**NOTICE.**—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette*, see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the member of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property, supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

All communications concerning this *Gazette* should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For *Gazette*." Members of the Force in charge of out-stations will forward them direct.

### Murder.

**SOUTH AUSTRALIA.**—A man, supposed name Brown, is charged on warrant with the murder of George Marisky, at Wankaringa, about the 20th April, 1894. Description: Irish, has been a soldier in South Africa, also a ship's steward, about thirty-two years of age, looks younger, 5ft. 10in. high, light complexion, light moustache only, long features, long neck, several front teeth projecting, pointed chin; was wearing a brownish coat, greyish trousers, and old soft-felt hat; looked like a prospector. Has letters of recommendation purporting to be from the Princess May, the Duke of Teck, and one from Sir Evelyn Wood during the war in South Africa, also has a testimonial to secure him a position as ship's steward; these letters are all much worn, and patched with postage-stamp edging. He came from Broken Hill to Wankaringa, and was last seen at Dawson, where he disposed of one of Marisky's horses, and was seen riding the other way. This was about the 3rd instant.

**COLCHESTER (ENGLAND).**—£50 REWARD.—Arthur Blatch (may assume the name of "Jackson") is charged on warrant with the murder of Alfred Welch, at Colchester, on the 8th December, 1893. Description: About thirty-six years of age, 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high, pale complexion, small dark eyes, dark-brown moustache (may now be shaven), thin face, hollow cheeks, thin build, cartilage of throat, or "Adam's apple" very prominent, is a great smoker, and teeth are discoloured, has suffered from an injury to the spine, and frequently stoops a little when walking, left foot was sprained some years ago, and it occasionally causes slight lameness; is fond of bagatelle and fishing; when seen on the following

day was wearing a new black covert coat with velvet collar, black-and-white-mixture suit, new lace boots, and black hard hat, "Gardiner, Whitechapel," inside. Has recently been ill, and may affect illness again. He was for several years in the employ of Mr. Welch as a porter, but for the last two years has worked as a potman, and travelled the country, taking cheap photographs with a self-acting camera. He does not, however, understand photography. The above reward will be paid to any person who shall be the first to give such information as shall lead to his arrest. ### Escaped Prisoner.

**SAMUEL TRUDGEON** escaped from the lock-up at Greytown North on the morning of the 25th instant. Description: A native of the colony, a labourer, twenty years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, fair complexion, long brown curly hair, blue eyes, small nose, small moustache, shows his teeth when talking, pleasing appearance, burn on right arm, several moles on back. Photograph, taken on the 25th May, 1893, at head stations. (See *Police Gazette*, 1894, page 57.) Offender, who was waiting trial for larceny, took the troop-horse with him, and it has since been recovered at the Lower Hutt. He was seen on the wharf, at Wellington, during the afternoon of the same day, and was then dressed in a light-drab suit, and hard felt hat.

### Offences Not Otherwise Described.

**FOXTON.**—Alexander Forsyth Anderson is charged on warrant with having, on the 1st instant, forged the signature of William Scott Bower to an English post-office order for £5. Description: Scotch, forty-five to fifty years of age, about 5ft. 5in. high, medium build, florid complexion, black hair turning grey, partly bald, full black beard tinged with grey, weak eyes, thick lips; dressed in a long black paget coat, brown-tweed trousers and vest, and hard black-felt hat, flat on top. Identical with man of same name, *vide Police Gazette*, 1884, page 172. Supposed to have gone towards Wellington. Arrest important; other charges pending.

**WELLINGTON.**—Charles Jackson is charged on warrant with having, on or about the 21st April, 1894, forged the signature of James Rutherford to a cheque for £29 14s. on the Colonial Bank of New Zealand, Palmerston North. Description: Supposed colonial, twenty-five or twenty-six years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, slim build, reddish hair, small sandy moustache only, freckled face; when standing talking has the habit of striking one heel against the other; follows race meetings; may be wearing a black sac-coat with striped lining to sleeves, vest of same material and lining, and hard

black hat. Parents said to reside in Canterbury. He uttered the cheque to James Smith, draper, Te Aro House, in payment of goods purchased to the amount of £6.

WELLINGTON.—James Edmonds, *alias* Casey, is charged on warrant with having, on the 7th ultimo, in company with William Flowers (now in custody), forged and uttered to Hamilton Gilmer, Empire Hotel, a cheque for £4 3s. Offender is a native of Auckland, a labourer, twenty-two years of age, 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high, medium build, brown hair, small moustache only; dressed in a dark coat, light-tweed trousers and vest, and hard black-felt hat. Supposed to have gone to Napier. The cheque was drawn on the Union Bank of Australia, Wanganui, and purported to be signed by J. Brennan, hotelkeeper, of that town, but has been declared a forgery.

BLenheim.—Edward Morley is charged on warrant with having, on the 1st instant, wilfully exposed his person to Rhoda Caroline Grace and others. Offender is English, a station-carpenter, about fifty years of age, 5ft. 8in. or 4in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, hair and beard turning grey; rode a dark pony, with swag in front and behind saddle; saddle-cloth made of sacking or sugar-bags. May have gone to Renwicktown or Wairau Valley.

OAMARU.—S. H. Saunders, charged with false pretences on Benjamin Perry, has been arrested by the Dunedin detective police. Remanded to Oamaru, and committed for trial.

KAITANGATA.—George Carson (may assume the name of John Miller) is charged on warrant of commitment to forty-eight hours imprisonment in Dunedin Gaol, in default of paying £1 7s. fine and costs for drunkenness. Description: Scotch, a labourer, twenty-five years of age, about 4ft. 10in. high, stout build, dark hair, none on face except very slight down on upper lip, no roof to mouth, speaks through his nose, has a peculiar walk; dressed in a dark-tweed suit, and soft black-felt hat; slovenly dirty appearance; fond of drink. May have gone to Southland, where he was previously employed rabbiting.

WAIKATA.—Walter McIver reports that on the 6th instant a draught mare, value £20, was maliciously wounded, and from the effects of which it died.

WHANGAROA.—Peter Jackson is charged on warrant of commitment to Auckland Gaol for one month's labour in default of paying £2 17s., fine and costs, for assaulting William Maxwell, at Kaeo, on the 1st instant. Description: Irish, a gumdigger, about fifty years of age, 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high, stout build, slightly stooped, fair complexion, face appears to be pock-marked, lowering eyebrows, short dark-brown hair beard whiskers and moustache, mixed with grey, bald on top of head, low-looking; dressed in an old tweed coat, flannel with pink wool at neck, Tairaroa trousers, blucher boots, old black-felt hat, no socks; carried a gumdigger's swag, in which he may have a new suit of clothes. Supposed to be accompanied by a man known as "Sandy," who was recently on an American whale-ship, about forty years of age, about 5ft. 9in. high, fresh ruddy complexion, very little hair on face, slightly round-shouldered. They have a black-and-tan slut with them.

RAGLAN.—The Raglan County Council report that between the 7th and 14th instant the beacon at the heads was maliciously chopped down, and damaged to the extent of £5.

SYDNEY.—Walter Osmond Haywood is charged on two warrants with breaches of insolvency laws at Young, about the 18th April, 1894. Description: Thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 9in. or 10in. high, stout build, dark hair, heavy dark moustache; dresses well; is a good ventriloquist. A letter has been received from him, bearing postmark Hawera, 11th instant. He will no doubt endeavour to leave this colony. Arrest important. (94/716.)

MELBOURNE.—James E. Stone is charged on warrant with having, on the 2nd March, 1894, obtained from Ernest C. Robertson, merchant, 56, Spencer Street, 186 bags of potatoes, value £33 0s. 2d., by false pretences. Description: Supposed English, a produce merchant, about forty years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, medium build, very erect, darkish complexion, light-brown hair, darker beard moustache and whiskers, or may be clean-shaved, short upper lip, splendid teeth; when talking always has his hands in his pockets, and, if in any way excited, has a habit of balancing himself on his toes. Offender represented that he had £2,000 in the

Commercial Bank, Melbourne, and, on the strength of it, obtained from complainant the above and other goods to the total value of £206 7s. on the date mentioned and since. Other firms have been largely victimised.

### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, &c.

AUCKLAND.—Thomas Dawes, grocer, Napier Street, Freeman's Bay, reports that on the 18th or 19th instant his store was broken into, and the following stolen: 20lb. of Derby tobacco, 6lb. of tea, one dozen wooden pipes, and 3lb. of cocoa; value, £7.

AUCKLAND.—Hubert P. Burry, druggist, Albert Street, reports stolen from his office, on the 17th instant, a black-japanned cash-box, nearly new, brass mounting, containing two £1 notes, a sovereign, and 2s. or 3s. in silver.

Description: Irish, a cab-driver or labourer, about twenty-three years of age, about 5ft. 11in. high, fair complexion, small fair moustache only, belly drawn in, stoops slightly, tender feet; usually wears a brown-tweed sac-suit, tweed hat, and elastic-side boots. Has a brother, Michael, a blacksmith, at Manaia.

**WELLINGTON**.—Charles Longhurst is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court for the support of his three children. Description: English, a brickmaker and miner, forty-five years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, brown hair, hazel eyes, full dark beard turning grey, turns his toes out when walking, closes his eyes when speaking. **WAIMATE (CANTERBURY)**.—William Beasley is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife and three children since about the 19th April, 1894. Description: A native of Christchurch, N.Z., English parentage, twenty-four years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, dark hair, usually wears a fringe, small brown moustache only, pug nose, dark eyes, a labourer or carter; generally wears dark clothes and hard black-felt hat, worn on one side. He is said to have left Dunedin about the middle of last month in the s.s. "Tekapo" for Sydney, as a coal-trimmer, and may return in the same vessel. Is well known in Dunedin. Complainant, Jane Harris Beasley, Harris Street, Waimate.

### Horse- and Cattle-Stealing.
