Arson.

HAMPDEN (OMARU).—About 6 a.m. on the 10th ultimo a threshing-mill and two stacks of wheat at Kauroo Hill, near Maheno, the property of Clarke Brothers, were destroyed by fire which it is believed was wilfully caused. Insured in the South British Office, mill £275, stacks £25.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—Adolph F. S. Prien is charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee, on the 22nd February last, of an enlarged photographic picture, value £3 10s., the property of Percy Arthur Hadley. Offender is a German, but resembles an Italian, about twenty-eight years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, sallow complexion, black hair, small black moustache only, sharp features, very black eyes, very large hands and feet; generally wears a long black morning coat and a hard black-felt hat; sometimes has a comforter round neck. He was employed by complainant to show the picture through the district, and has failed to return it or its value. Was seen in Queen Street, Auckland, about four weeks ago. A person, supposed to be his wife, and who may be going under the name of Miss Shaw, is said to be a waitress at an hotel in Dargaville.

AUCKLAND.—Charles Kernot, charged with deserting from his apprenticeship with Thomas Hoskings, has been arrested by Constable William Bern, Thames Police, and remanded to Auckland.

PUKEKOHE (AUCKLAND).—James McAllister is charged with having, on the 28th ultimo, at Patumahoe, forged and uttered to Thomas Kinsey, hotelkeeper, a cheque on the Bank of Australasia, Auckland, for £5 10s. 6d., in favour of H. Richmond by James Carter, there being no account at

the bank in the latter's name. Offender is Scotch, about thirty years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, florid complexion, red bushy whiskers and moustache, sandy hair, regular features; wore a grey-tweed suit and hard black hat. He stayed at complainant's hotel for a few days, and gave the cheque in payment of £1 5s. 6d. for board, receiving the balance in cash. It has been ascertained that he obtained two blank cheques from a storekeeper near the hotel, one of which has been filled in as above. He is supposed to have gone to Auckland or Waikato, and is said to be well known at Whatawhata and Mangare. No warrant.

WAVERLEY.—James Walker (probably a fictitious name), is charged on warrant with having, on the 1st instant, forged and uttered to W. H. Southcombe, storekeeper, a cheque for £3 5s. on the Bank of New Zealand, Patea, purporting to be signed by Andrew Hunter, of Brunswick, in favour of accused, but which has been returned marked "No account," and is declared by Mr. Hunter to be a forgery. Offender is English, a labourer, fifty-five to sixty years of age, about 5ft. 5in. high, slight build, dark hair mixed with grey, florid complexion, side-whiskers and moustache, chin shaved, small face, very thick lips; dressed in a brown-tweed suit, black slouch hat, "Zealandia" shooting-boots with nails. He purchased goods to the value of £1 1s. 6d., receiving the balance in change, and appears to have obtained the blank cheque at the Bank of New Zealand, Patea, a few days previously, stating his name was Arthur Wright, and that he lived at Wanganui, where he had an account. He left Waverley by train on the 3rd instant, taking a ticket for Palmerston North.

WELLINGTON.—John Reginald, *alias* Crawford, for forging and uttering a cheque to G. W. Wilton, has been arrested by Constable C. Bowden, Martinborough Police, and committed for trial.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Joseph Davis is charged with disobeying the terms of his release under "The First Offenders' Probation Act, 1886." Description: A native of the colony, a farm-labourer, nineteen years of age, 5ft. 3½in. high, medium build, dark complexion, dark-brown hair, brown eyes, medium nose, mouth, and chin; left thumb has been amputated; 120lb. weight; dressed, when last seen, in an old brown-tweed sac-coat and old black-felt hat. He left his employment at Mr. Drury's, farmer, Halswell, about the end of May last, and spoke of going to Lyttelton, and from thence working his way to Sydney; also said he might go to Cheviot. He was formerly an inmate of the Burnham Industrial School.

CHRISTCHURCH.—George Burns, for forging and uttering a cheque to William McLeod: There is now every reason to believe that this offender is not identical with the David Miller mentioned in the above-quoted reference.

TEMUKA.—David Miller, for false pretences on Michael Scannell, has been arrested for larceny by the Coalgate Police, and sentenced to two months' labour in Lyttelton Gaol. He was going under the name of David Mathieson Morrison.

DUNEDIN.—William Wakefield, for false pretences on William Absalom Smith, has been arrested by Chief Detective W. Campbell, Wellington Police, on information furnished by Detective T. Livingstone, of Oamaru, and remanded to Dunedin.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

AUCKLAND.—Samuel Fulman Craig, Church Street, Devonport, reports that on the 29th ultimo his dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: A ladies' gold locket, oval shape, about 2in. long, set with a diamond encircled by pearls (one of the latter is missing); a gold neck-chain, rope pattern, rather thick, two patent rings attached; and 5s. 6d. in silver: total value, £8 5s. 6d. Entrance effected by bursting open the back door.

AUCKLAND.—George Gyde, Renall Street, Ponsonby, reports that on the 29th ultimo his dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: Two plain gold wedding-rings, a gold keeper-ring (the latter and one of the former very much worn); a ladies' gold ring with two small sapphires and an imitation diamond in centre; a pair of gold earrings, large size (resembling the figure 8), small red stone in centre; a pair of earrings made of two threepenny-pieces; and a small round silver brooch, glass at back, containing hair, pin broken; value £8. Entrance supposed to have been effected by the back door.

AUCKLAND.—James Flynn, corner of Wellesley and Vernon Streets, reports that on the 3rd or 4th instant his dwelling was broken into, and three door-keys and some stamps stolen. Keys identifiable.

AUCKLAND.—Charles Vasta, railway engine-driver, reports that, about 8:20 p.m. on the 30th ultimo, he was assaulted by three or four men, and robbed of two £5 and two £1 notes, and a small wooden pipe, silver-mounted and engraved, amber mouthpiece broken off at the end. Complainant describes one of the assailants as about thirty years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, medium build, short dark beard, dressed in a dark suit, and thinks he could identify him. It is, however, considered to be a doubtful case.

AUCKLAND.—Ellesmere Triphook, City Road, reports stolen from his dwelling, on the 2nd instant, a ladies' silver Waltham hunting-watch, number unknown; a ladies' gold chain, plaited pattern, hook, tassel, and small stone ball attached; a gold keeper-ring, "Mizpah" in raised letters thereon; and a small gold locket containing complainant's photograph: value, £10.

AUCKLAND.—Claude Colebrook, St. George's Bay Road, Parnell, reports stolen from his dwelling on the 1st instant a silver Geneva hunting-watch, ELC on outside of front case, maker and number unknown; a ladies' ring, set with a sapphire and four pearls (one missing); and a chased gold brooch with gold pin: value, £9 10s.

PORT ALBERT, AUCKLAND.—Thomas Walsh, farmer, Tauhoa, Kaipara, reports stolen from his dwelling, on the 13th ultimo, two blankets, a sheet, two pillow-slips, two L.O.U.s for £21 and £2 respectively, an account-book, letters, maps, tracings, and other documents, &c.; value, £30. Suspicion attached to complainant's wife, who is living with her brother at Tauhoa.

WANGANUI.—Mrs. Mary Allen reports stolen from a hat-box at the Customhouse Hotel, between the 17th and 19th ultimo, a ladies' gold open-faced watch, supposed Geneva, No. 7793; a gold-washed chain, three-ply; a small black snuff-box, a white-silk handkerchief with blue and brown border, a pair of new brown-kid gloves, and a half-sovereign: total value, £6 13s. 6d. Case doubtful.

WELLINGTON.—Charles Cathie, tailor, Manners Street, reports that between 6 and 10 p.m. on the 4th instant his factory was broken into, and the following stolen: Seven pairs of drab-tweed trousers, finished, but not pressed, red-and-white waistbands; thirteen ditto, dark-grey and blue-check tweed, similar waistbands; one ditto, dark-check tweed; five dark-check tweed vests, blue stripes in lining, and marked "5" in pencil thereon; and a pair of boys' knickerbocker pants; value, £15. Identifiable.

GREYMOUTH.—John Hore, carter, Coal Creek, reports lost or stolen from him, on the 13th ultimo, a small calico bag (used as a purse), containing a cheque for £4 4s. 6d., and 15s. in silver. Bag identifiable. The cheque was cashed at the Union Bank of Australia on the same day by a man about forty years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, dark hair whiskers and moustache. His identification is doubtful.

Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

ONEHUNGA.—Stealing Edward White's saddle and bridle: A warrant has been issued for the arrest of *John Thomas Todd* for this offence. Description: English, a cattle-dealer, thirty-four years of age, 5ft. 8½in. high, very sandy complexion, red hair, bald, blue eyes, large nose, stout build, weighs about 13st., has corns and walks badly, turning the toes outwards, large freckled hands, clean-shaved except small red moustache, addicted to drink; dressed, when last seen, in a sac-suit resembling blue serge, and round black-felt hat; usually wears a suit of stone-coloured tweed. Is identical with John Todd, convicted of larceny at Hastings. (See *Police Gazette*, 1891, page 137.) Offender left on the 29th May last by s.s. "Gairloch" for New Plymouth, under the name of *Johnson*. The stolen property has been recovered on premises recently in his occupation. There are other charges pending.

TAURANGA.—Michael Patrick Steward, Katikati, reports stolen from his stable, on the 22nd or 23rd ultimo, a dark-canvas horse-cover, lined with striped blanket, slightly worn; value, £1.

WANGANUI.—Alexander Cormack reports stolen from the porch of the Presbyterian Church, during the evening of the 11th ultimo, a grey mackintosh overcoat, cape attached, horn buttons; and a pair of black-cloth gloves: value, £3 18s. 6d.

TE AROHA.—William Moon (Waitoa) reports stolen from his buggy, at Te Aroha, on the 2nd instant, a brownish-plaid woollen rug, value 15s.; also a ladies' fur boa, about two and a half yards long, value £4 (the property of Miss Mary Moon).

LYTELTON.—The Railway Commissioners report stolen from No. 1 Goods-shed, on the 16th ultimo, a small wooden box, addressed "Mr. Spragge, Port Levy, per s.s. 'John Anderson,'" containing a Rochester lamp and a candlestick; value, £1 5s.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

GREYMOUTH.—Thomas Anderson is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Alice Roda Anderson, since the 14th February, 1893. Description: A Norwegian, speaks English well, a sawyer and bushman, about forty-five years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, square shoulders, sallow complexion, large blue eyes, scar over right eye, heavy eyebrows, dark-brown hair, whiskers and moustache of a lighter colour and worn long, stoops when walking, fond of drink; generally dressed decently. He was served with a summons at Westport on the 3rd April last, and since then no trace of him can be obtained. His wife and children are now in receipt of charitable aid.

KAIAPOI.—Robert Weir is charged on warrant with failing to provide for the support of his illegitimate child by Ellen Ashby. Description: Supposed Scotch, a labourer, generally employed in meat-freezing or wool-washing establishments; about twenty-two years of age, about 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, dark hair, full red hairless face, blue eyes, bow-legged; dressed, when last seen, in a dark suit and hard black hat. He left about four months ago, supposed for the Wellington District, or some other part of the North Island. Warrant issued on the 19th ultimo, he having failed to appear on that date in answer to a summons left at his last known place of residence at Belfast.

WELLINGTON.—Sophia Isaacs, *alias* Taylor, is charged on warrant with having deserted her infant child since the 1st February last. Description: About twenty years of age, short, slight build, brown hair, dark complexion and eyes, a servant. She left the child with Mrs. Clark, Upper Hutt, on the above date, agreeing to pay 7s. a week for its support, and is said to have left Wellington by the s.s. "Takapuna" a few days afterwards. Her parents reside at Waitara, Taranaki. She has not made any payment.

WELLINGTON.—Samuel Berg is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court, made on the 19th November, 1888, to pay 10s. a week towards the support of his wife and child. Description: A native of the colony, a bootmaker, thirty years of age, 5ft. 6½in. high, fresh complexion, brown hair, dark-blue eyes. (See *Police Gazette*, 1889, page 25.) The sum of £19 10s. was due on the 13th April last. If he will make an attempt to pay the arrears the warrant need not be executed.

AUCKLAND.—Eugene, *alias* Captain, McCarthy is charged on warrant of commitment to Auckland Gaol for two months' labour for disobeying an order of Court to contribute to the support of his wife and five children. Description: A mariner and gum-digger, about fifty years of age, stout build, 5ft. 9in. or 10in. high, dark hair, full beard whiskers and moustache, turning grey, swarthy complexion, brown eyes, large nose. Supposed to be on a gumfield.

INVERCARGILL.—Charles Canty, charged with leaving his children without means of support, is now stated to have been working, about two months ago, at a sawmill near Scot's Dale Township, about thirty miles from Launceston, Tasmania. He passes himself off as a single man.

ASHBURTON.—Thomas Bird is charged on warrant with deserting his wife, Sarah Norris Bird, and five children, since the 12th ultimo. Description: A native of Rangiora, where

his parents reside, a general labourer, twenty-eight to thirty years of age, looks younger, 5ft. 10in. high, slim build, brown hair, blue eyes, brown moustache only, smart active appearance. Complainant and children are utterly destitute, and receiving charitable aid.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Arthur Alfred Sutton is charged on warrant with deserting his wife, Sarah Ann Sutton, since the 15th ultimo. Description: English, a labourer, shearer, or engine-driver, twenty-five years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, stout build, fair hair and complexion, blue eyes. Photograph at Inspector's Office, Christchurch. Complainant and her family are in receipt of charitable aid.

WILLIAM HENRY POWELL, stoker, a native of Radnorshire, twenty-two years of age, 5ft. 4½in. high, brown hair, brown eyes, fair complexion, cut on under lip. A reward of £3 is offered for his arrest, in addition to £5 from the Colonial Government.

Escaped Prisoner.

WANGANUI.—George Harper escaped from the hard-labour gang employed at the Museum, Queen's Park, at 3.45 p.m. on the 19th ultimo. Description: Irish, a gardener, an ex-constable, forty-three years of age, looks younger, 5ft. 11½in. high, medium build, fair curly hair, fresh complexion, light-brown eyes. (See *Police Gazette*, 1893, pages 24 and 99.) Photographed at Auckland on 27th December, 1892. He was undergoing a sentence of six months, and has been repeatedly convicted. Last heard of as having been at Poverty Flat, Wanganui, at 9 p.m. on the above date.

Horse- and Cattle-stealing.

FEILDING.—Arthur Osborne (name probably fictitious) is charged on warrant with having, on the 14th April last, at Bunnythorpe, stolen a horse, saddle, and bridle, value £14 12s., the property of Henry George Bailey, of Taonui; since recovered. Offender is about thirty years of age, about 5ft. 11in. high, stout build, sallow complexion, large eyes, rather small dark or black side-whiskers and moustache, has the appearance of a labourer; supposed to be wearing a brown-tweed suit, cotton or crimean shirt, and soft drab-felt hat. The horse, &c., were stolen from outside the Bunnythorpe Hotel, and sold by the offender to Frank Gay, at Feilding, on the 15th May last.

Description: Irish, a domestic servant, about twenty-two years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, stout build, fair complexion, dark eyes and hair; supposed single. She left her lodgings in Frederick Street, Dunedin, about four months ago, and has failed to make payments for the maintenance of her child left with Mrs. Hiscoke, Kensington. It is requested that every endeavour may be made to ascertain her whereabouts, application having been made to have the child committed to the Industrial School.

MISS GRIFFITHS (name supposed to be fictitious) is inquired for by the Dunedin Police, with the view of compelling her to support her illegitimate child, left with Mrs. Kirk, Roslyn, on the 23rd May last. Description: Supposed a factory hand, about twenty-two years of age, about 5ft. 5in. high, medium build, light-brown hair, fair complexion, good-looking; wore a long, dark waterproof jacket, and black straw hat. She gave her address as North Cumberland Street, but cannot be found there, or at any of the Dunedin factories.

GEORGE HOWARD is inquired for by the Blenheim Police, at the instance of his wife. Description: A native of the colony, a cabinetmaker, thirty years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, fresh complexion, good-looking, slightly knock-kneed and round-shouldered, sandy whiskers and moustache. He left Blenheim on the 5th ultimo for Wellington on business connected with his trade, and subsequently wrote from Danevirke, saying he was going to Napier, and would return by steamer to Wellington. He is well known to Sergeants White and Cullen, Wellington and Napier Police.

JOSEPH HEWSON is inquired for through the Milton (Otago) police. Description: Scotch (broad accent), a baker, about forty-five years of age, about 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair beard whiskers and moustache (worn rather long); single. He left Milton on the 28th January last, taking £200 with him, and spoke of going South, or to the diggings at Preservation Inlet. Had been drinking heavily before leaving. (L.S.) GLASGOW, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same: And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the Districts of Norsewood and Ruataniwha:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, alter and redefine the boundaries of the said Licensing Districts of Norsewood and Ruataniwha, which shall, from and after the first day of July, be those described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

NORSEWOOD.

ALL that area comprised within the Norsewood Riding of Waipawa County, as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 15, 2nd March, 1893.

RUATANIWAHA.

ALL that area comprised within the Waipukurau Riding of Waipawa County, as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 30, 12th May, 1887; and the Ruataniwha Riding of Waipawa County, as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 15, 2nd March, 1893.
