a packet of needles, a small box of chocolate chestnuts, two cakes, a pair of scissors, two small black-and-white worsted table-mats, and a ladies' navy-blue bodice; value £2. Bodice only identifiable.

ABOUT midnight on the 17th ultimo, at Lyttelton, Jacob Semolen was assaulted and robbed of four £1 notes, a halfsovereign, and 6s. in silver, by three firemen belonging to the steamer "Arawa." He was drunk at the time, and can neither describe nor identify the offenders.

Between 6 p.m. on the 3rd and 3.30 p.m. on the 4th ultimo the store of Thomas Henry Glover, Rennal Street, Ponsonby, Auckland, was broken into, and the following stolen: 12 yards of pink check gingham, 3 yards of plain sateen, a black-cashmere cloak lined with white fur, a blackcashmere cloak lined with grey-and-white fur, a brown-fur cape lined with brown satin, an old black-cashmere dress trimmed with crape, a ladies' grey waterproof with cape trimmed with black braid, a ladies' drab ulster, a dark-green cloth dress trimmed with dark-green braid, worn; a dark french merino dress, worn; a new bluish-grey dress trimmed with grey ribbon, a greyish-green dress trimmed with darkgrey ribbon and lace, a black-cloth ulster with feather-trimming on cape and sleeves, 30 yards of muslin, daisy pattern; 13 yards of brown gingham, 15 yards of blue nuns' veiling, 15 yards of dark-counterpane, a pair of lace-up shoes, a pair of buttoned shoes, several pieces of ladies' underclothing marked "E. A. Gardener" and "E. R. Gardener," several white-linen shirts, flannel shirts, and merino under-shirts (men's), a pair of grey-tweed trousers, a black single-breasted coat and vest, a new carving knife and fork, makers Batger and Co., Sheffield; the property of Emily Rose Gardener;

value £40. Identifiable, except dress-material. Also a portmanteau containing men's soiled underclothing, a plain snaffle-bridle, and a cheese about 30lb. weight; the property of Thomas Henry Glover; value £4. Identifiable, except cheese.

STOLEN on the 19th ultimo, from the whare of Patrick Hyland, Wakanui, Canterbury District, a nearly-new greytweed sac-coat, size 7, three outside pockets; a nearly-new pair of brown-cloth trousers and vest, a piece of bacon, and a small piece of bread; value £2 13s. Identification doubtful. A swagman suspected.

STOLEN on the 14th ultimo, from the dwelling of William Oakley, Peeress Town, Timaru, a ladies' silver half-hunting Geneva watch, No. 28433, a small round glass in centre of case, a long old-fashioned silver guard attached; value £3 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 8th and 20th December last, from a box in the whare of Charles Matthews, near Alexandra, Auckland District, a £1 note on the Bank of New Zealand, £1 10s. in gold, and 2s. in silver.

STOLEN on the 15th ultimo, from the person of G. A. Adams, while drunk in the Somerset Hotel, Ashburton, an English silver lever hunting-watch, opens at back, makers believed to be Russell and Sons, Liverpool, No. 98232, "Made expressly for T. R. Proctor, Christehurch and Hokitika," engraved on back. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from the shop of James Rhodes, at Patea, a pair of men's watertight boots, size  $7\frac{1}{2}$ , with nails in soles and tips on heels; value £1. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who was seen in the shop. Description: About thirty-five years of age, 5 feet 5 or 6 inches high, dark hair and whiskers; dressed in dirty grey clothes, white-moleskin trousers, and brownish hat.

STOLEN on the 10th or 11th ultimo, from the Post Office, at Dipton, a letter containing a cheque for £6 6s. on the Colonial Bank, Invercargill, drawn by Richard English in favour of Lang Brothers or bearer; a cheque for £2 12s. on the Bank of New Zealand, Invercargill, drawn by James Dore in favour of William Clarke or bearer; an invoice from Fleming and Gilkison, a receipt for signature by Fleming and Gilkison, and a half sheet of notepaper signed "W. Clarke." The letter was posted at Dipton on the 10th ultimo by William Clarke, and was addressed to "Messrs. Fleming and Gilkison, Flour Merchants, &c., Invercargill." The cheques were abstracted and cashed, and the letter with the other enclosures reposted at Winton on the 15th ultimo. The envelope does not bear the Dipton postmark.

STOLEN on the 15th or 16th ultimo, from the Alexandra. Hotel, Alexandra, Auckland District, a brown-leather bag with two clasps, a cheque-book, a requisition-book, a fieldbook, a diary, and a letter addressed to "Lawrence Cussen, Surveyor;" the property of William Cussen; value £1 10s. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Kerapa Toha, Rangatira, a Maori, about 5 feet 8 or 9 inches, stout build, dark moustache, very little beard or whiskers, good-looking. He was dismissed from the Constabulary in October last.

STOLEN on the 27th ultimo, from a bedroom in Thomas's boardinghouse, Customhouse Street, Wellington, a browntweed coat, a pair of very dark trousers, and a vest; the property of Zachariah Ashley; value £2. Second, about sixteen years of age, about 5 feet 2 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair; dressed in dark-cloth coat and vest, dirty moleskin trousers, and black-felt hat.

STOLEN between the 18th and 26th ultimo, from a bedroom in the Tenui Hotel, Tenui, an English silver-lever hunting watch, no maker's name thereon, number not known, AM over Tenui in circle on front case; a silver chain, rope pattern, with three band or knots thereon, a half-rupec, and a six-cent piece attached; the property of Alexander Mulvay; value £5 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 20th ultimo, from the shop of Samuel Herringshaw, Pollen Street, Grahamstown, a ham, 9lb. weight; value 9s.

STOLEN on the 3rd ultimo, from the hut of Alexander Gillander, Anama Station, Canterbury District, a brown-andwhite tartan-plaid jacket, value £2; a patent-leather belt, 3 inches wide, value 3s.; and a common-leather purse, containing three £1 notes and 8s. 3d. in silver. Jacket and belt identifiable. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who was permitted by complainant to sleep in the hut on the previous night. Description: English, a labourer, about twenty-seven years of age, about 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, medium build, light-brown whiskers, small fair moustache; dressed in blue-cloth coat, coloured-moleskin trousers, and tweed hat; smart appearance; carried a grey-blanket swag. He went south.

BETWEEN 5.30 p.m. on the 6th and 7.40 a.m. on the 7th ultimo the foundry of Thomas Atkinson, Tuam Street, Christchurch, was broken into, and an attempt made to break open a drawer of a safe which was in the office, and which contained money. # Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

Description: Irish, a miner, about fifty years of age, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, medium build, sallow complexion, small grey eyes rather weak-looking, dark-brown hair, very thick full beard whiskers and moustache clipped short and turning grey, shoulders slightly stooped; when last seen wore dark-grey tweed suit and black hard felt hat. It is supposed he has gone to Auckland.

STOLEN on the 15th ultimo, on board the steamer "Arawa," at Lyttelton, a dark-tweed overcoat, a black-cloth dress-coat and vest, and two white ties; the property of Alfred Gosling; value £4. Identifiable, except ties. Firemen belonging to the steamer suspected.
