#### Incendiarism.

On the night of the 25th ultimo, at Junction Road, Inglewood, Taranaki, a haystack, value about £20, the property of George Haslett, was destroyed by fire, which it is supposed was maliciously caused.

#### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

Michael French is charged, on warrant issued by the Lawrence Bench, with having, on the 22nd November last, at Rae's Junction, near Lawrence, uttered a forged cheque for £4 15s. to Isabella Rae. Description: Irish, a labourer, about thirty years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, dark beard whiskers and moustache worn short; dressed in old dark-tweed coat, vest, and trousers, and tweed hat; carried a swag in a sack. The cheque is drawn on the Colonial Bank, Lawrence, in favour of Michael French, and purports to be signed by John Carr. He said that he had been employed at Beaumont Station, and that he got the cheque from the manager. Mr. Kerr is the manager's name at Beaumont. He went towards Teviot Station, Roxburgh, on the day he uttered the cheque. This offender is identical with James Mitchell, alias Hogan, who was sentenced at Timaru on the 9th December, 1884, to five years' penal servitude for breaking and entering. He was discharged from gaol at Wellington in October last, and was sent to Timaru. (For his description, &c., see Police Gazette, 1888, page 206.)

George Rogers is charged with forging and uttering an order for £26 11s. to J. H. Stone, at Methyen, on the 2nd ultimo. Description: English, a station-cook and baker, about forty-two years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, medium build, dark complexion, black hair beard whiskers and moustache worn short, dressed as a labourer, slovenly gait, dirty appearance, frequents publichouses, and is well known to the station-cooks and station-hands throughout Canterbury. He is also known at the Railway Boarding-house, Timaru. The order is drawn on the New Zealand Loan and Mercantile

Agency Company, Christchurch, and purports to be signed by John Williams, of Upton Downs. He is supposed to have gone to Ashburton or Rakaia. There is a similar charge pending against him.

Daniel Stacey is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with forging and uttering an order for the payment of 10s. to Stephen Edward Crooke, in Colombo Street, Christchurch, on the 15th ultimo. Description: A Cornishman, about thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 11in. high, medium build, dark hair, clean-shaved except heavy brown moustache; dressed in light-tweed coat, coloured-moleskin trousers with two patches on hips, black soft-felt hat or white-straw hat; fond of drink; carried a blue-blanket swag. He forged the name of G. Stevens to an order on Mrs. Fisher, of Sydenham, by whom he falsely represented he was employed, for the payment of 10s., which he uttered to Mr. Crooke in payment for a pair of boots. He is supposed to have gone to Little River or Okain's Bay.

On the 23rd or 24th ultimo, at Seadown, near Temuka, a cow, the property of Alexander Beck, was maliciouly wounded on the head.

EUGENE McLean is charged, on warrant issued by the Timaru Bench, with obtaining, between the 27th December last and the 28th ultimo, at Timaru, board and lodging, value £5 16s., from Digby Andrews, by false representations. Description: Scotch, said he was an engineer or enginedriver, forty years of age, about 5tt. Sin. high, medium build, thin features, fair complexion and hair, clean-shaved except fair moustache and goatce; wore light-grey-tweed suit and tweed hat with flat brim. He falsely represented that he was employed in the Railway Department at Timaru, and by that means obtained the board and lodgings. It is thought that he may endeavour to obtain board and lodgings similarly elsewhere.

George W. Bollean is charged, on warrant issued by the Central Police Bench, Sydney, with having, on or about the 16th December last, at Sydney, embezzled the sum of £5 15s., the money of Messrs. Lyons and McEwen, by whom he was employed. Description: A clerk, about thirty years of age, 5ft. 4in. or 5ft. 5in. high, medium build, slightly bow-legged, fair complexion, brown hair moustache and side whiskers, chin shaved; generally wears light-tweed suit and hard black-felt hat. He left Sydney on the 20th December last by the steamer "Rotomahana" for Auckland.

ROBERT McMillan, alias Miller, is charged, on warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having, on the 16th ultimo, in Manchester Street, Christchurch, obtained a jockey's riding-colours and a pair of boots, value £5 10s., since recovered, from Peter Cairns by false pretences. Description: Supposed a native of the colony, Scotch parentage, a butcher and jockey, twenty-three or twenty-four years of age, 5ft. 6in. or 7in. high, medium build, clean-shaved except small fair moustache; when last seen wore darktweed coat and vest; respectable appearance. He recently

applied for employment in Mr. Rutherford's stables, Oxford. He may have come to Wellington. He is known to Neill Miller, a horse-trainer, who is said to be in Wellington.

# Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

Thomas Mulivaner is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with breaking into the dwelling of Bridget Mooney, Swanston Street, Auckland, on the 4th ultimo, and stealing a ladies' grey ulster, since recovered. Description: Irish, a gum-digger, between fifty and fifty-five years of age, 5ft. 7½in. high, swarthy complexion, hazel eyes, red hair, large mouth, broad chin, scar on right cheek and on right eyebrow, blue dot over left eye, gunshot wound at left heel, marks of corporal punishment on back, partly bald; wore old shabby grey clothes. He is an old offender. (See Police Gazette, 1887, page 122.) He is supposed to have gone to the gumfields.

Edward John St. Edwards is charged, on warrant issued by the Wanganui Bench, with stealing, on the 17th or 18th ultimo, in the St. John Hotel, Wanganui, a £1 note, two sovereigns, and 5s. in silver; the property of Edward Hackett. Description: English, about twenty-six or twenty-eight years of age, about 5ft. 4in. high, slight build, round features, brown hair, small sandy brown moustache and small side whiskers, otherwise clean-shaved, delicate appearance, very white hands; said he was suffering from heart disease; wore reddish-coloured-tweed paget-coat, light-tweed trousers, and light-tweed cap with peak of same material, sometimes wears a pepper-and-salt-coloured overcoat; carries a walking-stick. He had been staying at the hotel, but he left there on the 18th ultimo, and it is not known where he has gone. He had previously stayed at several hotels in Wanganui, and left them without paying for his board and lodging.

Charles Rivers Alleress is charged, on warrant issued at Melbourne, with stealing £7,000 from the Commercial Bank, Melbourne, on the 25th ultimo, while an officer of the bank. Description: Twenty-nine years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, olive complexion, thin aquiline nose, dark hair, and moustache only. A reward of £250 is offered for his arrest, and a similar amount for the recovery of the stolen money. He may try to escape by steamer calling at Rio de Janeiro or San Francisco. It is requested that a careful watch be kept for him.

WILLIAM Jupp is charged, on warrant issued by the Palmerston North Bench, with stealing, on the 22nd ultimo, from the dwelling of Joseph Henry Devlin, Palmerston North, a pair of light-coloured-tweed trousers, about size 5, made by Nichells and Remington, Wanganui, whose names may be on the buttons, value £1 15s.; and a straw hat, value 3s. 6d. Identifiable. Description: English, alabourer, about nineteen or twenty years of age, about 5ft. 4in. or 5in. high, slight build, sallow complexion, little if any hair on face; supposed to be wearing the stolen trousers and hat. He was seen on the 25th ultimo at a railway-station between Woodville and Napier.

STOLEN on the 4th ultimo, from a bedroom in the Family Hotel, Foxton, a ladies' gold ring, engraved, three rubies in claw-setting, one of the claws broken off, value £1; and a gentleman's gold ring with engraving thereon, value £2 10s.; the property of Elizabeth Hunter. Identifiable, Suspicion attached to Mary Lazarus, who is employed as cook in the hotel. Description: English, about forty years of age, 5ft. 2in. high, medium build, fair complexion, long features, large chin, brown eyes, and light-brown hair.

STOLEN on the 24th December last, from off the counter in the draper's shop of Miss Leatham, Victoria Street, Auckland, an oval 18-carat gold locket, 2½in. long, flowered on one side and plain on the other; the property of Ellen Radcliffe; value £3. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 5th instant, from a cash-box in the office of H. W. Preston, Lambton Quay, Wellington, five £1 notes.

THE gold guard, &c., stolen from the dwelling of Charles Goddard, at Eketahuna, have been recovered. The property was found by Mr. Goddard, at his door, on the morning of the 27th ultimo.

Between 11.30 p.m. on the 23rd and 5.30 a.m. on the 24th ultimo the North Otago Hotel, Oamaru, was burglariously entered, and the following stolen: Two old silver lever hunting-watches, out of repair, makers' names and numbers not known; a brass hunting Geneva watch, maker's name and number not known; a bottle of whiskey, a bottle

of gin, and a bottle of brandy; the property of Peter Dooley; value £1 10s. Watches supposed identifiable. Also a nearly-new pair of brown-moleskin trousers, size 4; and 9s. in silver; the property of Charles Murphy.

On the 4th ultimo the dwelling of John McDonald, Porokaiaia, near Foxton, was broken into, and £2 in threepenny and sixpenny pieces stolen.

STOLEN on the 12th ultimo, from the store of Hugh Anderson, Matakohe, Kaipara, about 1cwt. of kauri-gum; value £2. Some of the pieces identifiable. Maoris suspected.

# Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

Horace Wood, charged with stealing a ladies' velvet dress from the railway-station, Walton, Waikato, the property of Charles N. Murray, was arrested for the offence, on his discharge from Auckland Gaol, by Detective John M. Walker, Auckland Police, remanded to Te Aroha, and sentenced to two months' labour.

STOLEN on the 21st ultimo, from the stable of Arthur Heather, Epsom, near Auckland, a nickel-silver-plated carriage driving-bit with hinge in centre, two rings at ends, and long cheeks at sides; value 3s. 6d. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 24th December last, from the waiting-room at the railway-station, New Plymouth, a blue-and-white-check linen bag, tied with a running string at top, containing four blue exford shirts, four white shirts, twenty white handkerchiefs, a pair of flannel drawers patched on inside of seat with same material, a white-flannel shirt, a pygama suit, twelve pairs of socks, two pairs of merino drawers, and a vest, all marked "W. E. Percival," a number of neckties, a pair of tennis-shoes with duke soles, and a cabin-pocket bound with red braid; the property of William Edward Percival; value £3. Identifiable.

STOLEN about the 13th ultimo, from the Zealandia Skating Rink, Auckland, forty-nine pairs of second-hand Eureka skates with wooden soles and tin backs, some painted red and others black, two straps on each; eighteen pairs have a small tube of dark-coloured wood fastened with a brass brad in the centre of each wheel by which they can be identified; the property of Joseph William Rix; value 6s. a pair.

STOLEN on the 27th or 28th ultimo, from the yard of Mrs. Luxmore, Timaru, thirty fowls, barn-door and Dorking breed, mixed sexes; value £1 10s.

A YOUTH, name unknown, is charged with stealing, on the 17th or 18th December last, from a house in course of erection, in Alexander Street, Auckland, a hammer and a jack-plane, value 5s. 6d., since recovered; the property of Henry Bruce McIntyre. Description: About eighteen years of age, about 5ft. high, medium build, no hair on face; dressed in dirty-tweed suit and soft black-felt hat; larrikin-appearance. Identifiable. He sold the hammer and plane on the 18th December last to William Frost, a second-hand dealer in City Market. There is a similar charge pending against him.

Stolen on the 18th ultimo, in Wellington Street, Auckland, a gold hunting lever watch, maker Rotherham, No. 19654, RWS engraved on outside of case, value £10; and an old silver lever open-face watch, maker's name and number not known, out of repair, value £3; the property of Richard Ellis. Identifiable. On the morning of the 18th ultimo Mr. Ellis's house was burned down, and the watches were saved and placed with other property on the opposite side of the street, from where they were stolen soon after.

STOLEN on the 30th ultimo, from off a horse, at North Clyde, Wairoa, a new saddle, two cuts in lining which have

been sewn up, two Ds on each side of gullet, flat stirrupirons with three bars at bottom, and an old bridle with leather forehead-band; the property of William Gonlett; value £4. Saddle identifiable. A Macri, name unknown, was seen stealing the saddle and bridle.

STOLEN between the 21st and 26th ultimo, from the stable of James Dawson, at Naseby, a double-rein bridle with green forehead-band, throat-strap broken at one end and mended; value about £1 10s. Identifiable.

Stolen on the 24th ultimo, from the stable of James Smith, Naseby, a saddle, value £4; a plain single-rein snaffle-bridle with white forehead-band, value 15s.; a plain breast-plate with bone rings, value 10s.; and a leather girth, value 8s. 6d. Bridle and breast-plate identifiable. The saddle has been recovered; it was found on the following day on the Naseby race-course.

### Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

Charles Barrett, charged on warrant of commitment to gaol for twenty-four hours' labour, in default of paying a fine and costs, for permitting his horse to wander, has been arrested by Detective Maurice O'Connor, Christchurch Police.

John Morland is charged on warrant of commitment to gaol for fourteen days' labour, issued by the Wanganui Bench, under section 49 of "The Defence Act, 1886," in default of paying £1 10s, fine, and 5s, costs, for having been absent from parade without leave while a Volunteer, and failing to keep his rifle clean, at Wanganui, on the 21st August last. Description: Supposed English, a baker and confectioner, about twenty-four years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, slightly round-shouldered, clean-shaved except small moustache; when last seen wore tweed suit with conspicuous white spots. He was at one time in business in partnership with a man named Lumsden, in Victoria Avenue, Wanganui.

James Mackie is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with failing to support his four illegitimate children, at Wellington, since the 5th instant. Description: Scotch, a tailor, thirty-four years of age, 5ft. Sin. high, medium build, fair complexion, sandy hair beard whiskers and moustache cut short; wore black sac-coat, dark yest with cloth back, grey woollen shirt, dark-red tie, and hard black-felt hat. He is supposed to have gone up country. He is well known in the Wairarapa.

ARTHUR FREEMAN, alias Fraser, absconded from the Caversham Industrial School on the evening of the 2nd instant. Description: A native of Christchurch, sixteen years and five months of age, about 5ft. 5½in. high, stout and well built, dark complexion, very determined look with rather cunning face, dark-brown hair; dressed in dark-brown yellow-mixture woollen jacket, brown-moleskin trousers, dark-brown-tweed hat, and lace-up boots. He took with him an American cloth buggy-rug, with large check-pattern woollen lining. He was formerly in the Burnham Industrial School. He absconded from the Caversham Industrial School previously, and was arrested in the neighbourhood of Timaru for housebreaking, for which offence he was sentenced, at the Supreme Court, Timaru, on the 11th December last, to twelve months' labour under the name of William Fraser, alias Walter Freeman, but he was subsequently released and sent back to the school. He is a noted thief, and will no doubt commit some other offence.

ALBERT LETHABY absconded from the Burnham Industrial School on the 30th ultimo. Description: Thirteen years of age, stout build, dark complexion; supposed dressed in grey-tweed jacket and moleskin trousers. He was committed to the school from Timaru or Ashburton as a neglected child. On the 30th ultimo he was allowed to accompany his mother as far as the Burnham Railway-station, but he did not return to the school, and was subsequently seen with his mother in Christchurch. His parents travel through the country repairing umbrellas, &c., and may have with them a light wagon with drab-canvas tilt, with "Cheap Jack" painted thereon. If the boy is found with them he is to be sent back to the school, and his mother kept under surveillance, with a view of proceedings being taken against her for inducing him to abscond.

A RECORD of merit has been entered on the conduct-sheet of Constable Charles Slight, for the firmness and decision of character shown by him on the occasion of the arrest of James White, who was armed with a loaded double-barelled gun which he pointed at the constable on the 4th September, 1888, at Kapakapanui. White has since been sentenced to four years' penal servitude for horse-stealing.

Appeals under "The Employment of Females Act, 1881."

In a case of appeal from the decision of the Justices in Auckland, wherein George McBride, tailor, was convicted of allowing a female to remain in a workshop in his factory during part of the time allowed for meals, contrary to the provisions of "The Employment of Females Act, 1881," His Honour Judge Gillies held that to justify a conviction for this offence there must be some evidence that the employer actively consented to her being in the room at the time; that it was necessary to prove that he knew she was there and had consented to her being there; and, as there was no evidence on this point, quashed the conviction.

In a second case of appeal under the same Act and by the

In a second case of appeal under the same Act and by the same person, the conviction was quashed on the ground that the information did not specifically charge the defendant with the employment of a female "within the meaning of the Act," and with respect to this case the Crown Solicitor, Auckland, advises that to meet this objection in future the information should be framed in this way: "did allow [or employ, as the case may be] a certain female, to wit, J.N., being of the age of years or thereabouts, and being a female within the meaning of 'The Employment of Females and Others Act, 1881,'" &c. Similarly, if the information should say, "being a child [or young person," the information should say, "being a child [or young person, as the case may be] of the age of years or thereabouts, and being a child [or young person] within the meaning of 'The Employment of Females and Others Act, 1881.'"

In exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1881," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that deer (bucks or stags only) may be taken or killed within the Nelson District, consisting of the Counties of Waimea, Buller, and Collingwood, from the sixteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, both inclusive (subject, nevertheless, to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned); and I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each, and that licenses to sell such game shall be issued on payment of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmaster at Nelson is hereby appointed to issue the said licenses.
