Incendiarism.

On the morning of the 28th January last, at Winton Bush, Southland District, a stable and barn, the property of Sophia Kidd, were maliciously destroyed by fire. The buildings were insured in the South British Office for £200, which sum is said to be about double what they were worth.

ABOUT 2 p.m. on the 11th ultimo, at Wyndham, a stack of oats, the property of Robert Kidd, was maliciously set on fire, but the fire was extinguished before any damage was done. It is supposed that the stack was set on fire with phosphorus. About half an hour afterwards some hay, about 30yds. from the stack of oats, took fire, doing damage to the extent of £4.

ABOUT 8.30 p.m. on the 24th ultimo an unoccupied four-roomed house in Walton's Road, Mataura, the property of Elizabeth Turnbull, was maliciously set on fire, by which it was destroyed. The house was insured in the New Zealand Office for £100, which sum is said to be in excess of what it was worth.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

ALEXANDER THOMPSON, charged on warrants with breaches of "The Bankruptcy Act, 1883," committed at Wellington, has been arrested by the Sydney Police, and discharged, the creditors not desiring to have him brought back, owing to the difficulty in now finding some of the witnesses for the prosecution.

JOHN ROBINSON, charged on warrant with uttering a forged cheque for £10 5s. to Robert Allen, at Nelson, has been arrested by Constable Thomas Drake, Lyttelton Police, and remanded to Nelson.

BASIL COCHRANE is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, on the 15th ultimo, obtained two pairs of boots, value £1 10s. 6d., from Thomas Young, High Street, Christchurch, by false representations. Description: A native of London, a clerk, twenty years of age, 5ft. 2in. high, fresh freckled complexion, blue eyes, brown hair, large nose and small chin, tattoo-spots on right arm; dressed in dark-checked English tweed suit and light-coloured hard hat; a recent arrival in the colony. There is a second charge of false representation to be preferred against him. He was sentenced on the 14th December last, at Lyttelton, to one month's labour for larceny. At 1.15 a.m. on the 8th ultimo a pane of glass, value 5s., was maliciously broken in the sitting-room window of the residence of William Jones, Temuka.

BETWEEN 9 p.m. on the 8th and 4.15 a.m. on the 9th ultimo the sign-board over the shop of Joseph Braithwaite, Princes Street, Dunedin, was maliciously cut in several places, apparently with a pocket-knife, and damaged to the extent of 10s.

BETWEEN 5 p.m. on the 13th and 8 a.m. on the 14th ultimo the names "Quill and Cronin," which were painted on the office-door of Denis Quill and Patrick Cronin, Willis Street, Wellington, were maliciously cut out of the door with a sharp instrument, thereby doing damage to the extent of about 5s.

BETWEEN 4 p.m. on the 11th and 9 a.m. on the 14th ultimo three panes of glass, value 10s., were maliciously broken in the widows of the Clifton Terrace School, Wellington; the property of the Government.

ABOUT 2.30 o'clock on the morning of the 20th ultimo a number of stones were maliciously thrown at the brothel of Kate McRae, Fraser's Lane, Wellington, breaking two panes of glass and a mirror; value £4 10s.

BETWEEN 5 and 7.30 p.m. on the 5th ultimo a swag, consisting of two white blankets, a black coat, a pair of dungaree trousers, a pair of light-coloured-tweed trousers, and a pair of shooting-boots, value £2, the property of William O'Donnold, was obtained by false pretences, at the Auckland Railway Station, by a person of whom no description can be obtained. Swag identifiable.

BETWEEN 10.30 p.m. on the 17th and 8 a.m. on the 18th ultimo two of the hand-rails at the jetty, Invercargill, the property of the Invercargill Borough Council, were maliciously wrenched off, thereby causing damage to the extent of about £2.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.(See *Police Gazette*, 1887, page 20.)

ROBERT KENT, *alias* Silas Kent, charged on warrant with assaulting and robbing Thomas Mitchell, has been arrested by Detective Austin Kirby, Timaru Police, and remanded to Christchurch.

JOHN GLOVER is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with stealing, on the 15th ultimo, from the shop-door of Spencer George Radford, Hastings Street, Napier, four or five pairs of men's white-cotton drawers, since recovered; value about 16s. Description: Irish, a labourer, fifty-one years of age, 6ft. $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair beard whiskers and moustache worn short and mixed with grey, slightly stooped; dressed in light-tweed suit and black soft felt hat. He was seen at Meane on the 16th ultimo. On the 12th May, 1879, he was sentenced at Napier to six months' labour for larceny. (See *Police Gazette*, 1879, page 202.)

JOSEPH JACKSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Masterton Bench, with stealing, between the 2nd and 26th ultimo, from the dwelling of Patrick Mahoney, at Masterton, three blankets, a quilt, a sheet, two kettles, three saucepans, a tin billy, a clock, a looking-glass, two saws, a candlestick, a sharpening-stone, and two butchers' knives; value £4; since recovered. Description: English, a wheelwright, about forty-five years of age, 5ft. 9in. or 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, very round-shouldered, dark complexion, dark hair, small dark beard and moustache, something the matter with one of his eyes, and one of his hands injured as if it had been broken across the back.

STOLEN on the 17th ultimo, from the dwelling of Joseph Johnstone, Northcote, near Auckland, a sack containing about 1cwt. of kauri gum; value £2 10s. Most of the gum identifiable.

STOLEN on the 14th ultimo, from the dwelling of F. L. Prime, Anglesea Street, Auckland, a pair of binocular marine-glasses, large size, morocco and black enamel, "Marine" stamped on small end, the morocco on one of the slides on the large end is loose, and some of the cogs on the wheel which regulates the sight are broken; value £1 10s. Identifiable.

JAMES ANDERSON SKOY is charged with stealing, on the 24th ultimo, from the shop of John Edward Evans, Lambton Quay, Wellington, a carriage-whip, value 12s. 6d., since recovered. Description: A Dane, a carpenter, forty-two years of age, 5ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, stout build, fair complexion, light-brown hair whiskers and moustache, chin shaved, large nose mouth and chin, AFS, CIS, IAS, CAS, 1857, and part of wreath tattooed on right arm, scar over left temple and on left arm; dressed in grey-tweed sac-suit and grey-tweed hat. He sold the whip on the day it was stolen to George W. Smart, pawnbroker, Manners Street. He was discharged from Wellington Gaol on the 12th ultimo, after undergoing two sentences for larceny. Warrant for his arrest to issue.

STOLEN on the 25th ultimo, from the shop of Charles Brown, Adelaide Road, Wellington, a half-sovereign.

STOLEN on the 15th ultimo, from the office of James Linton, Palmerston North, a presentation address in ebonized frame, about 20in. by 15in., with gilt border; value £12. Identifiable. The address was presented to Mr. Linton about three months ago.

STOLEN on the 10th ultimo, from the bar of the Ship Hotel, Willis Street, Wellington, a ladies' gold brooch, pattern two bars with horseshoe in centre, about twelve small pearls set in horseshoe and three larger ones in the centre of the brooch, pin missing; the property of Nellie Townsend; value £3 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 5th ultimo, from a box in the dwelling of Richard Washington Webb, Brenchley Road, Lyttelton, a £1 note and a sovereign.

ABOUT 2 a.m. on the 13th ultimo an outhouse in Wordsworth Street, Wellington, the property of John Skelly, was broken into, and a nearly-new large white blanket, value £1, and two children's print calico dresses, value 15s. each, stolen. Dresses identifiable. Eight cwt. of coals, value 15s., were stolen at the same time from the yard.

BETWEEN 10.30 p.m. on the 16th and 6 a.m. on the 17th ultimo the premises of William James Pallant, Cuba Street, Wellington, were burglariously entered, and the following stolen: A cash-box containing between £85 and £40

in notes, gold, and silver; a cheque for £1 15s. on the Bank of New South Wales, drawn by — Hazelden, bookseller, Cuba Street, in favour of Mr. Pallant; a National Bank book, Te Aro Branch; a bundle of cancelled cheques on the National Bank, Te Aro; a cheque-book on the Bank of Australasia, a few cheques used out of it, the first date is the 22nd January, 1885, a pair of black-kid gloves, and an English farthing, dated 1875. Also a writing-desk, containing a policy for £500 in the Accident Insurance Office, and two policies for £50 and £250 against fire in the Phoenix Office. Identifiable, except notes, gold, and silver. The writing-desk was found broken open in the yard of the premises, and the cash-box was found broken open in a paddock off Tory Street; it contained the Accident Insurance policy, the fire-insurance policy for £50, the pair of gloves, and a number of receipts and bills.

STEALING money in the dwelling of William Smyth, at Oamaru: Mary Black, suspected of this offence, was convicted of stealing a £1 note in the same dwelling on the 12th ultimo, and sentenced to two months' probation under "The First Offenders' Probation Act, 1886."

STOLEN between 9 p.m. on the 30th January last and 6 p.m. on the 2nd ultimo, from the dwelling of Annie Strangman, Cheltenham Road, Devonport, a silver bracelet inlaid with gold, with engraving like the leaves of a tree on centre of gold; value £2 10s. Identifiable.

STOLEN between the 25th and 29th January last, from the hut of John Luke Lynch, at Burke's, near Dunedin, a gold ruby and diamond ring, value £4 4s.; and 11s. 6d. in silver. Ring identifiable.

SUPPOSED stolen on the 14th ultimo, from off the counter in the book-shop of John Watts, Willis Street, Wellington, a black-leather pocketbook with four compartments and elastic band, containing two letters, some visiting-cards, a promissory note for £15, seven £1 notes, and a return-ticket by steamer to Akaroa; the property of William B. Tosswill. Identifiable, except money. The pocketbook and contents, except the money, were found on the morning of the 15th ultimo near the opera-house, Manners Street.

STOLEN on the 19th ultimo, from the shop-window of Philip A. Rive, Cuba Street, Wellington, a single-breasted black-worsted sac-suit, full size; value £2 12s. 6d. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 17th ultimo, from the person of Henry Thomas, while drunk, at Christchurch, a silver lever hunting-watch, maker Rotherham, No. 2725, and a steel albert chain, value £4 10s.; a £1 note, and about 10s. in silver. Watch identifiable.

STOLEN on the 10th or 11th ultimo, from the person of James Ruthven Grant, while drunk in the house of John Edwards, Game Hen Gully, Lee Stream, Otago, a brown folding indiarubber tobacco-pouch, containing a twelve-months' fixed-deposit receipt for £725 on the Bank of New Zealand, Dunedin, due in about nine months hence; three £5 notes on the Bank of New Zealand, three £1 notes, a half-sovereign, 8s. or 10s. in silver, a miner's right for 1887 in the name of James Grant, a receipt for £1 1s. 6d. from Ross and McNeill of Dunedin, and a number of other receipts. Tobacco-pouch and papers identifiable.

STOLEN on the 16th ultimo, from a cash-box in the office of W. G. Mitchell, Cuba Street, Wellington, four £1 notes and 8s. in silver. Suspicion attached to two players, names unknown. Description: First, about eighteen years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, medium build, broad shoulders, fresh full face, small fair moustache. He may be identical with David McLean, *alias* John Iles, charged on warrant with having assaulted John Wing, at Dunedin. (See *Police Gazette*, 1886, page 223.) Second, about thirty years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, medium build, dark complexion, and dark moustache.

STOLEN on the 16th ultimo, from the dwelling of Gerald Loftus Peacock, Cheltenham Beach, Devonport, a gold ring set with five rather large pearls in shape of a star with diamond points in the angles, value £10; a gold snake ring, three coils, two small ruby eyes in head, "G. M., 16th August, 1875," engraved on inside, value £3; a broad gold enamelled mourning-ring, old-fashioned pattern, "In memory of Charles Lord Senterden," with date of death, engraved on inside, value £2; an oval locket, about 1in. by 1½in., bordered with gold filigree work, centre black ground inlaid with a sprig of forget-me-not and a rose, opens at back, containing a photograph and some hair; value £2. Identifiable.

THE silver watch, the property of James Reid, stolen from a bedroom in Fabian's Hotel, Greytown, has been recovered. It was found concealed in an adjoining bedroom.

STOLEN on the 23rd ultimo, from the person of Richard William Hugh, while drunk, at Wellington, nine £1 notes and three sovereigns.

STOLEN on the 19th ultimo, in a brothel in Oamaru, a silver lever hunting-watch, about half worn, maker Thomas Sellars, Oamaru, No. 18143; the property of Robert Nichol; value £4. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Mary Price, alias Toogood. (For her description, &c., see *Police Gazette*, 1886, page 112.)

ABOUT 10.50 p.m. on the 18th ultimo William Lander was assaulted by three men, names unknown, in Castle Street, near Stuart Street, Dunedin, and robbed of a silver lever hunting-watch, maker Rotherham, London, "W. W. G. Lander" engraved with a needle inside case, value £4; and a black-morocco purse with steel clasp, containing three sovereigns, six or seven shillings in silver, and a gold scarf-pin with a red stone. Identifiable, except money. The only description that can be obtained of the offenders is that they are about twenty-five or twenty-six years of age, of slight build, and medium height; one was dressed in a light tweed-suit, and the other two in dark clothes, and all wore caps with double peaks.

THE coat stolen from the cart of Laurence Hudson

McAlpin, at Onehunga, has been recovered. It was found in the house of William Wade, who was arrested for stealing it, but the charge was dismissed.

STOLEN about the 5th ultimo, at Punihu, near Pungarehu, a coil of barbed wire, about 140lb. weight, frame marked "Iowa barbed wire, FP & Co., No. 98;" the property of E. H. Hunt; value £1 15s.

Second, about thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, slight build. They are supposed to be new arrivals in Wellington.

Description: English, a sailor, twenty-seven years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, medium build, fair hair, clean-shaved except moustache. His wife and family live in Dunedin.

Identifiable.

a gold locket, with an anchor set in red stones on one side and a shield on the opposite side; a gold Albert chain, cable pattern; a gold scarf-pin with open ring for head, and 6s. in silver; the property of John William Bell; value £11 10s. Identifiable, except the money. Suspicion attached to two passengers by the steamer "Mahinapua," who left Oamaru by that vessel on the 24th ultimo for Dunedin.

Horse- and Cattle-stealing.

THE horse, the property of Alexander Nicol, stolen from Ngaruawahia, has been recovered, and traced to the possession of George Howard, alias Head. Description: Supposed a native of the colony, and a jockey, eighteen years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, medium build, inclined to ruddy complexion, dark hair, no hair on face; wore dark-tweed coat, light-tweed vest, and tight-fitting trousers; horsey appearance. He sold the horse on the 30th October last at Cambridge by auction. He left Waikato for Auckland early in November last, in company with Jesse Cockhead, recently arrested at Auckland for horse-stealing.

SUPPOSED stolen about the beginning of January last, from a paddock at Kartigi, near Hampden, Oamaru District, two draught fillies, both two years old, dark-bay colour, one has black points, and the other a star on forehead, and hind legs white, both branded ZI on near shoulder; the property of John Anderson; value about £20. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 11th ultimo, from a paddock at Cabbage Tree Flat, Motonau, Canterbury, a light saddle hack bay mare, five years old, fifteen hands high, a small lump below the off knee on the inside, shod all round; the property of Daniel Kennedy; value £7. Identifiable.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

WALTER SWANGER is charged, on warrant issued by the Wanganui Bench, with disobeying an order, since the 20th January last, to pay £1 per week towards the support of his children. Description: English, a butcher, thirty-four years of age, 6ft. high, slight build, dark complexion, black hair whiskers and moustache, right thumb deformed, and points off two fingers of same hand. He left Takapau, Hawke's Bay District, about the 20th ultimo, saying he was going to Wanganni. He was employed by the Gear Meat Company, at Wellington, about three years ago.

GEORGE CHARLES ROSS RICHARDS is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with deserting his wife and six children, at Christchurch, since the 17th ultimo. Description: English, a photographer, fifty years of age, 5ft. 11in. high, slight build, sharp features, cast in right eye, dark hair, dark-brown beard whiskers and moustache; dressed in dark-check suit and grey-tweed hat; fond of drink. He went to Dunedin.

WILLIAM ALBERT BIRD, charged on warrant with deserting his wife, has been arrested by Detective William L. Chrystal, Wellington Police, and ordered to pay 15s. per week towards the support of his wife and children.

GEORGE VICKERSTAFF is charged, on warrant issued by the Carterton Bench, with deserting his wife and child, at Carterton, since the 16th ultimo. Description: English, a saw-mill-hand, twenty-three years of age, 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high, stout build, very fair complexion, fair hair and moustache, sandy whiskers, large scar on centre of forehead, over which he wears his hair; wore dark-brown suit with black stripe through material resembling a plaid, hard black hat, and low shoes.
