Offences Not Otherwise Described.

BETWEEN 11 p.m. on the 2nd and 6.30 a.m. on the 3rd instant the hair of the tail and the mane were maliciously cut off a horse at Whare Flat, near Dunedin; the property of Donald McQuilkan.

On the morning of the 6th instant, at Eketahuna, three signboards, the property of Daniel E. Toohill, were maliciously smeared with coal-tar, and damaged to the extent of £1 10s.

On the 26th ultimo, at Waikaia, a saddle and bridle, the property of Charles George Thurston, were maliciously cut in several places with a knife, and damaged to the extent of £1 10s.

EDWARD JOHN ROBINSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Wellington Bench, with having, on the 11th March last, at Wellington, embezzled £1 7s. 3d., the moneys of Her Majesty's Customs. Description: A native of the colony, a clerk, about twenty-five years of age, about 5ft. 8in. high, medium build, athletic appearance, black curly hair, small black moustache and side whiskers, chin and lower part of cheeks shaved, brown eyes, swarthy complexion with traces of Maori or Indian blood; when last seen wore dark ulster and black hard-felt hat with low crown and wide brim. He is a prominent Wellington footballer and cricketer, and also a petty officer in the Wellington Naval Brigade, and will probably have photograph groups of football and other teams in his possession. He was until recently employed as a clerk in the Customs Department, Wellington, and while acting in that capacity embezzled the money. Other defalcations to the amount of £50 have been discovered. He is supposed to have left Wellington on the 4th instant by the steamer "Tarawera" for Sydney.

A MAN, name unknown, is charged with having, at 6 p.m. on the 10th ultimo, in the bar of the British Hotel, Queen Street, Auckland, uttered to Alexander Johnson a counterfeit

sovereign. Description: About forty years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, stout build, clean-shaved except dark moustache; dressed in dark clothes and soft black-felt hat; looked like a labourer. Identification doubtful.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

ANNIE *alias* AGNES GREEN, charged on warrant with stealing a dress and jacket from the dwelling of Jessie Stubbs, has been arrested by Detective L. D. Benjamin, Christchurch Police, and sentenced to one month's labour.

BENGE DOWNS, charged on warrant with stealing a watch from the ware of John Johnson, at Moutoa, near Foxton, has been charged with the offence by Sergeant William Manning, Palmerston North Police, and was sentenced on the 1st instant to two months' labour. He was arrested on the 25th ultimo by Constable James Joseph Tuohy, Feilding Police, for stealing money, for which offence he was sentenced to two months' labour, when he gave his name as Jim Downs, but he was subsequently identified by Sergeant Manning as being identical with Bengé Downs.

Two men, names unknown, are charged with having, about 11.30 p.m. on the 20th ultimo, at Christchurch, assaulted and robbed William Thomas of 18s. 6d. in silver. Description: First, about thirty years of age, about 5ft. 9in. high, stout build, sandy complexion, brown hair beard whiskers and moustache; dressed in dark-tweed suit and black-felt hat. Second, about eighteen years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, fair complexion, pale face, fair hair; dressed in light-tweed suit. Complainant was drunk at the time.

STOLEN on the 27th or 28th ultimo, from the dwelling of Catherine Ryan, Ross, a morocco-leather case containing a large gold oval brooch with three or four purple stones set in it, one stone missing, oak-leaf pattern, a large gold leaf in centre which can be lifted up and the brooch is then converted into a locket, small oak-leaves all round, containing a few locks of hair, a gold ring at top, from which it can be suspended, value £9; seven or eight gold nuggets, two of them

2dwt. and 3dwt. respectively, the others smaller, value £1; a white embroidered skirt, value £4; about 5 yards of new linen table-cloth material, value 15s.; 10 yards of brown-rep dress-material, value £1 13s.; a new white-straw hat trimmed with blue ribbon and blue and white flowers, value 8s.; 4 yards of black velvet, value £1; and £1 in silver. Identifiable, except the nuggets and money.

STOLEN on the 26th ultimo, from the store-door of William Vaughan, Sefton, Canterbury, a new 8ft. by 10ft. calico tent, Globe brand, $\frac{1}{2}$ /21/-6d. in pencil over brand; value £1 1s. 6d. Identifiable by pencil-mark.

THE silver watch stolen from the whare of John L. Boyd, at Henderson, has been recovered, and traced to the possession of David Dures Russell, arrested by Constable Thomas McCoy, Auckland Police, and committed for trial for breaking into and stealing from the whare.

STOLEN on the 28th ultimo, from the shop-door of Henry White, Cuba Street, Wellington, a new carpet-bag, 2ft. long by 18in. deep; value 10s. Identifiable.

BETWEEN 5 p.m. on the 21st and 11 a.m. on the 22nd ultimo the viney of William Griffiths, Torrens Road, Hillmorton, Spreydon, Christchurch, was broken into, and about 50lb. of bacon, value £1, stolen.

STOLEN on the 25th ultimo, from the dwelling of William White, Victoria Street, Christchurch, two white table-cloths, two large linen sheets, two bath towels with red stripes, a pair of dark-cotton socks, and a pair of merino socks; value £1. Table-cloths and sheets identifiable.

THE man charged with stealing a purse, &c., from the person of Mrs. Belcher, at the Town Belt, Dunedin, is believed to be identical with Robert Gardener, who was committed for trial at Dunedin on the 27th ultimo on a similar charge, but Mrs. Belcher cannot positively identify him.

STOLEN between the 9th and 13th ultimo, from a box in a bedroom in the Governor Browne Hotel, Hobson Street, Auckland, a £10 note supposed on the Bank of Australasia, a jubilee sovereign with 1887 on it, twelve sovereigns, ten half-sovereigns, and eight £1 notes; the property of Mary Coyle.

STOLEN on the 3rd April last, from a bedroom in the dwelling of Samuel Isaacs, Hobson Street, Auckland, an open-faced silver keyless watch, maker's name and number not known, a small dent in back case; value £1 5s. Identifiable.

Evans, English, a gun-digger, from thirty-five to forty years of age, 5ft. 6in. or 7in. high, medium build, sallow complexion, dark hair beard whiskers and moustache, hair thin on front of head and parted in centre; dressed in grey-tweed suit. He has been gum-digging at Taupaki for the past twelve months, but he is now supposed to have gone to the Waipu gum-fields.

ABOUT the 22nd ultimo the store of Henry Miller, Queen Street Wharf, Auckland, was broken into, and about twenty-three sacks, value 13s., since recovered, stolen.

STOLEN between the 5th and 15th ultimo, from the dwelling of Isabel Gore Martin, Mount Roskill Road, Auckland, a ladies' gold ring, set with a large turquoise, supposed in six claws, a butterfly engraved on the turquoise and "Ametie" engraved on inside of ring; and a ladies' small tortoiseshell ring with a small pearl set in centre and a very small gold nugget set on each side of the pearl; value £2.

Identifiable. Suspicion attached to Mary Barnsley, who was employed in the house at the time. Description: A charwoman, between thirty and thirty-five years of age, medium height and build, dark hair and complexion; wears dark clothes and white-straw hat. She lives with her family at Newton Road.

BETWEEN the 2nd and 7th ultimo the hut of Thomas Knight, Nightcaps, Southland District, was broken into, and 9d. in coppers stolen.

ON the evening of the 9th ultimo Duncan McLeod was assaulted in a railway-carriage on the Williamstown line, Victoria, and robbed of a gentlemen's gold hunting lever watch, "Denis Brothers, Melbourne," on face, No. 84126, "Presented by the members and supporters of the Williamstown Football Club to D. McLeod, Esq., Honorary Secretary and Treasurer, as a token of esteem, October, 1884," inscribed on dome, D. McL. in monogram on shield, the push-piece is a little out of order, being rather low down and rendering the opening of the watch slightly difficult, engine-turned cases; a colonial-gold chain, fetter-link and knot pattern; a colonial-gold locket, square pattern, "Presented to Mr. D. McLeod by C. Laming as a token of thorough friendship, January, 1886," inscribed on one side, and a footballer in enamel on the reverse, containing a ladies' photograph, a gentlemen's small gold finger-ring with single diamond in claw-setting, "18-carat" stamped on inside, and may also be stamped "Denis Bros." or D. B. As it is thought the stolen property may be sent to this colony for disposal, it is requested that inquiries may be made at pawn-offices, jewellers' shops, second-hand dealers, &c. A man, name unknown, is charged on warrant with this offence. Description: Twenty-two years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, full face, no beard, small moustache only; dress not described. (See *Victoria Police Gazette*, 1890, page 193.)

Suspicion attached to James Baker, a native of the colony, a labourer, about nineteen years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, fair complexion and hair, no hair on face; generally wears old grey-tweed suit. He is at present living in a tent at Makikihi.

STOLEN on the 30th ultimo, from a bedroom in the dwelling of Dr. Davy, Symonds Street, Auckland, a ladies' square black-leather purse, fastens with a spring, containing a £1 note, a sovereign, and about 10s. in silver; the property of Sarah Craneford. Purse identifiable.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

DAVID PATTERSON is charged, on warrant issued by the Auckland Bench, with deserting his wife, at Auckland, on the 30th May last. Description: A native of the North of Ireland, an ex-gaol-warder, about fifty-five years of age, about 5ft. 9in. high, very stout build, ruddy complexion, grey hair, clean-shaved except grey moustache. He left Auckland on the 30th May last by the steamer "Wanaka" for Wellington, and it is believed thence to London on the 12th ultimo by the steamer "Aorangi," under an assumed name.

JEREMIAH FINNERTY, charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court to pay £1 per week towards the support of his wife and children, has been arrested by Constable Anthony Isemonger, Palmerston North Police, and remanded to Wellington.

JOSEPH VINCENT is charged on warrant of commitment to the Invercargill Gaol for two months' labour, issued by the Waimate Bench, in default of paying the amount due for the support of his three children in the Burnham Industrial School. Description: A Cornishman, a labourer and rabbit-biter, thirty-three years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, rather stout

build, fair hair and complexion, generally clean-shaved except fair moustache, blue eyes, large nose, scar on thumb and on palm of right hand; fond of drink. He was £27 7s. 6d. in arrears on the 5th April last. He is supposed to be in the Southland District. (See *Police Gazette*, 1889, page 92.)

Missing Friends.

INFORMATION is requested respecting Samuel Chickley, a native of Staffordshire, until recently a storekeeper at Pukiti, Kerikeri, Bay of Islands, about sixty years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, thick neck, full face, fair complexion, brown hair beard whiskers and moustache; dressed in dark-brown-tweed suit, soft black-felt hat, and elastic-side boots. He left Kawakawa on the 15th ultimo on horseback for Pukiti, and neither he nor the horse has since been heard of.

INFORMATION is requested respecting Johanna Biggers, Irish, forty-three years of age, 5ft. 2in. high, stout build, full face, swarthy complexion, dark hair turning grey; wore dark dress with plush trimming, black-straw hat with feather, and plaid shawl; had with her a handbag and a portmanteau. She left her home at Leitchville, Victoria, on the 1st February last, and was seen at Richmond, Victoria, on the 27th ultimo. It is thought that she may have come to this colony. She is inquired for at the instance of her husband.

INFORMATION is requested respecting Andrew Smith, a native of Germany, a quarryman, about fifty-four years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, stout build, fair, sunburnt complexion, dark-brown hair, full beard whiskers and moustache, slovenly gait, speaks good English, has been a long time in the colony. He left Christchurch about April, 1888, supposed for Westland. He is inquired for with a view of compelling him to contribute towards the support of his two daughters in the Burnham Industrial School. He was £84 4s. in arrears in April last.

INFORMATION is requested respecting Thomas Pearce Jones, also known as Thomas Pearce, a shepherd and rabbit-biter, thirty-eight years of age. Before coming to the colony he resided in Penypalmant Green, Denbigh, North Wales. He left the Teviot Station, Otago, on the 21st October, 1887, and was subsequently employed rabbiting at Northburn Station, Cromwell Subdistrict, until August, 1889, when he left for Wellington, supposed to join the Union Steamship Company's service. Inquiries have been made for him at Wellington, but no trace of him can be found. He is inquired for at the instance of Henry Evans Jones, 42, Park Street, Denbigh, North Wales.
