NOTICE.—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette*, see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the member of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property, supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

All communications concerning this *Gazette* should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For *Gazette*."

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

MOAWHANGA.—Duncan Calvert Monteith, *alias* H. M. Brandon, is charged, on warrant issued by the Napier Bench, with having, on the 21st ultimo, at Moawhanga, obtained from Robert T. Batley, storekeeper, the sum of £3 by means of a valueless cheque. Offender is about sixty-five years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, very grey hair, moustache only, teeth gone except four front ones, which are large and very black; dressed in dark-tweed suit and dark-felt hat, nearly new. (See also *Police Gazette*, 1889, page 191, and 1891, page 99.) He arrived by coach from Napier, and obtained the amount in exchange for his cheque on the National Bank, which has been returned marked "No account." He then left for Karioi, and was seen next morning on the road to Wanganui.

WANGANUI.—Leo William De La Fontaine, *alias* William Evans, is charged on warrant with having, on or about the 3rd instant, forged and uttered to Hugh Black, Victoria Avenue, a cheque for £9 9s. Description; A French Canadian, a sailor and labourer, twenty-seven or twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. 8½in. or 9in. high, over 40in. round chest, clean-shaved except fair to auburn moustache, JE in heart tattooed on left wrist, large wound-mark at left armpit, bullet-wound on left side, three upper front teeth out; wore a blue-tweed hat and black or dark sac-coat; served on a man-of-war for some years; was a soldier in the Salvation Army at Feilding. Offender purchased two blank cheques at the Bank of Australasia, Wanganui, filled one in for the above amount (purporting to be signed by Edward Dunn, in favour of Charles Clarke), and paid it to complainant for £1 10s. worth of goods, receiving the balance in change. No such person as Dunn is known to the bank. The other cheque (No. 119413) has not yet been presented. Offender left Feilding surreptitiously during the night of the 5th instant, leaving his effects behind. He was seen in Marton on the following day, and went in the direction of Bull's.

WELLINGTON.—Walter Williams, *alias* Turpin, is charged on warrant with false pretences on Annie Kelly, servant at the Cambridge Hotel. Description: A colonial, a cash-better, thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 10in. or 11in. high, slight build, sallow complexion, dark moustache only. Offender obtained the sum of £109 14s. from complainant, on the 5th instant, on the pretence of marrying her, and entering into possession of the Rainbow Hotel, Kaiwara. He left by train for the north on the following day.

PETONE (WELLINGTON).—John Mitchell is charged on warrant with having, on the 4th instant, wilfully and obscenely exposed his person to Gertrude and Grace Hartley. Offender is a Frenchman, about forty years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, stout build, sallow complexion, light-brown hair cut short, sandy whiskers and moustache, long sandy beard; dressed in dirty brown-tweed coat and vest, dirty moleskin trousers, and light straw hat. He was summoned to appear at the Resident Magistrate's Court on the 11th instant, but left by train for Wellington on the previous day.

EKETAHUNA.—Mah, unknown, for larceny as a bailee: Donald *alias* William Graham, *alias* Mann, *alias* Fraser, has been arrested for this offence at Opunake, by Constables H. Salmon and J. Twomey, and remanded to Eketahuna. None of the stolen property recovered. Complainant's name is Alfred Dowdeswell.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Samuel Cooper Wright is charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee, on the 4th ultimo, of a waterproof-overcoat; value £2 10s.; the property of Walter John Hoddinott, Selwyn Street, Addington; since recovered. Offender is English, a clerk, about twenty-seven years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, fair complexion, clean-shaved; dressed in a light-grey-tweed sac-suit and hard light-brown-felt hat with black band about 2in. wide; respectable appearance. Accused obtained the loan of the coat, and a few days afterwards it was found to have been sold to S. Cohen, a pawnbroker.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person and from Dwellings.

AUCKLAND.—Frederick Gaudin, licensee, Grand Hotel, reports stolen from the bar, on the 31st ultimo, a silver lemon-knife, round ivory handle, saw edge, flowering on blade; value 7s. 6d. Identifiable.

AUCKLAND.—John Bushell, Lower Vincent Street, reports stolen from him at the Epsom Racecourse, on the 31st ultimo, eight £1 notes.

AUCKLAND.—John McKenzie, *Daily News* office, New Plymouth, reports stolen from him during the passage from the latter port in the s.s. "Takapuna," or at Auckland, on the

30th or 31st ultimo, a brown-leather purse, containing four £1 notes and a Union Company's return-ticket in complainant's name.

AUCKLAND.—Thomas Edward Fitzgerald, Waitemata Street, Ponsonby, reports stolen (supposed), between the 16th November last and 29th ultimo, a small jewel-box, lined with silk velvet, tray on top, containing a pair of old-fashioned gold earrings, hoop-shape, set with about fifty small pearls; three rosettes, set with about fifty large pearls; a ladies' double-cased gold watch, large size, old fashioned, maker and number unknown; a gold scarf-pin, large nugget-head; blue-enamelled ditto, woman's head, set with four diamonds; an ivory ditto, death's head setting; two gentlemen's gold watch-chains, oblong links; a gentleman's gold ring, greenstone shield; an oval miniature on ivory of a colonel, dated 1820, size 3in. by 2½in., set with twenty-four diamonds inside the frame; three red-coral shirt-studs, three torquoise vest-buttons, a gold horseshoe scarf-pin, walking-stick pattern, with ivory head; and a number of other articles which cannot be described; estimated value £100. Complainant, who was absent during the time above mentioned, missed the box on his return. The doors and windows were securely fastened, and there is no sign of any one having entered the dwelling.

WANGANUI.—Atorea reports stolen from his dwelling at Kauaeroa, Upper Wanganui River, about the 20th ultimo, a gold lever hunting-watch, jewelled in four holes, gold balance, No. 26601, makers Peterson and Co., Christchurch; value £25.

HUNTERVILLE.—James Newell reports stolen from him while on a spree at the Hunterville Hotel, on the 15th or 16th instant, three £5 notes, two of them numbered A052050 and A046228 respectively; and nine £1 ditto, four of them numbered 451081, 270168, 314860, and 352,646; all on the Bank of New Zealand.

KAIKOURA (CANTERBURY).—Erik Nickals, labourer, reports that, on the 7th instant, his dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: A gold albert-chain, long links (one broken), a gold locket, "Minnie" written outside, attached; four gold-plated shirt-studs, and a £5 note on the Bank of New Zealand; value in all £16.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Lient.-Colonel John Hart reports stolen from a bedroom at Coker's Hotel, Christchurch, on the 9th instant, an open-faced Waterbury watch, with small-linked silver chain attached; a ladies' gold Geneva half-hunting keyless watch, maker and number unknown, attached was a short gold chain, very fine links; and a gold Arabic coin, about 1in. square, mounted as a brooch, pin diagonally; value £11 10s. Complainant's address is care of Cutten and Hart, Princes Street, Dunedin.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Timothy Lynch, no fixed abode, reports stolen from him while asleep in the Hagley Park, on the 13th instant, an English silver lever hunting-watch, "H. Roberts" on dial, No. 26853 or 26855, common brass chain attached; value £3 0s. 6d. Suspicion attached to Ellen Parkinson, alias Danby, who was in complainant's company. INVERCARGILL.—Mrs. John Campbell, Woodend, reports stolen from her at the Caledonian Grounds, on the 2nd instant, a leather purse, three compartments, clasp on top, containing four £1 notes and 3s. or 4s. in silver. Purse identifiable.

INVERCARGILL.—Catherine Willis reports stolen from her at the Caledonian Grounds, on the 2nd instant, an old leather purse, clasp at side, containing 13s., some white rosary beads with medals attached, and a drawer-key; value in all 18s.

INVERCARGILL.—Edward Phillips, Jed Street, reports that, on the 15th instant, his dwelling was broken into, and four £1 notes stolen. Suspicion attached to Alexander McKenzie, a fitter, seventeen years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, slender build, long dark features, dark hair, stoops when walking. He lives next door to complainant, and was convicted of house-breaking on the 14th November last, and sentenced to three months' probation.

OAMARU.—Stealing Robert Johnston's trousers: William Moody has been arrested for this offence by Detective T. O'Brien, and sentenced to twenty-one days' labour. Trousers recovered.

ASHBURTON.—John McLellan, Thomas Baker, and Henry Leggett report stolen from their bedrooms in the Panama Boardinghouse, on the 13th instant, the sums of £2 15s., £1 2s. 6d., and 7s. 6d. respectively. Some letters addressed to Leggett, and one to W. H. Piper, Hereford Street, Christchurch, were also taken.

ASHBURTON.—David William Jones, teacher, Roman Catholic School, reports stolen at Mrs. Mary Ann Harkin's, between the 2nd ultimo and 16th instant, sixteen £10, one £5, and two £1 notes, bank and numbers unknown; 17s. 6d. in silver, a gold albert-guard, round flat links, gold thread twisted round every second one, value £7; and a silver albert, scaly-snake-pattern, value £1 10s. Gold albert identifiable. Complainant was away during the above-mentioned dates, and left the property in a wooden box in his bedroom. On the 8th instant the premises were burnt down, and the remains of the box found among the debris. Mrs. Harkin is said to be the only person who knew where the money, &c., was kept; and her furniture was over-insured.

LYTTELTON.—Alexander McCormick, boarder, Crown Hotel, reports stolen, on the 16th or 17th instant, a dark-tweed sac-coat, check-pattern, nearly new; value £1 10s. Identifiable.

LYTTELTON.—James Lahn, boarder, Crown Hotel, reports stolen, on the 16th or 17th instant, a new black diagonal-serve coat; value £2 10s. Identifiable.

DUNEDIN.—John Boyles, carter, South Dunedin, reports stolen from his dwelling, between the 15th and 19th instant, a small white-chamois-leather purse with clasp, containing two £1 notes and 1s. Purse identifiable.

Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

WAVERLEY.—Thomas Johnson reports stolen from inside the Maori Pa, on the 9th instant, a cornsack swag, tied with a piece of white fishing-line, containing two pairs of grey-tweed trousers, partly worn, one has a diamond-shaped patch on the right knee; a shaving-brush with bright-steel handle, hollow-ground razor, rusted near handle; seven photographs, three shirts (one cotton, two woollen), four cotton singlets, a pair of watertight boots, pair of light shooter boots, parcel of letters, two grey blankets (one rent in centre), two tweed coats (one light colour, the other dark), a small round alarm clock, forget-me-nots on case, seconds-hand missing; a dark-tweed waistcoat, leather strap, and four pairs of woollen socks; value £12. Stolen while complainant, who was the worse of drink, was in one of the whares for a few minutes.

LITTLE RIVER (CANTERBURY).—William Horwood, labourer, Aylesbury, reports stolen from his clothing in the Pavillion, on the 2nd instant, a new brown-leather purse, about 5in. by 3in., with elastic band, containing about 12s. in silver.

OAMARU.—George G. Jackson, Weston, reports stolen from a shed in Cross Steet, Oamaru, on the 7th instant, a single-breasted blue-serve overcoat, size 5, military make, lined with tartan plaid, two outside hip-pockets and an inside breast-pocket, not much worn; value £2. Identifiable.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Miss Rosamond Kennedy, 38, St. Asaph Street, Linwood, reports stolen from the waiting-room at the Christchurch Railway-station, on the 24th ultimo, a ladies' mackintosh, grey with dark-blue spots, black-satin hood attached, almost new; value £1 10s. Identifiable.

DUNEDIN.—Frederick John Hall, clicker, Scotland Street, reports stolen from the Garrison Hall, on the 3rd instant, a long dark-tweed overcoat with cape, lined with black italian-cloth, two outside pockets, bone buttons; value £2 10s. Identifiable.

WAITAHUNA (OTAGO).—William McClelland reports stolen from a dredge at Greenfield, Clutha River, between the 24th and 26th ultimo, a driving-shaft, screw-jack, union screw, steam indicator, two sets of copper tubes, and a quantity of brass fittings; value £24 10s. Identifiable. Suspicion is attached to Peter Bannatyne and Robert Frances, now at Greenfield and Milton respectively. They were formerly employed by the Tuapeka Dredging Company, but discharged by complainant on his taking a contract from the company to overhaul and repair their dredge. It is probable that the articles were thrown into the Clutha River.

LAWRENCE.—The Blue Spur Gold-mining Company report stolen from their blacksmith's shop, between the 10th ultimo and 8th instant, about 200ft. of 4in. manilla rope, some months in use; value £4.

LUMSDEN.—Mrs. Allan reports stolen from a tool-chest in a room used as a library in the Public Hall, between the 10th ultimo and 2nd instant, an ordinary tin cash-box containing a cheque for £18, No. 18, A387186, drawn by James Blackie on the Colonial Bank, Dunedin, in favour of Church Committee, and dated Lumsden, 23rd September, 1892, and (supposed) sundry papers; the property of the estate of the late George Allan, J.P.

CULVERDEN (CANTERBURY).—Robert Henry Dailey, Amuri, reports stolen from the Culverden Railway-station, on the 19th ultimo, a black portmanteau, nearly new, brass catch for lock, straps on one side, containing a double-breasted grey-check coat and single-breasted vest of same material; a pair of brown-tweed knickerbockers, large-check pattern; a pair of sewn lace-up boots, two pairs of socks; three shirts, one white two coloured; some ties, two Bank of New Zealand pass-books, Rangiora and Timaru branches respectively; three plans of paddocks, letters, and other articles; value £11 12s.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—George McRae reports stolen from the Tokomaru Railway-station, between the 9th and 11th instant, a small hand sewing-machine, newly repaired, no further description; value £4. Identifiable.

BLenheim.—Miss Sidney Smith reports stolen, supposed from the schoolroom at the Maori Pa, on the 16th or 17th ultimo, a ladies' gold keyless half-hunting watch, makers Hancock and Co., Bruton Street, London, number unknown, no glass to outer case, ACA in monogram on back, and a small gold chain, link-pattern; value £38. Suspicion attached to Mrs. W. H. Dyer, alias Mrs. Beamsley, a servant, supposed English, about thirty-six years of age, 5ft. 2in. high, dark complexion and hair, medium build, small features, fond of drink. Went by coach to Nelson on the 19th ultimo, supposed *en route* to Longford, Upper Buller.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

FOXTON.—Alfred Ball is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Helen, since May last. Description: A native of Nelson, a labourer, thirty-six years of age, about 5ft. 2in. high, slight build, fair hair and complexion, clean-shaven except moustache, blind in left eye, AB tattooed on arm; when last seen was dressed in blue serge; attends Salvation Army meetings. He left Coley's flax-mills, Oroua River, during the above month, intending to seek employment at the Longburn Freezing-works, but has not been heard from since. Complainant and five children are being supported by the Charitable Aid Board.

WELLINGTON.—Henry Alexander Scott is charged on warrant with failing to provide his wife and infant with adequate means of support since the 7th ultimo. Description: Thirty-nine years of age, 5ft. 11in. high, slight build, dark-brown hair turning grey, dark moustache only; dressed in a light-grey-tweed suit and hard brown-felt hat. Supposed to have gone to Christchurch.

WELLINGTON.—Re Thomas Wickham for wife-desertion: This warrant has been cancelled.

WELLINGTON.—William Francis Moran is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Grace Moran, at Roxburgh Street, since the 9th July, 1892. Description: A native of New Zealand, a baker, thirty-four years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, fair complexion, brown hair, grey eyes. He is said to have left Wellington on the 8th July last by the s.s. "Hauroto" for Sydney, and is supposed to have gone to Melbourne. (92/1373.)

CHRISTCHURCH.—William Stevenson is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court, made on the 29th September last, to pay 2s. 6d. a week for the support of each of his six children. Description: English, a sailor, forty-eight years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, dark-brown hair turning grey, bald on top of head, clean-shaven except brown moustache, grey eyes; generally wears a serge suit and soft-felt hat.

REEFTON.—George Lemon is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Mary Ellen, about four years ago. Description: A native of London, a labourer, thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 2½in. high, slender build, dark complexion, black hair, small black moustache and goatee, mark under left eye caused by a kick from a horse when a boy, third finger of right hand off; may be employed at some factory. Last seen at his mother's, Aldridge Street, Christchurch, about November, 1889. (See also *Police Gazette*, 1890, page 38.) The above is an amended description of offender, and the original warrant being informal, a fresh one was issued on the 11th instant by the Resident Magistrate.

DUNEDIN.—John McGregor, for disobeying an order to support his wife: This offender, who for some time past has been staying with his father at Kelso, too ill for removal, left on the 7th instant, presumably for the Dunedin Hospital, but has not arrived there. He will probably endeavour to leave the colony.

MASTERTON.—Thomas Adian Lyons is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Mary, since the 9th October, 1890. Description: A native of New South Wales, about thirty-eight years of age, 6ft. 3in. high, square build, blue or grey eyes, dark hair turning grey, small dark whiskers and moustache only, long thin nose, chin turning upwards, big feet and turns his toes slightly inwards when walking, has a scar on forehead, which may be covered with his hair; has been employed on stations, but may now be a commercial traveller. He is said to have been seen at Sydney during February last, but subsequent inquiries there have failed to trace him. (92/578.)

Absconding from Industrial Schools.

JOHN AVERY absconded from the licensed service of John Daly, Tahapita, Upper Owake, Catlin's River, on the 16th ultimo. Description: Seventeen years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, sallow complexion, dark hair; dress not known. Committed at Dunedin on the 28th February, 1884. Was previously licensed to James Haggin, of North Taieri, from whom he absconded in January, 1891.

JAMES MADSON absconded from the licensed service of Mr. Stewart, farmer, Kurow, Oamaru District, on the 6th instant. He was previously with George Archibald, of the same place. Description: Fourteen years and seven months old, 5ft. 4in. high, stout build, brown hair and complexion; dressed in a dark suit. He went to Lyttelton by road, supposed *en route* for Wellington, where his mother is in service. Was committed at Dunedin, on the 7th March, 1889.

JOHN LAMBERT absconded from the licensed service of Cornelius Flynn, farmer, Mosgiel Junction, on the 7th instant. Age, fifteen years and ten months, 5ft. 4in. high, stout build, dark complexion; dressed in a brown-tweed suit and brown slouched hat. Committed at Dunedin, on the 22nd February, 1886.

These boys are to be arrested, and returned to the Caversham Industrial School, Dunedin.

Deserter from Her Majesty's Service.

From H.M.S. "Katoomba," at Auckland.

On 3rd January, 1893.

ALFRED DANIEL TREE, stoker, English, twenty-four years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, light-brown hair, blue eyes, ruddy complexion, scar on back of left ear and neck. A reward of £3 is offered for his arrest, in addition to £5 from the Colonial Government.

Deserters from Merchant Vessel.

DUNEDIN.—The following apprentices are charged on warrants with deserting the barque "Euterpe": *Robert Alexander McPherson* (5th ultimo), a native of Victoria, eighteen years of age, slight build, about 5ft. 9in. high, dark complexion, freckled face. *Edward John Perry* (5th ultimo), English, sixteen years of age, short, fair complexion and hair, round features. *Richard Dent Fallowfield* (31st ultimo), English, sixteen years of age, sallow complexion, Jewish nose, stoops when walking.

Horse- and Cattle-Stealing.

KAWAKAWA (BAY OF ISLANDS).—Thomas McKay is charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee, about the 21st ultimo, at Kerikeri, near Kaikohe, of a horse, saddle, and bridle; value £5; the property of Kahi (recovered). Offender is twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, slight build, dark complexion hair and moustache only; dressed in dark fancy-coating paget-suit and hard black-felt hat; believed to have been an assistant cook on one of the Union Company's steamers. He obtained the horse, &c., from complainant on hire, and sold the lot to Walter Swift, of Kawakawa, for £3 10s. Is supposed to have gone towards Whangarei, *en route* for Auckland.

MARU (BAY OF PLENTY).—Harry Roberts Burt, Matata, reports stolen at Galatea, about the 20th ultimo, a pure white working-bullock, seven or eight years old, supposed blind in one eye, weight about 10cwt., a quantity of gun-shot under the skin along the back up to shoulder; value £10. Suspicion attached to Te Whetu, a Maori, about twenty-four years of age, blind in one eye; supposed to be living at

Rongoteaheke, near Waitapu Valley, about twenty-two miles from Rotorua. He buys cattle and takes them to Waikato for sale, and is alleged to have sold the bullock to Mr. McNicoll, an auctioneer, in that district, for £6.

ROTORUA.—The Rev. Father Holierhoek reports stolen from a paddock at Te Poroporo, near Whakatane, about the 25th October last, a chestnut gelding, aged, about 15 hands high, branded W on one shoulder and SJS on the other, one hind foot white, a few white hairs on forehead, but scarcely noticeable; said to be well known at Tauranga and Opotiki; value £8.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—Samuel Baker, stud-master, reports stolen from a paddock at Terrace End, on the 26th or 27th ultimo, a bay mare, six years old, 15 hands high, one white foot, star on forehead, no visible brand; value £50.

TARADALE (NAPIER).—Patrick Dooney's mare, saddle, and bridle have been recovered from F. J. Taylor, roadman, Runanga, to whom they were sold on the 5th November last for £3, by a man who gave his name as Broadbent. The latter is supposed colonial, about thirty years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, stout build, fair fresh complexion, fair hair and moustache only; wore a light-coloured tweed-suit and hard-felt hat; had no swag, and went on foot towards Taupo. A warrant has been issued by the Napier Bench for his arrest.

DANEVIRKE.—Henry Muller, charged with stealing Edward Dean's mare, was arrested by Constable J. Ryan, Wellington Police, and remanded to Danevirke. Case dismissed.

CHRISTCHURCH.—George Humphreys, Papanui Road, St. Albans, reports stolen from a paddock, on the 31st ultimo or 1st instant, a bay cob mare, 14½ hands high, seven or eight years old, hog mane, short tail, long forelock, shod all round, no brands; value £15.

QUEENSTOWN.—William Kirk is charged on warrant with the larceny as a bailee, at Arthur's Point, about April, 1891, of a black gelding, light build, six years old, 14½ hands high, little or no hair along backbone, branded □ on near shoulder; value £12; the property of Thomas Begg, Upper Branches, Shotover. Offender is a native of the colony, a horsebreaker, about thirty-three years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, active build, swarthy complexion, right leg amputated and wears a cork one, but this is scarcely noticeable; fond of drink, and quarrelsome when intoxicated. The horse was intrusted to the accused to break in and work for twelve months; he, however, took it away with him, and in April, 1891, sold it for £9 to one Jess Flynn.
