## NEW ZEALAND POLICE GAZETTE.

**NOTICE.**—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette*, see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the member of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property, supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

All communications concerning this *Gazette* should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For *Gazette*." Members of the Force in charge of out-stations will forward them direct.

### Arson.

**PORT ALBERT (AUCKLAND).**—About 5 a.m. on the 7th ultimo, an unoccupied four-roomed cottage at Wayby, the property of Alfred Edward and George Woodcock, vine-growers, was discovered on fire, the circumstances showing that it was the work of an incendiary. The fire was, however, extinguished before it made much progress, the damage being trifling. The building was insured in the Royal Office for £100.

**HAMPDEN (AMARU).**—McDonald and McCaulay, farmers, Maheno, report that on the 12th ultimo a stack of straw and another of oats (in bags) were partly destroyed by fire, which there is reason to believe was wilfully caused. The loss is estimated at £40. No insurance.

**ALEXANDRA SOUTH.**—About 5 p.m. on the 11th March last, a building used as a store and boarding-house, the property of Samuel Simmonds, jun., was set on fire in different places; but the flames were extinguished before much damage was done, the estimated loss being about £10. At an inquest held on the 13th ultimo a verdict was returned to the effect that the fire was wilfully caused with intent to defraud the Royal Insurance Company, in whose office the stock, furniture, &c., were insured for £1,060, which is considered about £300 over the value. The building itself was uninsured, a policy thereon having recently lapsed.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

**WANGANUI.**—James Bailey, lately butcher and cattle-dealer, of Normanby, Taranaki, is charged on warrant, issued by the Wanganui Bench, with making preparation, about the 10th April, 1894, for quitting New Zealand and taking part of his property with him, which ought by law to be divided amongst his creditors—to wit, the sum of £1,135. Offender is a native of Taranaki, about forty years of age, about 5ft. 5in. high, slight build, dark complexion, small dark deep-set eyes, thin face, long thin nose, brown hair beard whiskers (cut short) and moustache, but may now be clean-shaved. The amount consisted of fifty-six £20 and three £5 notes, all on the Union Bank of Australia, Auckland or Napier issue, and was obtained by the offender at Napier on the 9th ultimo for sale of cattle. He will no doubt endeavour to leave the colony, if he has not already done so. A reward of £50 is offered by Messrs. Freeman R. Jackson and Co., of Wanganui, for his arrest. (94/569.)

**LYTELTON.**—£50 REWARD.—The Canterbury Stevedoring Association report that during the night of the 11th ultimo their lighter, "Queen," was maliciously scuttled, and damaged to the extent of £30. The above reward is guaranteed on conviction of the offender or offenders.

**TIMARU.**—George Edwin Best is charged on warrant with having, on the 18th April, 1894, obtained from Charles Nicholas Macintosh, manager of the Colonial Bank of New Zealand, the sum of £30 by false pretences. Offender is a native of the colony, a grain merchant and sampler, about thirty years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, active appearance, fair complexion, light-brown hair whiskers and moustache, rather prominent nose; will probably be wearing a dark coat and vest, light-tweed trousers, hard brown-felt hat, white shirt with turned-down collar, and tan boots; fond of displaying jewellery; a heavy smoker. He obtained the amount by falsely stating it was due to him by Bell Brothers, of Auckland. Is supposed to have gone north.

**AUCKLAND.**—George Ellis, charged on warrant with false pretences on Joseph Gardner Pannell, has been arrested by Constable W. Bern, Thames Police, and remanded to Auckland. Charge withdrawn.

**NAPIER.**—William Henry McKenzie, for using obscene language and creating a breach of the peace, has been arrested by the Wanganui police, and remanded to Napier.

WELLINGTON.—Richard Tubman, for default of fine and costs: The warrant in this case has been executed by Constable W. P. Patton.

WELLINGTON.—Agnès Ramsay is charged with failing to pay £5 10s., fine and costs for keeping a brothel. Description: Scotch, a prostitute, thirty-nine years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, rather stout build, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, blue eyes. Supposed to have gone south. Warrant of distress issued.

WAITATI.—Alexander Gilchrist, on the 7th and 16th March last, indecently exposed his person to Selina Jones and two other school-children on the railway-line at Waitati. Description: A native of Dunedin, a rabbitier, eighteen years of age, about 5ft. high, medium build, dark-brown hair, fair complexion, no hair on face, small features; dressed, when last seen, in an old dark-tweed sac-coat, moleskin trousers, soft tweed hat, and lace-up boots. Supposed to have gone towards Dunedin. Prosecution declined.

DUNEDIN.—Thomas Keating is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol, in default of paying a fine of 5s. for being drunk on the 22nd March last. Description: Irish, a labourer, thirty-eight years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, sandy hair beard and moustache. He is said to have gone up-country.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, &c.

AUCKLAND.—Thomas Robert Jamerson, Morningside, Kingsland, reports that on the 15th ultimo his dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: A ladies' gold ring, set with three rubies and two diamonds in the centre; a plain oval-shaped silver brooch; a silver brooch, with small lumps and silver band round edge; a small plain gold locket with hair in the back; a black Japanese toy chest of three drawers, about 13in. by 9in.; two plain silver bangles; a large white silk handkerchief; £1 5s. in silver and coppers; a morocco purse; and two full-sized white blankets, nearly new, five red stripes across the ends of each, one of them marked "J. D. Hill" on a piece of tape: total value, £13 9s. 6d.

AUCKLAND.—John Chappel (boy) is charged on warrant with having, between the 1st and 19th March last, stolen from the shop of William Williams, draper, Karangahape Road, a pair of trousers and vest, value £1; since recovered. Offender is a native of Auckland, fourteen years of age, 4ft. 10in. high, full round face, very much freckled, fair hair; dressed in light-tweed trousers patched on seat, dark-tweed coat, and black-felt hat, dirty appearance. Supposed to have gone to the Waikato district.

AUCKLAND.—George Mason, express-driver, Mount Roskill, reports that on the 22nd ultimo his dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: A round metal clock, Waterbury watch, jet guard, two silver thimbles, two gold locket, blue-enamelled; two silver pins, "CE" on heads; four silver brooches, each having two silver bars connected by a ring, one of them marked "Lizzie"; four other brooches—viz., large jet, twist pattern; gold mourning, oval-shaped; ivory ditto; and one set with a yellow stone: a gold ring set with a blue stone and five pearls; a silver buckle-ring; pair of jet bracelets; black photograph-case; silver ear-ring; a cedar box, with view on lid; a silver arrow, with Scotch pebble in centre; a silk purse; microscope; and a metal teapot, with a thistle on lid: value £8 17s.

AUCKLAND.—George Dale Ellis is charged on warrant with having, on or about the 21st ultimo, broken into the dwelling of Ernest J. French, Flagstaff Road, Devonport, and stolen therefrom a silk dress, silk shawl, dress-suit, and several articles of jewellery. Since recovered. Offender is a native of Auckland, a sailor, twenty-one years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, brown eyes, pug nose, an upper front tooth out, woman over J.P. tattooed on left arm; dressed in a grey-tweed suit, and soft brown-tweed cap. One of the rings has been traced to the possession of a lad named Charles Bolger, now in custody on remand.

WANGANUI.—Robert William Poles is charged on warrant with having, on the 10th ultimo, stolen from a dwelling at Aramohe a silver Waltham hunting-watch, slight dent on back of case, number unknown, twisted silver chain attached; value, £7; the property of Charles Curties. Offender is English, about twenty-four years of age, 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high, very slight build, weighs 8 stone, dark complexion, usually flushed from drink, dark hair, clean-shaved, both feet partially deformed, being very short in front, which affects his walk; dressed in a blue-serge suit, and light-coloured skull-cap, displays a good deal of shirt-front and collar; frequents hotel-bars. ### Missing Friends.

THOMAS GRAY failed to appear as a witness at the Supreme Court, Gisborne, on the 26th February, 1894, and his recognisance was therefore estreated. He left the schooner "Whangaroa" at Lyttelton during the first week in the above-mentioned month, and went up-country to look for work. Description: About twenty years of age, 5ft. 3in. or 4in. high, medium build, sandy hair, and small, sandy moustache. Has been a sailor, but is a carpenter by trade.
