### Incendiarism.

ABOUT 1 o'clock on the morning of the 17th ultimo, at Hillend, Southland District, eighty-four bags of oats and a stack of straw, the property of Martin Silk, were maliciously set on fire and destroyed, except about forty bags of the oats, which were saved in a damaged condition. The fire extended to a threshing-mill, the property of William Cooper, value about £50, which was totally destroyed. The threshing-mill was insured by James Thomson, of Winton Plain, for £120, in the New Zealand Office.

ABOUT 1 o'clock on the morning of the 19th ultimo an unoccupied house, at New Plymouth, the property of the trustees in the estate of the late Robert Chilman, was maliciously set on fire, by which it was destroyed. The house was insured for £300 in the New Zealand Office. A reward of £50 is offered for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons who set fire to the house.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

THOMAS WEDDINGTON, charged on warrant with having obtained £3 from Edward Brown by false pretences, has been arrested by Detective Maurice O'Connor, Christchurch Police, and remanded to Dunedin.

JONATHAN RANKIN HENDERSON, charged on warrant with embezzling money, the property of the Equitable Life Assurance Society, is supposed to have gone to Melbourne. A letter for him, addressed to Melbourne, was recently posted at Balclutha, supposed by his brother.

ON the morning of the 1st instant the pound at Hawera, the property of William Jackson, was broken open and five head of cattle rescued therefrom.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having indecently exposed his person to Minnie Shannon and May Palmer, at Clifton Terrace, Wellington, at 4.30 p.m. on the 8th instant.

Description: About thirty years of age, 5ft. 6in. or 7in. high, medium build, sallow complexion, dark eyes, light-brown hair, clean-shaved except light-brown moustache; wore dark sac-coat and hard black-felt hat. Identifiable.

ON the 1st or 2nd instant, at Taharoa, near Otonga, Auckland District, a cow, value £6, the property of Eru Nehua, was maliciously shot dead.

ABOUT the 30th ultimo, at Eweburn, near Naseby, thirty bags containing corn, the property of R. and T. Inder, were maliciously cut, thereby doing damage to the extent of £1 10s.

JAMES C. HEATON, *alias* H. H. Waddell, *alias* Worrall, is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with having, on the 15th January last, at Wellington, uttered a forged promissory note for £145 to Lionel Harris, from whom he obtained £80 on the forged note. Description: English, looks like a clerk, thirty years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, slender build, fair complexion, dark-yellow hair, clean-shaved except sandy moustache and very small side whiskers, rather round-shouldered, near-sighted; wore black-worsted cloth coat and vest, light-tweed trousers, and black hard felt hat. The forged note was drawn in favour of James C. Heaton, and purported to be signed by Cuff and Graham, shipping agents, Christchurch. The note and a letter purporting to have been sent to offender, at Wellington, were stamped "Cuff and Graham, Shipping Agents, Christchurch." It has been ascertained that a man of offender's description got three rubber-stamps of this description made at Auckland on the 4th January last. He is believed to be identical with H. H. Waddell, *alias* Worrall, charged on warrant with forgery committed at Dunedin. (See *Police Gazette*, 1885, pages 183 and 193.)

WILLIAM CAMERON is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with having, on the 7th instant, attempted to obtain £10 at the Post Office Savings Bank, Napier, by false representations. Description: A native of the colony, a labourer, about twenty-four years of age, 5ft. 10in. or 11in. high, slight build, thin features, pale complexion, small fair moustache, may have a few scattered hairs on sides of face; wore dirty light-tweed suit and light-coloured soft felt hat; dirty appearance. He is supposed to have gone to Patea, Hawke's Bay District. He obtained possession of a post office savings bank book, with £10 to credit, belonging to his brother, Dougald Cameron, and tore his brother's name out of the book and inserted his own name, and presented the book at the savings bank, representing that he was the depositor, and making a demand for the £10.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, and from Dwellings.

THOMAS GILLON, *alias* Gallin, *alias* Dillon, *alias* Maurice O'Conner, charged on warrant with breaking into and stealing from the dwelling of James Laine, has been arrested by Constable Thomas Nestor, Amberley Police, remanded to

Kaiapoi, and committed for trial. None of the stolen property has been recovered.

JAMES SHEARER, *alias* Sherrin, *alias* Stewart, &c., is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, on the 28th ultimo, at Christchurch, stolen a silver lever hunting-watch, value £3 17s. 6d., and £12 in notes, supposed on the Colonial Bank, from the person of Arthur Miller, while drunk. Description: Scotch, a seaman, forty-two years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, grey hair, and blue eyes, wreath tattooed on back of left hand; wore dark-grey-tweed suit and soft black hat. (See *Police Gazette*, 1885, page 218.) He pawned the watch at Christchurch. He may seek employment as a labourer or seaman.

TURE is charged, on warrant issued by the Wairoa Bench, with stealing, on the 28th April last, from the tent of Ralph Ashley, at Mangaarahu, Hawke's Bay District, a pair of lace-up boots, value 10s., since recovered. Description: A Maori, about twenty years of age, 5ft. 6½in. high, medium build, rather large mouth and nose; when last seen wore dark-tweed clothes and soft black-felt hat. He is supposed to be hiding in the bush about Opoiti.

On the 6th instant the dwelling of Ah Hing, Welshman's Gully, Waikaiti, was broken into and about 56lb. of rice, value £1 5s., stolen.

pendant mounted with gold round edge attached; two 9-carat-gold shirt-studs, plain pattern; a small gold stud with crystal setting, two abyssinian gold sleeve-links with anchor on each part, a silk handkerchief with blue and yellow crosses, a £1 note, ONE (in square) in centre, bank not known, No. 2 over M 12108, and 4s. 6d. in silver. Identifiable except silver.

STOLEN on the 26th or 27th ultimo, from a till in the butchers' shop of Tanner Brothers, Tauranga, £1 9s. 6d. in silver, amongst which were two sixpences, one having a hole punched through it, and the other having a dinge in it, which are supposed to be identifiable.

STOLEN between the 15th April last and the 5th instant, from the Empire Hotel, Thames, a rather long black overcoat with large collar of same material, skirt divided from waist to bottom and furnished with buttons, very thick woollen material, unlined, diagonal pocket on each breast, sloping downwards from outside, and a diagonal pocket at each side of waist, a vertical pocket above one of breast-pockets, dark medium-sized horn buttons; the property of Charles Kalman; value £3 10s. EDWARD DOBREEN, charged on warrant with neglecting to support his wife and child, may be living with his brother at Blenheim, or he may be at Havelock.

CHARLES SMITHEL, charged on warrant with deserting his wife and children, has been arrested by Constable William W. Smart, Kaikoura Police, and remanded to Ashburton.

WILLIAM GRIFFIN, charged on warrant with deserting his wife and children, is about thirty years of age, and about 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high.

JOHN WOODCOCK is charged on warrant of commitment to Invercargill Gaol for forty-eight hours' labour, issued by the Invercargill Bench, in default of paying £1 fine and 10s. costs for a breach of "The Dog Registration Act, 1880." Description: English, usually employed as a bricklayers' and plasterers' labourer, about forty-eight years of age, about 5ft. 8in. high, medium build, erect gait, dark complexion, hair turning grey, clean-shaved; generally wears dark coat and vest, white-moleskin trousers, heavy watertight boots, black soft felt hat, and red handkerchief round neck; speaks loudly, and has a slight impediment in speech.

JOHN McAllister, James McAllister, Charles Wynn, and Alfred Fowler absconded from the Kohimarama Industrial School, near Auckland, on the 14th instant. Description: John McAllister is about thirteen years of age. James McAllister is about eleven-and-a-half years of age. They are brothers, and their parents live at the Thames. Wynn is about twelve years of age. His mother lives at the North Shore. Fowler is thirteen years of age. His father is a handcart porter, and lives in Swanson Street. They all wore tweed coats and moleskin trousers. John Keenan, who was licensed from the school, absconded from his situation in November last. William Ingham absconded from the school on the 26th ultimo. He took with him a large swag containing clothing and blankets belonging to the Government. Bertie Ford, *alias* Levey, and John Watts, each about twelve years of age, absconded from the school in March last. It is requested that special efforts be made to discover the whereabouts of these boys.

### Deserters from Her Majesty's Service.

Description: Dwyer is a native of Cahir, County Tipperary, a stoker, about twenty years of age, 5ft. 10½in. high, fresh complexion, brown hair, and blue eyes. Hodgson is a native of Essex, nineteen years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, fresh complexion, brown hair, hazel eyes, American crest on right forearm. #### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:
