### Incendiarism.

ABOUT 2 p.m. on the 29th ultimo, at Tahoraite, Hawke's Bay District, an attempt was made to set fire to a pile of planking, the property of Mullinger, Brett, and Co., by placing a piece of ignited timber under the planking.

BETWEEN the 29th ultimo and 4th instant a whare, containing a number of bush-tools, value about £40, situate in McLeod's bush, near Helensville, the property of James and Andrew McLeod, was with contents maliciously destroyed by fire.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

FRANK DALY, charged on warrant with embezzling £5 and other sums, the property of James Webley, has been arrested by Sergeant John W. Ellison, Wellington Police, and remanded to Christchurch, and committed for trial.

DANIEL SULLIVAN is charged, on warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench, with having, on the 25th ultimo, at Oamaru, rescued a prisoner from the custody of John Oliver while being conveyed to the police-station for having been found by night, without lawful excuse, in Mr. Oliver's enclosed yard. Description: Irish, a boot-factory-hand and labourer, eighteen or nineteen years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, medium build, swarthy complexion, dark hair, beard and moustache commencing to grow; generally wears dark-tweed suit and black soft felt hat; broad Irish accent. Supposed to have gone to Kurow. He was summoned for the offence, but he did not appear.

JOSEPH GUILFORD, *alias* Kelly, is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with having, on the 22nd ultimo, maliciously broken a window, value 5s., in a dwelling in Murphy Street, Wellington; the property of Owen Daly. Description: A native of New South Wales, a sailor, twenty-two years of age, 5 feet 4 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair beard whiskers and moustache, blind of left eye; heart, arrow, and bracelet tattooed on left arm, and cross and bracelet on right arm. He was sentenced on

the 18th October last, at Wellington, to one month's labour for larceny. (See *Police Gazette*, 1885, page 209.) He is supposed to have gone to the Wairarapa District.

ABOUT 1.30 p.m., on the 6th instant two panes of glass, value £3, were maliciously broken in the shop-window of William Hutchinson, Vivian Street, Wellington.

ON the 17th ultimo, at Waitira Bay, Kenepuru, Marlborough District, a steer, the property of William Henderson, was maliciously shot dead, and another steer, also his property, was maliciously wounded in two places with bullets to such an extent that the animal had to be destroyed; both value £14. Adam Thompson, about sixty years of age, who resides in the neighbourhood, was arrested for the offence, but he was discharged for want of sufficient evidence.

ABOUT 10 p.m. on the 8th instant, at Carterton, a large pane of glass, value £2, the property of C. G. Beckett, was maliciously broken in one of the windows of the *Observer* printing office.

THE boat, the property of Mary F. Dehan, which was maliciously let adrift at Okarito, has been recovered.

BETWEEN the 1st and 18th instant, at the Wellington and Manawatu Railway-station, three tarpaulins, the property of the Wellington and Manawatu Railway Company, were maliciously cut in several places.

ON the 6th instant, at Ashburton, four panes of glass were maliciously broken in the windows of the dwelling of Thomas Gollins, and two nests of hen-eggs, containing twenty-six eggs, maliciously broken, thereby doing damage to the extent of £1.

ABOUT midnight on the 13th instant, at Balclutha, a number of stones were maliciously thrown on the roof of the dwelling of the Rev. John Smith, and two through the front window, thereby doing damage to the extent of 10s.

BETWEEN the 1st and 16th instant two counterfeit half-sovereigns were paid into the National Bank, at Dunedin. The coins are a very good imitation, but they are a little dull in the ring, and are lighter in weight than genuine half-sovereigns. One of them is very much worn, and has the appearance of having been in circulation for some considerable time; the other is dated 1878.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

KO MAKI is charged, on warrant issued by the Kawakawa Bench, with stealing, on the 22nd May last, from the dwelling of Thomas C. Grant, at Ruapekapeka, a pair of trousers, a bridle, two girths, and a bag containing sundry articles; value £4 10s. Identifiable. Description: A Maori, about twenty-five years of age, about 5 feet 8 inches high, medium

build, large prominent lips, smart appearance. Supposed to be in the King country. His father lives at Ruapekapeka.

STOLEN between 10 p.m. on the 24th and 11 a.m. on the 29th ultimo, from a bedroom in the Commercial Hotel, Auckland, a silver Geneva hunting-watch and a gold chain; value £10, since recovered; the property of Edward Qualtrough. The property was subsequently pawned at Levy's pawn office by a girl, who gave her name as Williamson, which may be a fictitious name. Description: About fifteen years of age, tall, slight build, fair hair; wore dark-merino dress. Identification doubtful.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with stealing, on the 9th instant, from the shop of William Sherlock, Oxford Terrace, Christchurch, an American cane-chair, value 7s. 6d., since recovered. Description: English, said he was a draper, about thirty years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, medium build, dark blotchy complexion as if from drink, dark eyes, very red nose, close-shaved except small dark side-whiskers. Identifiable. He sold the chair on the day it was stolen at a second-hand dealer's shop.

STOLEN on the 10th or 11th instant, from the dwelling of Frederick Carrington, at Havelock, Hawke's Bay, four £1 notes, two half-sovereigns, and 15s. in silver.

STOLEN on the 4th instant, from the Clarendon Hotel, Napier, a grey-tweed overcoat, with plaid lining, two outside breast-pockets, fly button-holes; the property of William Henry Fordham; value £2 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN during the night of the 5th instant, from a bedroom in the Clyde Hotel, Wairoa, eight or nine £1 notes on the Bank of New Zealand; the property of John Fraser.

STOLEN about the 4th instant, from a tent at the railway-works, Coleman's Camp, Punui, near Kihikihi, a red-morocco purse with three compartments and clasp, containing two £5 notes on the Bank of New Zealand, and about £1 in silver; the property of James McIntyre. Purse identifiable.

REPORTED larceny of a watch from the person of John Maxwell, at Whangarei: It has now been ascertained that Maxwell sold the watch, and that it was not stolen from him.

STOLEN between the 2nd and 18th ultimo, from the warehouse of A. and R. Nixon, at Waipu, Auckland District, seven £1 notes, a sovereign, and a half-sovereign.

JAMES DUNGAN, alias Malcolm Christian, suspected of stealing a watch and chain from the Prebbleton Hotel, Prebbleton, the property of Robert John Rutledge, has been arrested by Constable Andrew Morgan, Hurunui Police, and committed for trial. The watch and chain have been recovered.

BREAKING into the drill-shed, at Palmerston North, and stealing a cornet, the property of Captain James Carroll: The cornet has been recovered. It was found under the drill-shed.

STOLEN on the 6th or 7th instant, from the kitchen of the Clifton Hotel, Beaumont, Otago, a ham, about 21lb.; the property of Robert Coskery; value £1 1s.

THE clothing, the property of John Arthur, stolen from the Hampden Hotel, Hampden, has been recovered except the two shirts, and traced to the possession of Edward Fitzgerald, arrested by Detective Terence O'Brien, Oamaru Police, and sentenced to one month's labour.

STOLEN on the 1st instant, from a bedroom in the Victoria Dining-rooms, Victoria Street, Auckland, a gold open-face lever watch with gold dial, maker's name and number not known, value £15; and about 24 yards of white-silk dress-material, value £7; the property of Thomas Quoi. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 26th ultimo, from a chest of drawers in a bedroom in the Victoria Dining-rooms, Victoria Street, Auckland, a cash-box containing about £70 in notes, gold, and silver, a gold dollar-coin with a small ring attached, gentlemen's gold ring with large diamond in claw-setting, a massive gold ring with imitation diamond, and some deeds and receipts; the property of Thomas Quoi. Identifiable except money. The cash-box was found empty on the following morning.

BREAKING into and stealing from the store of Burton Charles Lawrence, at Waitara: The saddle has been recovered, but the stirrup-leathers and irons and one of the girths have not been recovered. It was found secreted in Lepper's Bush, about five miles from Waitara.

STOLEN on the 11th instant, from a dwelling at Brunswick Line, Wanganui, a dark-tweed coat and vest, the property of William Mann, value £1 15s.; and two pairs of dark woollen knitted socks, the property of John Sullivan, value 5s. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Alfred Sullivan, a sailor and labourer, about twenty-two years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, very dark complexion, black hair, no hair on face except dark moustache; wore dark-knitted jacket, dark trousers, and blue-cloth stitched hat. He has not been long in the colony. Supposed to have gone in the direction of New Plymouth.

STOLEN on the 19th instant, from the person of Martin Johnsen, while asleep in the Lyttelton Hotel, Lyttelton, a silver lever hunting-watch, maker Stanton, number 3972, and a 9-carat gold chain, round-link pattern, a large and small link alternately; value £14. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 18th or 19th instant, from the City Buffet Hotel, Wellington, a black-cloth overcoat, lined with black-twill silk, sleeves lined with striped satin, the chief colour being yellow, lining of one sleeve torn; the property of Oswald Spottiswoode Brodie; value £2. Identifiable.

Bag and purse identifiable.

STOLEN on the 2nd instant, from an office at the soap- and candle-works, Otahuhu, a new silver lever hunting-watch, makers International Watch Company, No. 15298, a leather boot-lace attached; the property of Edward Haydon; value £3 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 4th and 9th instant, from a bedroom at the Gear Meat Company's premises, Lambton Quay, Wellington, a ladies' silver Geneva hunting-watch, maker Urquart, Christchurch, number not known, and a gold-mounted hair-guard, with gold stirrup and seal attached; the property of Arthur Marsden; value £8. THE postage-stamps stolen from the bar of the hotel of William Balmforth, at Patea, have been traced by Constable Sparke, Patea Police, to the possession of Alfred E. Y. Pearson, nine and a half years of age, who was convicted of the offence, and committed to the Auckland Industrial School until he attains the age of fifteen years.

AT 1.30 a.m. on the 6th instant an attempt was made to burglariously enter the dwelling of Eli Hurslion, Clyde Quay, Wellington. A tin billycan and a common white-china cup were stolen at the time from the yard of the house; value 2s. Identification doubtful.

BETWEEN 5 p.m. on the 25th and 8 a.m. on the 26th ultimo the office of the Brick and Tile Company, near the railway-wharf, Auckland, was broken into, and four cigars and a cake of tobacco, value 2s. 6d., stolen.

STOLEN between 6 p.m. on the 21st and 4 p.m. on the 23rd ultimo, from the Commercial Hotel, Auckland, a black-frieze overcoat, value £2, since recovered; the property of J. McLean. The coat was subsequently pawned at Asher's pawn office by a man who gave his name as William Burgoyne, which may be a fictitious name. Description: About



twenty-one years of age, medium height, florid complexion, clean-shaved except dark moustache; respectable appearance. Identification doubtful.

STOLEN between the 7th and 23rd ultimo, from the Commercial Hotel, Auckland, a new black mackintosh overcoat; the property of T. Grice; value £2 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 1st instant, from a bedroom in the Albion Hotel, Napier, five £1 notes; the property of Frank Judge.

STOLEN on the 14th or 15th instant, from the blacksmith's shop of James Reid, at Mandeville, Southland District, a drilling-brace 2 feet 9 inches long, a carpenters' iron brace with steel bit, 14 inches long, and two files, a piece cut off one; value £1.

Malet. Identifiable.

STOLEN between 11 p.m. on the 10th and 5.30 a.m. on the 11th instant, from a stable at Ponsonby Road, Auckland, a bay mare with black points, four years old, 14 hands high, switch tail, space for bridle cut out of mane, in fair condition, newly shod; the property of Robert Gray; value £10. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Frederick Harris, *alias* Johnston, about twenty years of age, 5 feet 4 inches high, medium build, fair hair and complexion, no hair on face; usually wears grey-tweed suit. He is supposed to have gone to Drury or Hawke's Bay.

### Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

JOHN WHELAN is charged, on warrant issued by the Lyell Bench, with having made use of obscene language, at Lyell, on the 15th ultimo. Description: Irish, a gold-miner, forty-nine years of age, 6 feet  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches high, stout

build, grey eyes, sallow complexion, clean-shaved except a tuft of grey hair on chin. Supposed to have gone to the Brunerton coal-mines.

SAMUEL CORNEY is charged, on warrant issued by the New Plymouth Bench, with disobeying an order to pay 15s. per week towards the support of his children. Description: English, a cabinetmaker, thirty-two years of age, 5 feet 6½ inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark-brown hair beard whiskers and moustache, erect gait, walks with a quick step; when last seen wore dark-tweed suit and black hard felt hat, but he may now be dressed differently, and be cleaned-shaved for the purpose of disguise. Supposed to have gone to Waitara or Auckland. He was £5 10s. in arrears on the 27th October last.

JOHN LARKINS, charged on warrant with disobeying a summons to answer a charge of assaulting the police and making use of obscene language, has been arrested by Constables Nixon Scott and John Haddock, Aratapu and Dargaville Police, and remanded to Kawakawa.

JOHN MAHER is charged, on warrant issued by the Timaru Bench, with failing to pay 10s. 6d., due for his maintenance, in October last, while in Timaru Gaol, suffering from the effects of drunkenness. Description: Irish, a labourer, forty-five years of age, 5 feet 5½ inches high, fresh complexion, grey eyes, large nose, dark hair; usually wears dirty dark-tweed suit. (See *Police Gazette*, 1884, page 33.) He was seen in Waimate early last month, and is now supposed to be working on a station in South Canterbury.

WILLIAM SMITH, *alias* Cox, *alias* Cocky, is charged on warrant of commitment to Wellington Gaol for seven days' labour, issued by the Wellington Bench, in default of paying £1 fine and £1 9s. costs for having, on the 4th ultimo, at Wellington, committed a nuisance in a railway-carriage on the Wellington and Masterton Railway-line. Description: English, a plasterer, sixty-three years of age, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, grey hair, clean-shaved except short grey moustache, grey eyes with tender lids; usually wears faded light-grey tweed-suit and small black soft hat; slightly stooped when walking.

THOMAS O'BRIEN is charged on warrant of commitment to Wanganui Gaol for seven days' labour, issued by the Wanganui Bench, in default of paying £1 fine and 7s. costs for being drunk in a railway-carriage, at Eastown, on the 24th ultimo. Description: About thirty years of age, looked like a labourer, about 5 feet 7 inches high, medium build, fresh fair complexion, fair hair beard whiskers and moustache; wore dark-grey tweed suit and white soft felt hat.

HENRY STEWART is charged on warrant of commitment to New Plymouth Gaol for seven days' imprisonment, issued by the Patea Bench, in default of paying a fine of £2 and costs for being drunk. Description: English, a butcher, twenty-eight years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, slight build, dark complexion, dark hair moustache and goatee; wore dark coat, grey-tweed trousers, and drab soft felt hat. He was seen near Kakaramea on the 15th instant, but is now supposed to be in the neighbourhood of Woodville. He may go to Auckland.

INFORMATION is requested respecting Matilda Blue, a native of Ireland, a prostitute, about thirty-three years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, upper front teeth out. ### Extracts from New Zealand Gazette.

#### *Conditions for Trout-fishing in Counties of Grey and Inangahua.*

WM. F. DRUMMOND JERVOIS,  
Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations for the Counties of Grey and Inangahua:—

1. Any holder of a license as hereinafter mentioned may fish with rod and line for trout in each river or stream in the Counties of Grey and Inangahua from the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, both inclusive, but only between the hours of five o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock in the evening.

2. Licenses to fish with rod and line in the said waters will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Grey District Acclimatisation Society, at Greymouth, and for every license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged.

3. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with rod and line.

4. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall, on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any ranger, police officer, or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, ranger, police officer, or constable his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

5. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length, taken by any person fishing as aforesaid, shall be immediately returned alive into the water; and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

6. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any lake, river, or stream within the above district; and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

7. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed, into any lake, river, or stream in the said district, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

8. These regulations shall come into force as from the date hereof.
