### Arson.

[Extract from *New Zealand Gazette* of 7th July, 1892.]

*Arson.*—Free Pardon.—£150 Reward.

Department of Justice,  
Wellington, 6th July, 1892.

**W**HEREAS on or about the 19th June last the school-house situated in Hampden Street, Nelson, was set on fire:

This is to notify that His Excellency the Governor will grant a free pardon to any person implicated in the said fire, not being the principal offender, who will give such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of any one or more of the other offenders; and that a reward of £150 is offered to any person, not being the principal offender, who shall first give such information. **LINCOLN.**—£50 Reward: Between 5 p.m. and 11.30 p.m. on the 18th ultimo, at Tai Tapu, a clover-shelling machine, the property of James McVeigh, was maliciously set on fire and partly destroyed, and two clover-stacks close to, belonging to Henry E. Perryman, burnt down. A man, of whom no description can be given, was observed running away from the fire. The machine was insured for £170, and the stacks for £90, both in the Standard Office, under their respective values. Mr. Perryman guarantees the above reward on conviction of the offender or offenders.

**HAWERA.**—Thomas Henry Blackwell, charged with setting fire to the cottages of William Goldfinch and Felix Hungar, has been arrested by Constable Patrick Quinn, and remanded.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

**DUNEDIN.**—A warrant of distress has been issued against James Aitchison, in default of paying £5 19s., fine and costs, inflicted on the 3rd December last, for a breach of "The Gaming and Lotteries Act, 1881." Description: Scotch, about fifty years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, sandy beard whiskers and moustache; a frequenter of racecourses. If found, to be kept under surveillance, and a report sent to the Inspector of Police, Dunedin.

**DUNEDIN.**—Charles Hunter, charged with maliciously breaking Mrs. C. Cotter's windows, has been arrested by Constable Higgins, South Dunedin Police, and remanded. Duquid, the other offender, is still at large.

**AUCKLAND.**—Henry Arthur Bond, charged with the larceny as a bailee of £6, money of William Knox: A warrant was issued on the 19th instant for the arrest of this offender.

**PORT ALBERT (AUCKLAND).**—Peter A. Sanvig is charged, on warrant, with having, on the 2nd May last, at North Albertland, obtained £1 by false pretences from Edmund Yates. Description: A Norwegian, a bushman, about 5ft. 11in. high, muscular, long legs, short body, fair complexion, speaks broken English. He left Waikato by steamer for Auckland, and is reported to have gone thence to Thames or Waikato, to work on a contract.

**DUNEDIN.**—Albert Hughes, charged on warrant of commitment for ill-treating a cow, has paid the amount of fine and costs.

**DUNEDIN.**—A man, name unknown is charged on warrant with having, about 2.30 p.m. on the 14th instant, at the Queen's Drive, Maori Hill, indecently assaulted Ellen Wright, aged eight years. Offender is described as youngish-looking, about 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, dark hair whiskers beard and moustache; dressed in dark paget-coat, striped trousers and vest (with watch-chain), hard black-felt hat, and red handkerchief round neck. Identifiable.

**LINCOLN.**—John Manning is charged on warrant with having, at West Milton, on the 1st ultimo, indecently assaulted Violet May Watson, six years of age. Description: Supposed colonial, a swagger, twenty-five to thirty years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, slight build, dark complexion, dark eyes, dark-brown hair, scattered beard whiskers and moustache of about two months' growth; dressed in coloured-moleskin trousers, blue-serge jacket, blue harvest-jacket underneath, light quilted hat; carries a swag; has a nervous twitch about the body; lives chiefly by begging, and is thought to be bordering on insanity. He was seen going towards Brookside on the 16th instant, and will probably seek some unoccupied hut or out-of-the-way school. Travels all over the Middle Island.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

**HUNTERVILLE.**—Jeremiah Bacovich reports stolen from his store, on the 7th or 8th instant, a new silver hunting-watch, medium size, makers Stewart, Dawson, and Co., No. 26745; value £2 2s. 6d.

**AUCKLAND.**—Alexander Henderson, upholsterer, Karangahape Road, reports stolen from his shop, on the 8th instant, two footstools, horse-shoe shape, about 14in. across, showing a stained kauri frame 2in. wide, on which "Good Luck" is engraved, one of them upholstered in blue plush, the other in grey tapestry; value £1 6s.

**AUCKLAND.**—Stealing A. H. Nathan's boiler: John Connolly has been arrested for this offence by Constable R. Hodgson, and fined £5 or three months' labour. Boiler recovered.

**AUCKLAND.**—Edward John Martin, Mount Eden, reports that, between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. on the 7th instant, his dwelling was broken into, and a silver lever hunting-watch, No. 5719, value £3, stolen. Entrance effected by bursting open the front door.

**AUCKLAND.**—James Paul, College Hill, Ponsonby, reports stolen from him, while drunk, on the 27th ultimo, nine £1 notes. Slight suspicion is attached to William O'Brien, a cabman, who took him home from Newmarket. Description: Irish, thirty years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, fresh complexion, medium build, brown moustache only.

Description: A colonial of Irish parentage, about twenty-two years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, dark-grey eyes, dark-brown hair, small light moustache only. Has gone to an uncle at Waverley. Complainant no longer suspects the man Kirk referred to in the above-quoted reference.

**HASTINGS.**—William Welborne Beecroft, Railway Hotel, reports stolen from his bedroom, on the 14th instant, a black-leather box, about 12in. by 6in., containing two razors, shaving-brush, looking-glass, gentlemen's gold watch-chain, close curb-pattern, with square gold locket attached; pair of gold solitaires, quartz in centres; a coloured-silk pocket-handkerchief, and about £2 in silver; total value £11 6s. Offender is of medium height and build, had crape over his face, wore a red tunic, and carried a cavalry-sword. Mr. Collins was paralysed with fear, and can give but little assistance in tracing the offender.

They are also charged with the larceny of a coat belonging to B. C. Keving, not previously reported. Both coats recovered, having been left on board the s.s. "Ardie," and can be identified as having been worn by the offenders.

Suspicion attached to Frederick Stevens, a native of the colony, about twenty years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, dark complexion and hair, small dark moustache only, slovenly gait; lives with his father at Otaitai Bush, Wallace County.

#### Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

WELLINGTON.—Ernest Calvert Wilkinson is charged on warrant of commitment to Reefton Gaol for disobeying an order of the Resident Magistrate's Court, made on the 5th January, 1885, to pay 7s. 6d. a week towards the support of each of his two children. Description: English, a clerk, thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, fair hair and complexion, hazel eyes, left wrist has been broken. Supposed to have gone to Nelson. He was £19 10s. in arrear up to the 21st March last.

WELLINGTON.—William Richard Beard is charged on warrant with failing to support his wife and two children since about the 10th November, 1891. Description: A colonial, a miner, twenty-seven years of age, broad shoulders, slight body, auburn hair, blue eyes, fair complexion. Offender left Wellington for Sydney in the s.s. "Hauroto" about the above date; he was then clean-shaved. His wife has not heard from him since he went, but his sister, who resides at Petone, has received three letters from him, the last one about four weeks ago. Photograph at Inspector's Office, Wellington.

WELLINGTON.—George Grey Gillespie is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Emma, Campbell Road, Karori, since June, 1891. Description: A native of New Zealand, a traveller and agent, has been a member of the Wellington Fire Brigade, twenty-six years of age, 5ft. 11in. high, stout build, fair complexion, blue eyes, fair moustache, scar on back of one hand. He was in the hospital at Sydney during January last, and in May following wrote from that city to his wife, saying he was with one Tetley, a butcher, formerly of Wellington, and for whom he was going to manage a tobacconist's business. Complainant and his four children are destitute. (92/1100.)

PALMERSTON NORTH.—Leonard Styles is charged on warrant of commitment to Wanganui Gaol, in default of paying £9 for the maintenance of his five children. Description: A bootmaker, about 5ft. 4in. high, one leg shorter than the other, uses a crutch, dark moustache only; usually wears a dark-brown tweed suit and soft tweed hat. Will probably make for Wellington or Wanganui.

#### Absconding from Industrial Schools.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Charles Brown absconded from the Burnham Industrial School on the 28th February, 1889. He is sixteen years of age, fair complexion, blue eyes, very light hair, medium height and build. Parents reside at St. Albans, and his grandfather, Arthur Brown, who also goes by the name of Hamilton, is in the Wanganui District.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Louisa Dunn, licensed from the Burnham Industrial School, absconded from the service of Mr. Baddeley, Opawa, on the 27th June, 1891. Description:

Nineteen and a half years of age, medium height, stout build, full face, fair complexion, grey eyes. Her married sister (Mrs. Frost) lives in Broadway Street, Wellington.

If in respectable and comfortable situations, they need not be interfered with; but a report should be made to the Inspector of Police, Christchurch.

#### Kohimarama Industrial School, Auckland.

JAMES MARSHALL, seventeen years and nine months, absconded from the Costley Institute on the 2nd May, 1888, whilst there on probation. His stepfather, Alfred Marshall, resides in Riwaka, Nelson. Has the appearance of a half-caste Maori.

DAVID MILNE, seventeen years and four months, absconded from the service of Francis Symes, Waverley, on the 12th August, 1890. Very stout build, dark-brown hair, fresh complexion. His father, John Milne, is head ploughman on the farm of Mr. John Grigg, Longbeach, Ashburton.

JAMES BLUE, sixteen years and eight months, absconded 10th March, 1891. Stout build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair. Parents reside in Cumberland Street, Dunedin.

THOMAS KEEFE, fifteen years and eight months, absconded 19th May, 1891. Fair hair, fresh complexion, stout. Parents reside in Tauranga. His father, John Keefe, is a shoemaker.

JAMES MARSHALL, sixteen years and six months, absconded from the service of James Biddick, Kohimarama, in September, 1891. Stout, dark-curly hair. Speaks with difficulty, owing to an impediment in his speech. Mother resides in Auckland; father a seaman.

GEORGE JESSER, fifteen years and four months, absconded from the service of Mr. Tighe, Instructor of the Blind, on the 28th October, 1891, whilst staying at the Central Hotel, Wellington. Stout build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair. The boy's mother is alive, whereabouts not known. (See also *Police Gazette*, 1891, pages 209 and 217.)

ALBERT MIDDLETON, seventeen years and one month, absconded from the service of Robert U. Harden, Whangarei, on the 1st January, 1892. Tall for his age, dark, face freckled slightly. His father is an umbrella-mender and pedlar in Auckland. The boy returned to Auckland from Whangarei.

JOHN ARMSTRONG, fifteen years and six months, absconded on the 22nd May, 1892. He had but just returned from the service of Jonathan Embling, of Papakura. Was sent to the school from Nelson. Is of stout build, light hair, fresh complexion.

JAMES JACKSON, thirteen years and three months, absconded on the 19th July, 1892. Stout build, dark-brown hair, fresh complexion, dressed in dark-tweed coat, light corduroy trousers, small cloth cap. His mother lives in Addington. He may try to go South by vessel from Auckland or Onehunga. To be returned to the school.

Information *re* the above to be sent to the Inspector of Police, Auckland. All, excepting Jackson, who may be found in respectable situations need not be disturbed.

MANAIA.—Ngatai Himiona, Kaupokonui, reports stolen from the Native Reserve, near Normanby Road, between the 15th and 18th instant, a bay hack-gelding, about 15 hands high, five years old, slight white mark across nose caused by a rope when a foal, branded NGA on rump; value £4 10s.

#### Missing Friends.

JOHN DUCKETT is inquired for by the Port Chalmers Police, with a view of compelling him to contribute towards the support of his child in the Caversham Industrial School. Description: English, a fisherman and labourer, fifty-two years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, sallow complexion, dark hair beard whiskers and moustache all turning grey, fond of drink. He was at Maheno last harvest, and on leaving said he intended going to Moeraki or Purakanni Bay. An order was made on the 19th March, 1891, for payment of 6s. a week, and on the 18th ultimo he was £19 4s. in arrears.

DONALD CRAIG is inquired for through the Milton Police. Description: Scotch, a general labourer, about fifty years of age, 5ft. 6in. or 7in. high, stout build, round shoulders, leans forward when walking, fresh complexion, dark hair, full brown beard, rather long, bald on top of head. He left Dunedin in the s.s. "Waihora" about four weeks ago, supposed for Wellington, in company with a William Campion, thirty-five years of age, fair complexion, moustache only. Inquiry is made with the view of taking proceedings against him for the maintenance of his three children, who are at present with Mr. Donald McKewen, and totally unprovided for.

JOHN WELLS left Betchworth, Surrey, for Auckland, in September, 1875, and, after staying there twelve months, went into the bush. If living, will be thirty-seven years of age. No further particulars. Inquiry is made by his father, James Wells, 2, Hortham Road, Dorking, Surrey, through His Excellency the Governor. (92/1101.)

JAMES DOOLEY is inquired for by the Huntly Police, with a view of compelling him to contribute towards the support of his wife and child at Rangiriri, Waikato. Description: Born in Cape Colony, but came to New Zealand when an infant, a farm-labourer, twenty-nine years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, fair hair, sandy moustache only. His mother lives at Waipipi, near Pukekohe. He was heard of at Auckland about the 21st May last, and it is thought has gone to Sydney.

THOMAS CHARTERS (may assume some other name) is inquired for by the police at Christchurch, in order to compel him to support his illegitimate child. Description: Scotch (strong accent), a barman and bush-feller, thirty-two years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, smart, rather dark complexion and hair, clean-shaved except moustache when seen at Christchurch about last Christmas, ruptured on left side; single. He was barman at Patten's Hotel, Methven, is known to a Mrs. Tillyforth, a boardinghouse-keeper at or near Masterton, and has been at the latter town with John Quinn, a young man from Methven. Photograph can be sent for identification, if required.

THOMAS CLEGHORN, also known as Thomas Cook, is inquired for at the request of his wife, through the Hampden (Oamaru) Police. Description: English, a saddler, about forty-five years of age, 5ft. 6in. or 7in. high, fresh complexion, medium build, fair or reddish hair beard whiskers and moustache, rapid speech. Last heard of about three months ago at Blackhead Station, Hawke's Bay. On the 5th February, 1889, he was sentenced to fourteen days' labour for disobeying an order to pay 15s. a week towards the maintenance of his wife and family (see *Police Gazette*, 1889, page 53), and since then has only made one payment of 15s.

#### Rewards

SERGEANT T. O'GRADY and Constable M. Joyce, Oamaru and Hampden Police, have been awarded 10s. and £1 respectively for securing convictions under "The Beer Duty Act, 1880," on the 4th February last. (92/1062.)

*Extending Time for Shooting Native Game, Canterbury.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

WHEREAS by a warrant made under "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," dated the seventh day of March,

one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the tenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, it is, amongst other things, notified that native game, with certain exceptions, may be taken or killed in the North Canterbury District from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two: And whereas it is expedient to extend the time during which the said native game may be taken or killed in the aforesaid district:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said "Animals Protection Act, 1880," do hereby declare that native game, excepting tui, huia, white heron, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed in the aforesaid North Canterbury District, consisting of the Counties of Cheviot, Ashley, Akaroa, and Selwyn, until the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
