Incendiarism.

ABOUT 7 p.m. on the 28th ultimo, at Island Cliff, Oamaru District, 54 bags of wheat, value £43, the property of Thomas McWhirter, were destroyed by fire. At an inquest held to inquire as to the origin of the fire the following verdict was returned: "That there was no evidence to show how the fire originated." The wheat was insured.

ABOUT 1 o'clock on the morning of the 28th ultimo the workshop at the Manawatu Railway-station, Wellington, the property of the Manawatu Railway Company, was maliciously set on fire, but the fire was discovered and extinguished before any damage was done. The fire originated in the inside of the workshop, and at the place was found, placed against the wall of the building, a small case containing a quantity of shavings. The workshop was locked at 2 p.m. on the previous day, and there was then no fire in the place.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

THOMAS ROONEY is charged, on warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench, with forging and uttering an order to William Smyth, at Oamaru, on the 2nd ultimo. Description: A native of the County Kerry, a labourer, thirty-one years of age, 5ft. 7½in. high, medium build, dark complexion, blue eyes, brown hair, darkish shaggy beard whiskers and moustache, scar on left temple, mark of cut on nose and near right eye; dressed in old grey-tweed paget-coat, darkish-tweed trousers, and black soft-felt hat. He was sentenced at Timaru, on the 29th October last, to three months' labour for larceny. (See *Police Gazette*, 1889, page 35.) He obtained goods from Mr. Smyth by means of the forged order.

JOHN JOHNSTONE is charged on warrant (Bench by whom issued not stated) with having, on the 8th November last, at Kaikohe, Bay of Islands, obtained a bank cheque for £4 from George W. S. Patterson by false pretences. Description: Supposed a native of the colony, a gum-digger, twenty-four years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, medium build, darkish sallow complexion, thin and rather long

features, light-brown or sandy hair, and small sandy moustache only; when last seen wore dark suit and soft-black hat; larrikin appearance. He was seen on the 23rd February last riding a horse from his parents' residence at Helensville, in the direction of Kaukapakapa. He obtained the cheque by falsely representing that he had about a ton of kauri gum for sale.

JOHN O'CONNOR, alias O'Connell, charged on warrant with maliciously breaking a door at Waiau, the property of John Mackay, has been arrested by Detective John M. Walker, Dunedin Police, and fined 5s. and ordered to pay £1 for damages.

MATTHEW LAWRIE is charged, on warrant issued by the Warkworth Bench, with having, on the 18th March last, at Omaha, Auckland District, obtained 225 puriri posts, value £5 18s. 6d., from Thomas Felix Ashton by means of a valueless order for £5 15s. 6d., drawn on Messrs. Henderson and Spraggon, Auckland. Description: Supposed Irish, about thirty-eight years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, dark-brown hair, whiskers and moustache inclined to be sandy; when last seen wore dark coat, dark-check plaid trousers, and white-straw hat with a red-and-blue-ribbon band. At the time he committed this offence he was master of the cutter "Mahurangi."

PETER BIRRELL is charged, on two warrants issued by the Timaru Bench, with having, on the 7th June last, at Timaru, while acting as accountant to the Deputy Official Assignee, forged two receipts and acquittances for £385 and £12 11s. 3d. respectively, with intent to defraud the Government. Description: Scotch, an accountant, about sixty years of age, 5ft. 9in. or 10in. high, medium build, slightly stooped, fresh complexion, very grey hair beard whiskers and moustache, all worn short; may be dressed in a grey or greyish-brown tweed sac-suit. He was formerly in the Nelson Police. He was seen in Timaru on the morning of the 5th instant. He will endeavour to leave the colony.

In April last, at Pukekohe, the hair was maliciously cut off the tails of four horses; the property of John Brown.

JOHN W. WATSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with having, on the 4th instant, at Wellington, obtained £2 from George W. Smart by false pretences. Description: English, a clerk, about thirty years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, fair hair and complexion, sandy beard whiskers and moustache; dressed in dark clothes and hard black-felt hat. Offender obtained the money on the duplicate of an order on the New Zealand Shipping Company for £10, the original of which had been previously cashed by him. He is supposed to have gone to Foxton, and is said to be known to a man named Rogers, who owns a flax-mill there.

On the 26th ultimo, at Hayse's Terrace, near Kumara, the water-gauge at the dam of the gold-mining claim of Louis Dimante and party was maliciously raised, and the water let

run to waste, thereby occasioning loss and damage to the extent of £20.

BETWEEN 1 and 8 a.m. on the 11th instant, at Hawera, an attempt was made to wash off the paint of the sign and verandah-posts of the shop of Isaac Bernard Mendelson, thereby doing damage to the extent of £1

ON the 4th or 5th instant, at Nine-mile Beach, Charleston, six well-bred hens, value 18s., the property of Richard McHeron, were maliciously poisoned.

THE warrant issued by the Oamaru Bench for the arrest of D. C. Monteith, for obtaining the sum of £1 from Bernard Delargy by false pretences, has been cancelled, owing to one of the principal witnesses having left the colony.

ABOUT 10.30 p.m. on the 8th instant three large panes of glass, value 3s. each, were maliciously broken in the windows of the store of John H. Graham, at Huntly, Tauranga District.

THOMAS EASTON WAUGH is charged, on warrant issued by the Dunedin Bench, with having, on the 21st day of July last, at Dunedin, embezzled the sum of £54, the property of the Government. Description: A native of Victoria, a clerk, twenty-six years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, slight build, sallow complexion, thin features, sharp prominent nose, dark-brown hair, and small light-brown moustache and side whiskers; generally wears blue-serge sac-suit and hard black-felt hat with low crown. While teller in the Post Office Savings Bank, Dunedin, he forged a depositor's application for a new bank-book, which he obtained, and then forged the depositor's signature to a receipt for the sum of £54, and converted the money to his own use. His defalcations amount to about £300. He left Dunedin on the 10th instant by the steamer "Wairarapa" for Melbourne. He is known to Albert Price, of the New Zealand Insurance Office, Melbourne.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

ALFRED LOVEJOY is charged, on warrant issued by the Masterton Bench, with stealing, on the 8th ultimo, from the whare of William Mulroy, at Tauera, near Masterton, a single-barrel breech-loading fowling-piece; value £3. Identifiable. Description: English, a labourer, about forty-five years of age, 5ft. 5in. or 6in. high, medium build, pale complexion, thin features, dark-brown hair, light-brown side whiskers and moustache, chin shaved; when last seen wore light-coloured tweed coat and vest, light-coloured striped cord trousers, and black soft-felt hat. He is supposed to have come to Wellington.

BENGE DOWNS is charged, on warrant issued by the Foxton Bench, with stealing, on the 8th ultimo, from the whare of John Johnson, at Moutoa, near Foxton, an open-face metal watch, value £1, since recovered. Description: A half-caste Maori, about fifteen years of age, about 5ft. high, medium build; wore brown cardigan jacket, brown-moleskin trousers, tweed hat, and heavy lace-up boots; speaks good English. He sold the watch on the 8th ultimo at Shannon to Daniel Harley, a clerk in the employment of the Wellington and Manawatu Railway Company. He was employed at Birchley and Co.'s flax-mill, Moutoa, when he stole the watch.

GEORGE W. BOLEAN, charged on warrant with stealing dyes, scents, &c., from the shop of Ralph Thomas and Co., Melbourne, has been arrested by the Port Melbourne Police. He is identical with George W. Bolean, described in *Police Gazette*, 1889, page 27, charged on warrant with embezzling money at Sydney, the property of Messrs. Lyons and McEwen.

STOLEN between 2 p.m. on the 12th and 11 a.m. on the 14th instant, from the hotel of John Larkin, Patea, a green Scotch tweed overcoat with small red specks through material, lining of skirt torn as if from a nail, a dark-and-white-mixture dress tweed coat with red thread through material, "James Smith, Te Aro House," on tab, and a gold ring with black stone with initials "Ever thine" on inside; value £6. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to William Henry Drummond, who had been staying in the hotel. Description: A swagman, about twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, ruddy complexion, light hair and small side whiskers and moustache; wore dirty light-tweed coat and trousers, and cross-bar cap with two peaks. He is supposed to have gone North. A horse and saddle, described in this issue as stolen from Patea, may have been taken by him.

THE rifle stolen from the shop of William Garrard, Victoria Street, Christchurch, has been recovered, and William Cobbledick, a youth, arrested for the offence by Detective Maurice O'Connor, and sentenced to six strokes with a rod.

Dowling, Charleston, five small shirt-studs, with emeralds set in gold, plain heads, no chasing, value £4 10s.; a scarf-pin, battle-axe pattern, small size, gold handle, platinum head, handle lying across a piece of gold representing a block of wood, value £2 10s.; a metal scarf-pin (supposed brass), Shakesperian head; a steel net-work purse containing a Queen Anne halfpenny, somewhat bent, an old penny, a George II. half-crown, and a few other small silver coins. Jewellery, purse, and half-crown identifiable.

STOLEN between the 21st and 28th ultimo, from a dwelling at Tuturau, Southland District, two £1 notes; the property of William Carter.

STOLEN between 6 p.m. on the 27th and 8 a.m. on the 28th ultimo, from the bar of the Manukau Hotel, Onehunga, a pair of binocular glasses for use by day or night, one glass on the sight-end is cracked across the centre, and there is an indentation in the rim encircling this glass; the property of William Adolphus Waterman; value £5. Identifiable.

BETWEEN the 21st and 25th ultimo the store of Edwin Sarah, Beacon Point, Kaipara Heads, Bay of Islands District, was broken into, and about 13ewt. of partly-scraped kauri gum stolen; value £18. Some of it supposed identifiable.

ABOUT 11 p.m. on the 27th ultimo Ah Hee was assaulted and robbed in Cuba Street, Wellington, of a silver Waltham hunting-watch, No. 2144455, value £4 10s., by Thomas Bennett, alias Connor, and a man, name unknown. Bennett, alias Connor, has been arrested by Detective William Campbell, Wellington Police, and committed for trial. The man, name unknown, is supposed to be English, about thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 8in. high; wore dark clothes and soft black-felt hat. Supposed identifiable. The watch has not been recovered.

STOLEN on the 7th instant, from the dwelling of John Owens, Beach Road, Ponsonby, a dark-brown plush bag, about 8in. by 6in., handle of same material, value 10s., containing three £1 notes, a cheque-book on the Colonial Bank, Auckland, value 2s. 6d., and several receipts and papers. Identifiable except the money.

Suspicion attached to Alexander Stainly, who on the day the offence was committed sold the gold locket and chain, the gold brooch, and the pair of gold earrings to John Bunyan, pawnbroker, Grey Street. Description: About sixteen years of age, about 5ft. 3in. or 4in. high, slight build, thin face, no hair on face, feminine voice; dressed in grey-check tweed suit and soft black-felt hat. Identifiable.

BETWEEN 5 p.m. on the 5th and 7.30 a.m. on the 6th instant the store of James Miller, Palmerston North, was broken into, and the following stolen: An iron safe, 24in. by 18in., containing a cheque for £23 on the Bank of Australasia, Palmerston North, drawn by A. S. Baker; a cheque for £3 on the Bank of New Zealand, Palmerston North, drawn by D. Guthrie; a cheque for £2 6s. 9d. on the Bank of New Zealand, Palmerston North, drawn by A. Mathieson; a cheque, the amount and drawer not known; ten post-dated cheques for £1 12s. 6d. each, drawn by Alexander McMinn on the Bank of Australasia, Palmerston North, in favour of numbers, and dated 7th, 22nd, and 27th May, 8th, 17th, and 27th June, 9th, 16th, and 23rd July, and 1st August, 1889, and numbered C/3 15820 to 15829 inclusive; a £5 note, about seventeen £1 notes, a half-sovereign, about £4 in silver, a cash-book, a day-book, a ledger, a bill-book, and three ½lb. tins of diamond-grained gunpowder. Cheques identifiable. The safe was found on the morning of the 6th instant about three hundred yards from the store, broken open, and contained only the books.

BETWEEN 9 p.m. on the 25th and 8 a.m. on the 26th ultimo the store of Thomas Taylor, Colombo Street, Christchurch, was broken into, and about 1,200 cigarettes, value £2 5s., and 2s. in coppers stolen.

Suspicion attached to James Lowrey, at present in the employment of Mr. Poyzer. Description: A native of Auckland, about twenty-three years of age, about 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high, sharp features, small chin and mouth, light-coloured hair, no hair on face. He purposes shortly visiting his relatives at Henderson's Mill, Auckland. He has a horse, but no saddle or bridle.

Horse- and Cattle-Stealing.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged, on warrant issued by the Timaru Bench, with the larceny as a bailee, on the 11th ultimo, at Timaru, of a chestnut hack-gelding, 15 hands high, about seven years old, supposed branded L on one shoulder, hog mane, and long tail, known by the name of "Red Robin," and has been raced by Hobbs Brothers and Coulter at Timaru, Ashburton, Christchurch, and Dunedin, value £15; an English-made saddle, about half-worn, "Clissold" branded on flap, value £4; a double-rein bridle, value £1 5s.; and a brown-mixture waterproof coat, value £1; the property of John Shaw. Description: Supposed English, about twenty-three years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, sallow complexion, light-brown hair side whiskers and moustache; dressed in dark-tweed suit and hard black-felt hat; smart active appearance. Identifiable. He hired the horse, &c., from Mr. Shaw on the 11th ultimo to go to Temuka, and was to return on the 14th ultimo, but he did not do so. The claim should be for the transport of the constable and his prisoner, their necessary expenses *en route*, and for the daily pay of the constable during the whole period that he is necessarily absent from his station on this duty.

*Shooting Season for Imported Game, License Fee, &c.,
Lake District.*
