Arson.

ASHBURTON.—Isaac Sargent, Ashburton Forks, reports that, about 10 p.m. on the 20th ultimo, two stacks of oat-sheaves, value £20 each, were destroyed by fire, which it is believed was wilfully caused. Uninsured.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

Suva (Fiji).—Frederick Sydney Henry is charged on warrant with embezzling £113, money of the Government of Fiji. Description: A native of Chatham, Kent, a clerk, twenty-nine years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, active build and appearance, weight about 10st. 10lb., dark sallow complexion, black hair inclined to curl, small black moustache, lower jaw protrudes, lips rather thick, cross tattooed on right arm, and star in wreath and cross pistols on left forearm, well educated, much addicted to drink, and frequents the society of women; wore a dirty-looking blue-serge suit, and straw hat with blue-and-gold band. He arrived at Auckland on the 9th ultimo, and it is thought may have gone on to Sydney by the s.s. "Manapouri" two days later. When leaving Fiji he was accompanied by one Harry Scott, against whom there is no charge. The latter is well known in New Zealand, and is brother of Guillam Scott, manager of the Bank of New Zealand at Tauranga. Offender can be identified by Mr. James Callaghan, who is now in Auckland, superintending the building of a vessel for the Fiji Government. Warrant, depositions, and photograph taken five years ago, at Commissioner's Office. (93/798.)

SYDNEY.—S. Neumann is charged on warrant with having, at Sydney, during October, 1892, and January last, conspired with J. H. Ballin and cheated and defrauded Robert Hugo Scholz of large sums of money. Offender is a Hungarian,

forty-five years of age, 5ft. 3in. high, florid complexion, long brown moustache, broad shoulders, speaks French and German fluently, Polish imperfectly. Sells foreign premium bonds on time-payment, principally to foreigners. He is said to have been seen in Wellington on the 20th April last, and may go with his wife to Fiji. (93/723.)

AUCKLAND.—Charles Kernot is charged on warrant with having deserted his apprenticeship to Thomas Hoskins, bootmaker, Chancery Street, since the 1st April last. He is seventeen years of age, short and stout, dark hair and complexion, right thumb has been split.

AUCKLAND.—John N. Livesey is charged on warrant with having, on the 6th instant, embezzled the sum of £1, money of William John Geddis and another, by whom he was employed as canvasser for the *Observer* newspaper. Offender is English, a commission agent, thirty-three years of age, 5ft. 9½in. high, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, dark-blue eyes, large Roman nose, large mouth, clean-shaved except dark moustache, which is turning grey, medium build, moles on each arm, and one on left cheek. ARATAPU.—Patrick Murphy, for being drunk and disorderly, &c., has been arrested on discharge from Auckland Gaol, and sentenced to fourteen days' labour.

WHAKATANE.—Kararaina (Caroline) Tamihana is charged on warrant with having, on the 6th March last, at Ruatoki, wilfully obstructed Oliver Mason Creagh, an authorised surveyor. She is about forty years of age, stout build, 5ft. 7in. high, hair inclined to be sandy, tattooed on chin; wife of Te Amo, and is living at Ruatoki. The warrant is only to be executed on the European side of the confiscation line.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—Andrew Thompson, alias Kirk, charged with having assaulted and robbed David Golding, has been arrested by Constable F. Y. Watty, and remanded.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—Three men, names unknown, are charged on warrant with having, on the 5th instant, assaulted and robbed Harry Doreene of four £1 notes. Description: First, about twenty-five years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, medium build, fair complexion, clean-shaven except heavy fair moustache; dressed in a grey-tweed sac-suit and hard black-felt hat. Can be identified. Second, twenty-five to thirty years of age, about 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, dark complexion, dark moustache only. Third, twenty-five to thirty years of age, about 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, clean-shaven. The two last-described wore dark overcoats with capes, and hard black-felt hats.

WELLINGTON.—McConchie is charged on warrant with having, on the 3rd instant, forged and uttered to Harry Pritchard, grocer, Taranaki Street, a cheque for £4 9s., purporting to be drawn by William Hawkins on the Bank of New Zealand. Description: Irish, a labourer, thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, dark hair, clean-shaven except dark moustache; wore a grey-tweed suit and hat. He represented that Hawkins was a flax-miller at Masterton, but it has been ascertained that there is no such person. Offender came from Kaikoura on the 1st instant, accompanied by an old man known as Paddy, and they were both seen at Martinborough on the 8th.

GISBORNE.—Percival Barker, sheep-farmer, Whataupoko, reports that between the 17th and 29th ultimo two valuable dogs were maliciously poisoned, from the effects of which one of them died.

NELSON.—Thomas Andrew Ernest Scully is charged on warrant with having, on the 12th December last, embezzled the sum of £20, money of the New Zealand Government. Description: A native of the colony, a clerk, about twenty-five years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, stout build, dark complexion, full round face, dark eyes, black hair, dark moustache only; dressed, when last seen, in a dark-tweed suit and hard black-felt hat; may now be wearing grey-striped trousers. While employed in the Customs Department he received the above amount and appropriated it to his own use.

DUNEDIN.—William Wakefield is charged on warrant with having, on the 13th ultimo, obtained by a false pretence from William Absalom Smith, tailor, a suit of clothes and an overcoat, value £7 10s. Offender is about thirty-two years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, stout build, fair hair, very slight fair moustache, no whisker, about 10 stone weight, accustomed to horses; wore a dark-tweed sac-suit, and hard black hat with curled rim. Supposed to have made for Timaru or Christchurch, and is well known in the latter district.

SPRING GROVE (NELSON).—Breaking into and stealing from the Church of Christ: Selina and Violet Jane Brown have been arrested for this offence by Constable C. Knapp, and committed for trial. Stolen property recovered.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

AUCKLAND.—William Fell is charged on warrant with having, on the 17th ultimo, stolen from the dwelling of Mary Eleanor Whitlock, Karangahape Road, a shawl, value 10s. Identifiable. Offender is Scotch, a plumber, twenty-five years of age, 5ft. 3in. high, grey eyes, ruddy complexion, fair hair and moustache only; dressed in a black-cloth coat, black-and-brown-check tweed trousers and vest, elastic-side boots, and soft light-brown felt hat (worn on back of head). He lodged at complainant's for a few days, and the shawl was missed after his departure on the above date.

AUCKLAND.—George Tibbett, grocer, Hobson Street, reports that on the 2nd or 3rd instant his shop was broken into, and £3 stolen. Entrance effected by the front-door key, which complainant's shopman, John Nesbitt, alleges was stolen from his pocket, with the key of the safe, at complainant's dwelling, Wellington Street.

AUCKLAND.—W. and J. Peet, grocers, Karangahape Road, report that on the 4th or 5th instant their shop was broken into through the back window, and about 4s. 6d. stolen.

AUCKLAND.—Francis Pheasant, Matakoe, reports stolen from him, at Fowles's drapery-shop, Queen Street, on the 25th ultimo, a chamois-leather purse with steel clasp, containing a sovereign, and a cheque for £2 10s., drawn on the Bank of New Zealand, Auckland, by E. Pheasant, and payable to complainant. Suspicion attached to two men, names un-

known, but who can be identified. Description: First twenty-five to thirty years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, medium build, reddish side-whiskers and moustache, chin shaved; dressed in a light-tweed suit and hard black hat. Second about the same age, about 5ft. 9in. high, clean-shaved except black moustache, dark complexion; wore a soft grey-felt hat with spotted puggaree.

ROTORUA.—Man, unknown, for stealing from Robert Henry McGough's tent: Edward Kane, alias Fraser, has been arrested by Native Constable Hingawaka for this offence, and sentenced to three months' labour by the Rotorua Bench.

TAURANGA.—Stealing from the dwelling of Patrick Donovan, Te Puke: The coat and vest have been recovered from Te Mapu Tohiariki, a Native at Te Matai, who states he purchased them from a man supposed to be identical with John Stephenson, alias Sutherland, since committed for trial for C. HELENSVILLE (AUCKLAND).—During the night of the 16th ultimo the railway-office was broken into, and the mail-bag, the property of the Postmaster-General, abstracted and thrown into the river, where it was found next morning. The bag had been cut open, and some books belonging to the Town Board placed therein, also pieces of coal, to sink it. The letters were placed in a basket on the office-floor, the remaining portion of the mail being left in the bag.

WELLINGTON.—Kate Carden reports stolen from her, between the 7th and 11th ultimo, about £300 in Bank of New Zealand notes—viz., one £50, ten £20, and the remainder in £10, £5, and £1; a ladies' gold open-faced watch, number unknown, engraved inside case "Presented to Kate Carden by the children of St. Mary's Roman Catholic School, 1874, value £8; a garnet brooch, set in gold, with one pendant; and a ladies' silk umbrella, with white bow to end of handle: value of the two latter articles, £2. Suspicion attached to William McCarthy, alias Sullivan, Samuel Hill, and Thomas Riordan. The first two have been sentenced to two years' labour for assault and robbery. Riordan has recently been discharged from gaol. (See "Prisoners discharged," also *Police Gazette*, 1893, page 7.) Complainant was knocking about the city and Petone in a drunken state during the time above mentioned, and cannot give an account of her movements. She is now at Mrs. Smith's boarding-house, Molesworth Street.

GREYTOWN NORTH.—The Railway Commissioners report that on the 4th or 5th instant the station was broken into, and the following stolen: A blue smooth pilot-cloth pea-jacket, size 7, body lined with strong cotton material, red-yellow-and-white pattern, sleeves with fine light-brown striped material; and six pairs of coloured moleskin trousers, "New Zealand Chief" brand; value £3 16s.

OTAKI.—A youth, name unknown, is charged with having, on the 26th ultimo, stolen an English double-cased lever watch, maker unknown; white-metal chain (long twisted and short round links alternately), and a heart-shaped locket, glass or stone, black on one side and red on the other, bound with silver, attached; value £3 15s. 6d.; the property of Tauhu Roera, Ohau. Offender is supposed colonial, about eighteen years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, fair hair and complexion; dressed in tweed clothes and black overcoat. He met complainant on the road, and asked him for his watch to see the time; it was handed to him, and they walked together to the railway-station, where the offender disappeared with it. Complainant is half-witted, but there seems to be no doubt as to the truth of the statement. Offender is said to have gone to Foxton, and to be working at a flax-mill there. No warrant.

in centre, the other has a horse-shoe stamped on it, and has been set with diamonds and two rubies, but one of the latter and most of the former are missing; value £5.

He left Gore on the above date, supposed for Dunedin, taking the box with him, and was accompanied by complainant's wife, Mary Ann Port, and a boy seven years of age, an inmate of the Caversham Industrial School. The boy, if found, is to be returned to the school.



PALMERSTON NORTH.—Leonard Styles (*alias* Mancktelow), for default of maintenance of his children, has been arrested by Constable J. Madden, Wellington Police, and committed to the Terrace Gaol.

GREYMOUTH.—Thomas Anderson is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Alice Roda Anderson, since the 14th February, 1893. Description: A Norwegian, speaks English well, a sawyer and bushman, about forty-five years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, square shoulders, sallow complexion, large blue eyes, scar over right one, heavy eyebrows, dark-brown hair, whiskers and moustache of a lighter colour and worn long, stoops when walking, fond of drink; generally dressed decently. He was served with a summons at Westport on the 3rd April last, and since then no trace of him can be obtained. His wife and children are now in receipt of charitable aid.

CHRISTCHURCH.—William Smyth is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Jane Grace Smyth, Wordsworth Street, Sydenham, since the 28th April last. He is English, a plasterer, sixty years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, medium build, sallow complexion, grey hair beard and moustache; dressed in a blue-cloth coat, moleskin trousers, and woollen peaked cap. Travels with a knife-grinding machine.

Description: A native of the colony, a boot-maker, thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, medium build, dark complexion, clean-shaved except small dark-brown moustache, brown eyes, addicted to drink.

Horse- and Cattle-stealing.

HAWERA.—John Hunter and John Syliskie are charged on warrants with having, on or about the 20th February last, at Manaia, stolen twenty-eight head of cattle, the property of H. W. Read. Hunter is supposed a native of Australia, about thirty-five years of age, about 5ft. 11in. high, clean-shaved except brown moustache, brown hair, stout and well built, a good horseman, fond of drink; dressed in a dark-tweed coat and vest, light-tweed trousers, and soft black-felt hat; carried a stockwhip across his shoulder, under his coat; has a revolver. Syliskie is a Frenchman or Pole, twenty-five or twenty-six years of age, 6ft. 1in. or 2in. high, slight slop build, very dark, resembles a half-caste, dark hair and moustache only; dressed when last seen the same as Hunter. Both ride black ponies, and were at Marton on the 5th instant. Offenders are the ringleaders of a notorious gang of horse- and cattle-thieves, four of whom are already in custody, and the arrest of these two is of great importance. They will no doubt endeavour to leave the colony.

FEILDING.—Arthur Osborne (name probably fictitious) is charged on warrant with having, on the 14th April last, at Bunynthorpe, stolen a horse, saddle, and bridle, value £14 12s., the property of Henry George Bailey, of Taonui; since recovered. Offender is about thirty years of age, about 5ft. 11in. high, stout build, sallow complexion, large eyes, rather small dark or black side-whiskers and moustache, has the appearance of a labourer; supposed to be wearing a brown-tweed suit, cotton or crimean shirt, and soft drab-felt hat. The horse, &c., were stolen from outside the Bunynthorpe Hotel, and sold by the offender to Frank Gay, at Feilding, on the 15th ultimo.
