Arson.

GISBORNE.—At 6.30 a.m. on the 16th ultimo an attempt was made to destroy the building known as Porter's Hall, it having been set on fire in two separate places under the flooring. The flames were, however, extinguished before much damage was done. The premises are owned by Mr. J. N. Williams, of Napier, and were occupied by Messrs. Williams and Kettle, of Gisborne.

Escaped Prisoner.

ASHBURTON.—Robert Carlyle is charged on warrant with escaping from the Ashburton Police Gaol on the 20th ultimo. Description: Scotch, thirty-nine years of age, 5ft. 3in. high, stoutish build, large head, fresh complexion, small grey eyes half closed, stammers, brown hair, curly reddish beard whiskers and moustache, silly appearance, especially noticeable when smiling; dressed in an old black coat and vest much too large for him, faded drab-tweed trousers, and soft black-felt hat. Photographed at Lyttelton Gaol, 21st August, 1890. (See "Prisoners discharged," in this *Gazette*.) He was under remand on a charge of house-breaking and theft. Is said to have been seen at Hinds on the day he escaped.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

BOMBAY.—Stolen, about the 18th December last, at Bombay, three English currency notes—viz., L/19, 96227, dated London, 7th February, 1894, for £100; J/41, 13840, dated London, 5th March, 1894, for £20; I/4, 04974, dated London, 2nd March, 1894, for £10—the property of Mahomed Abdul Kabir, barrister-at-law. Suspicion is attached to a person named Mulla Mirza Khan, who is supposed to have sent them to the Australian Colonies for encashment. It is requested that the banks in New Zealand may be advised, and if the missing notes are traced information should be sent to the Commissioner's Office, Wellington. (95/456.)

AUCKLAND.—Frederick Stewart Bates is charged on warrant with having, on the 19th ultimo, abducted Jane Fletcher, an unmarried girl under the age of fifteen years, who was then under the lawful charge of her father and mother, with intent to carnally know her. Offender is a native of New Zealand, about twenty-four years of age, about 5ft. 4in. high, fair complexion, clean-shaved except fair moustache curled at ends, grey eyes, high forehead, medium build; dressed in a navy-blue coat and vest, grey trousers, and hard black-felt hat. The girl is fifteen years of age, about 5ft. high, stout build, fair hair and complexion, grey eyes, dark eyebrows; wore a white muslin dress, and white straw hat trimmed with pale and blue ribbon. They are supposed to have left for Sydney by the s.s. "Tasmania," *via* the South.

WELLINGTON.—Ernest Frederick Hawke is charged on warrant, issued by the Supreme Court, with fraudulent bankruptcy, on the 8th ultimo. Description: English or colonial, about thirty years of age, 6ft. high, slight build, fresh complexion, fair hair, clean shaved except small fair moustache, sharp features, lips slightly, squeaky voice, front teeth filled with gold and noticeable, smart appearance; was agent for the Phoenix Confectionery Company, of Dunedin, at Wellington. He is charged with being about to go abroad with a view of defeating, delaying, and embarrassing proceedings to be taken under the Bankruptcy Act. The warrant is addressed to all constables in the colony, and to the keeper of the Terrace Gaol, Wellington.

WELLINGTON.—Walter Ugden is charged on warrant with having, on the 25th ultimo, forged the signature of C. F. Lys to a telegraphic money-order for £5, thereby obtaining that sum from the Postal Department. Offender is supposed English, forty-five years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, stout build, florid complexion, dark-brown hair turning grey, clean shaved except moustache; well educated, good address; dressed in a black-worsted sac-suit and hard black hat; said he had been an army officer; was employed as boots at Ryan's Hotel, Napier, about two months ago; spoke of going to Gisborne.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Charles Sisson is charged on warrant with having used obscene language on the 20th ultimo. Description: A native of New Zealand (German parentage), seventeen or eighteen years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, stoutish build, fair hair and complexion, full face; fond of drink. He is supposed to have gone to Wanganui or Gisborne.

ASHBURTON.—William Beane (may have assumed the name of Browne) is charged on warrant with having, during the months of January, February, and March, 1895, committed a breach of "The Chattels Transfer Act, 1889." Offender is a native of Australia, twenty-five years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair whiskers and moustache, blue eyes; dresses well, as a station-holder, and pretends to be wealthy; usually wears gaiters, covert-coat, and tweed cap; has friends at Springfield, Malvern. He obtained 283 sheep from David Thomas, merchant, of Ashburton, on terms, and gave security over them, but disposed of them during the currency of the security and cleared out. He was seen at Christchurch on the 20th ultimo, and will probably endeavour to leave the colony.

DUNEDIN.—A man, name unknown, is charged with having, on the 21st ultimo, forged and uttered to Simon Brothers, Princes Street, an order for two pairs of boots, value £1 6s. each, and which he obtained thereon. Offender is supposed English, had the appearance of an hotel-waiter, twenty-five to thirty years of age, medium build, fair hair and complexion, fair moustache only; wore a light-grey tweed sac-suit. Identification doubtful. The order purported to be signed by J. P. Piercy, licensee of the Grand Hotel, and the boots obtained were hand-sewn lace-ups, size 7 or 9. No warrant.

Suspect states he came from Gore, Southland, and is well known to Constable Fretwell, in charge of that station, also to most of the Dunedin police. It is thought he may be identical with the man named Crozier, suspected of stealing from Thomas Kerneen's whare at Rakaia, between the 22nd and 25th January last. HAMILTON (WAIKATO).—James Neilson (also known as "Jock"), is charged on warrant with having, at Tawhare, about February, 1894, stolen a gelding (recovered), value £12, the property of Charles Newton Le Quesne.
