Escaped Prisoner.

WELLINGTON.—Joseph Mason Foggon escaped from the hard-labour gang at Mount Cook Prison during the afternoon of the 9th instant. Description: A native of Tasmania, a bricklayer, twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. 8½in. high, strong build, sallow complexion, fair hair, blue eyes, whiskers beard and moustache clipped short, large mouth, heavy lower jaw, moles on bridge of nose right shoulder and bend of left arm, large scar on right shin, smart appearance; dressed in a plain suit, trousers too small. He was undergoing a sentence of seven years for housebreaking.

Arson.

GREYMOUTH.—At 7.40 p.m. on the 14th ultimo the dwelling of Norah Kelleher was wilfully set on fire, pieces of old blanket and scrim, saturated with kerosene, having been placed between the weatherboards and lining and ignited. The flames were however extinguished before much damage was done.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

OTAKI.—Alexander Gillies is charged on warrant with false pretences on George O'Loughlin, hotelkeeper, on the 19th ultimo. Offender is of Scotch parentage, a station-hand, forty-five to fifty years of age, about 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, fresh complexion; brownish hair, beard, whiskers and moustache, turning grey, blue eyes; dressed in a dark-tweed sac-suit, and hard black-felt hat with wide rim. Has a brother, named Bob, in the Wairarapa district, and another, Hugh, at Palmerston North. Is probably identical with Alexander Gillies, *vide Police Gazette*, 1894, pages 82 and 186. He obtained refreshments and cash to the extent of £2, for which he gave his cheque on the Bank of New Zealand, Woodville, but it appears that he has no account there.

MARTINBOROUGH.—*Re* John Lunny, George Sanders, H. Hunter, and Michael Ryan, charged with fraud on David Hope Johnston: Lunny has been arrested by Detective R. Neill, Wellington police, and remanded to Featherston, where the information was dismissed. The warrant for the arrest of the other three men has been cancelled.

BLenheim.—Alfred Carroll, charged with the theft of a cheque for £3 15s., the property of Thomas Waddy, has been arrested by Constable W. Williams, Havelock police, and remanded to Blenheim. Case dismissed.

WELLINGTON.—George Ellis, charged with false pretences on James H. Jackson, Petone, has been arrested by Constable A. Berriman, Taupo police. Offender is identical with George Dale Ellis, *vide Police Gazette*, 1895, pages 67, 70, and 132, and has been committed for trial at Napier on four charges of uttering forged cheques.

HAWERA.—Robert Marr, fraudulent bankrupt, has been arrested by Sergeant Stagpoole, Hawera police, and remanded.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Richard Pape is charged on warrant with false pretences on Walter Stuart Parker, farmer, at Prebbleton, on the 9th October, 1894. Description: German, a farmer, thirty-five years of age, 5ft. 11in. high, slight build, fair complexion, light-brown hair, pale-blue eyes, reddish whiskers beard and moustache worn long, stammers when speaking. Offender sold complainant a wagon for £15, stating it was free from incumbrance, there being a bill of sale on the same. This is a private prosecution.

GERALDINE.—A Mitchell, charged with having forged and uttered a cheque to John Morrison, has been arrested by Constable M. Roche, Amberley police, and remanded to Geraldine.

OAMARU.—H. Webb (name probably fictitious) is charged on warrant with having, on the 7th instant, forged and uttered to Winter Henry Webber, New Zealand Clothing Factory, a cheque for £4 12s. Offender is supposed English, thirty to thirty-five years of age, about 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, clean shaved except fairish moustache, good address, plays the piano and sings, talks about the army; was wearing a new grey-tweed sac-suit, brown-tweed cap, or drab soft-felt hat; may have a new dark-brown waterproof coat. The cheque is drawn on the Union Bank of Australia, Waimate, and purports to be signed by John Fleming Douglas, of Waihae Downs Station, but has been declared a forgery. Other similar charges are pending.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, &c.

AUCKLAND.—David Stirling is charged on warrant with having, on the 4th instant, stolen from George Nicol, shearer, four £1 notes. Offender is English, a labourer, about twenty-five years of age, 5ft. 7½in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes, fair moustache only; wore dark clothes and hard black hat.

MANAIA.—Leslie Young, stableman, reports stolen from a bedroom in the Manaia Hotel, on the 20th or 21st ultimo, a black stamped-leather purse, six compartments, containing a receipt for a saddle from A. Young to E. Young, and £1 2s. 6d. in cash. Suspicion attached to a young man, name unknown, who occupied the same room. Description: About twenty-one years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, ruddy complexion, sharp features, pointed nose, fair hair, small fair moustache only; dressed in a dark-tweed sac-coat with breast pocket, dark-grey trousers and vest, soft grey-felt hat, light-coloured flannelette shirt, and watertight boots; talks guardedly; said he had been in Napier and Gisborne.

MANAIA.—Robert Ephraim Briggs reports that on the 20th ultimo his dwelling was broken into and the following stolen: A tweed coat, pepper-and-salt pattern, size 5, lined with black silesia, two pockets on each hip, breast pockets inside and out, black smooth buttons, value £1 6s. 6d., the property of George Williams; also £1 5s. 6d. in cash, belonging to Mr. Briggs. Suspicion attached to a lad, name unknown, eighteen to twenty years of age, apparently a sailor, about 5ft. 6in. high, stoutish build, very small fair moustache, fair hair, right foot lame, rolling gait; dressed in a light coat and vest and darker trousers, two holes cut in toes of boots, light-felt hat.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—Thomas Lloyd, carter, reports stolen from him on the 22nd ultimo a silver lever Rotherham hunting-watch, No. 22053, T.L. on outside of case, much worn, plain silver chain with steel spring attached. Value £6 10s.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Charles Henry Smith, grocer, Victoria and Peterborough Streets, reports that on the 29th or 30th ultimo his dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: 100 ½lb. packets of tea, Victoria T Company's assorted brands; a box of electric candles, branded N.C.; and a quantity of flour, sugar, cocoa, pills, &c.: value, £8 14s.

Since recovered. Offender is English, twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. 7½in. high, medium build, pale complexion, dark-brown hair, grey eyes, small dark moustache only.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

NAPIER.—Joseph Williams is charged on warrant with deserting his wife since the 26th ultimo. Description: Colonial, a butcher or shearer, twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, red hair, moustache only; dressed in light-check trousers and vest, black sac-coat, and hard black-felt hat. He left on the above date by s.s. "Tasmania" for Auckland, supposed en route to Sydney. Complainant, Violet Williams, Wellesley Road, Napier.

Description: Born in India (English parentage), a cook, fifty years of age, looks younger, 5ft. 9in. or 10in high, stiff build, fair hair and complexion, blue eyes, fair moustache only, worn long at ends, mark of a bruise on left cheekbone, good address; his father was an army doctor. He was cooking in a restaurant at Randwick, New South Wales, some few months ago, and it is thought will return to this colony as cook on one of the boats.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Alexander Mollison is charged on warrant of commitment to Lyttelton Gaol, for one month's imprisonment, for disobeying an order of Court to pay 5s. a week towards the support of his wife. Description: English, a labourer, fifty-four years of age, 5ft. 11in. high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, hazel eyes, grey beard, whiskers, and moustache. He left Christchurch about three months ago, supposed for Taranaki or Woodville.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Patrick Connor is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court to pay 15s. a week towards the support of his wife. Description: A native of County Kerry, Ireland, broad accent, a ploughman, forty-two years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, dark complexion, dark-blue eyes, dark-brown moustache, partly bald. (See *Police Gazette*, 1893, page 45.) He was £59 in arrears on the 23rd February last.

CHRISTCHURCH.—William Smith is charged on warrant of commitment to Lyttelton Gaol for three months, for disobeying an order of the Court for the support of his children. Description: English, labourer, forty years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, stout build, dark complexion, full dark beard, whiskers, and moustache, dark brown hair.

Description: A native of Geraldine, New Zealand, a groom, twenty-one years of age, 5ft. 11in. or 6ft. high, medium build, active appearance, brown hair, no hair on face, fresh complexion, rather large nose, rather good looking; usually wears a dark-tweed sac-suit, black felt hat, and dark-tweed overcoat. Supposed to have gone to the North Island.

DUNEDIN.—John Swan, junior, is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court to pay 8s. a week towards the maintenance of his illegitimate child by Amelia Dunlop. Description: About twenty-eight years of age (looks younger), 6ft. 1in. or 2in. high, strongly built, pale complexion, thin features, small fair moustache only, blue eyes; dressed in a navy-blue suit and hard black-felt hat, mourning-badge on latter and arm. Said to be in Canterbury, en route to the North or Sydney. His father is a coal merchant in Dunedin.

DUNEDIN.—Hugh Wilson is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for fourteen days' labour for disobeying an order of Court to pay 15s. a fortnight towards the maintenance of Bella Wilson. Description: Scotch, a miner, fifty years of age, about 5ft. 10in. high, strong grey beard and moustache, cheeks shaved; dressed in a light-tweed coat and soft-felt hat. May be accompanied by his son, twenty-eight years of age, and will probably endeavour to leave the colony.

SYDNEY.—Samuel Mantel Burrows is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife, Annie, since October last. Description: A native of Sydney, a clerk, forty-one years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, thin build, fair hair turning grey, heavy fair moustache and small side levers, chin shaved, grey eyes, joint of one toe broken, and bears heavily on that foot; usually dressed in a blue- serge sac-suit, and hard black-felt hat; smart gentlemanly appearance. Prescribing Minimum Size or Weight at which Fish may be taken.

GLASGOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this seven-teenth day of April, 1895.

Present

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated on the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, His Excellency the then Governor, pursuant to power in that behalf conferred by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," made certain regulations there-under, and amongst them a regulation, numbered ten, providing, *inter alia*, that no person should take, buy, sell, expose for sale, or have in possession any fish of the species enumerated in the Schedule thereto of a less weight or size than that set opposite the name of such fish: And whereas the aforesaid Act is repealed, but the said regulations are continued in force by virtue of the repealing Act, to wit, "The Sea Fisheries Act, 1894" (hereinafter called "the said Act"): And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing, *inter alia*, the minimum size or weight of any fish that may be taken: And whereas the aforesaid regulation, numbered ten, has been found to work hardship in certain cases:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other the powers and authorities him enabling in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the aforesaid regulation numbered ten, and also the aforesaid Schedule, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

Any person who takes, buys, sells, exposes for sale, or has in possession any fish of any of the species enumerated in the Schedule hereto of a less weight or size than that set opposite the name of such fish in the said Schedule, is liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds:

Provided that for the purposes of this regulation, and during a period of three months from the date hereof (but no longer), a person shall not be deemed to take or have in possession any fish if, having unintentionally caught the

same in a net or seine of lawful mesh whilst lawfully fishing therewith, he returns all such fish to the water when sorting out the haul.
